My dear parishioners,

Today we gather on the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time to commemorate the Lord's Day with the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Today we conclude our month-long reading of the 6th chapter of the Gospel of Saint John known as the "Bread of Life Discourse." For these past 4 weeks we have listened to the instruction Our Lord had given to His disciples regarding the Eucharist and His coming as the "Bread of Life." After the "murmuring" and the rejection of His words some part from the Lord's company. They cannot and will not accept the truth that He is the One sent by God to give life to the world. So they return to their former way of life with their spiritual hunger prevailing.

The affirmation of the Eucharistic theology announced by Jesus is publicly made by the Apostle Peter who speaks on behalf of the Twelve, "You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." The Undivided Church (East and West) has held to this belief. Unfortunately this belief was challenged during the Reformation and is still a source of division among Christians today. However for the Catholic and Orthodox Churches (Oriental as well) the faith of the Lord Jesus' real presence in the Eucharist has been upheld from the beginning. As we look at the Scripture texts for this Sunday the word FIDELITY emerges. In the Old Testament reading Joshua inquires of the Israelites, whom he is leading into the Promised Land, if they will be faithful to the Lord who has guided them and nourished them in their journey. They respond, "...we will serve the Lord, for He is our God." In the epistle reading the Apostle Paul writes to the Ephesians about the fidelity which should define marriage and which calls spouses to embrace sacrificial love. This attitude is the one of Christ who loves His spouse the Church.

Fidelity to Christ's words means that we are in His company. We do not challenge the Lord for that would put us with those in today's Gospel who "...no longer accompanied Him." Our desire to remain with our Blessed Lord is shown in our fidelity to receiving the Holy Eucharist. Participation in the Sunday celebration of the Holy Mass is a sign of our belief in the Lord's words, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

ST. ROSE OF LIMA, Virgin August 23 — Patroness of South America

ISABEL DE FLORES Y DEL OLIVA, called Rose by her mother because of her red cheeks and confirmed with that name by St. Turibius de Mogrovejo, was the first person in the Americas to be canonized as a Saint. Born at Lima, Peru, in 1586, she worked long and hard to help support her family, growing flowers and doing embroidery and other needlework.

Having taken a vow of virginity early in life, she consistently refused to marry and at twenty years of age became a Dominican Tertiary, and lived in a summerhouse in the garden of her home. Here she practiced extreme penance and mortification, modeling her life after that of St. Catherine of Siena.

St. Rose bore her many and great adversities with heroic patience and consoled the sick and suffering among the poor, Indians, and slaves. Consequently, she is regarded as the originator of social service in Peru. She died in 1617 at thirty-one years of age and was canonized in 1671 by Pope Clement X.

PRAYER God, You filled St. Rose with love for You and enabled her to leave the world and be free for You through the austerity of penance. Through her intercession, help us to follow her footsteps on earth and enjoy the torrent of Your delights in heaven. Amen.
