My dear parishioners,

In today's Eucharistic Assembly we observe the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the Gospel passage we accompany Jesus and His Apostles to the very north of Israel, Caesarea Philippi, where the Lord says: "Whoever wishes to come after Me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow Me." His words baffle the Apostles as they continue in their thinking that Jesus will usher in His Kingdom with power and not with suffering. Jesus informs them of the fate that awaits Him in Jerusalem and even Peter, the future head of the Church, does not understand yet in time he will follow Jesus to experience the sufferings of the Cross.

The Old Testament pericope from the Prophet Isaiah tells of the One sent by God who will be rejected and suffer greatly. This One will bear the afflictions knowing that the Lord stands with Him and will deliver Him. Of course we know that this One is the Christ, sent to die for our sins to redeem us by the Passion of the Cross.

In the epistle reading for this Sunday the Apostle James reminds the Early Church that works must accompany faith, deeds are just as important as words. The best example of this is the Lord Jesus who told us of His love and then demonstrated it by mounting the Cross for our salvation.

Yes, deeds must accompany words for faith to be genuine. This is the message which the Scripture texts present to us for our contemplation. For many of us suffering for the faith is an unfamiliar experience. However for our brothers and sisters who live in various parts of the world they know very well the Cross they must carry every day. Persecution is a reality for Christians living in Nigeria, Nicaragua, the Middle East, China, Cuba and so many other places in the world. Going to Holy Mass on Sunday can get them arrested, removed from their home, losing their job, denying them entrance into college and so much more. They are being persecuted by Communist governments, Islamic terrorists, dictators and other evil forces. And even though they experience such persecution-they put us to SHAME! These brothers and sisters profess in their words and in their actions that they are Christians, followers of Jesus Christ. Yes, these are genuine followers of Christ for their hope is found in the words of our Blessed Lord, "For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the Gospel will save it."

How much do you suffer for following Jesus?

ST. JOSEPH OF CUPERTINO, Priest September 18-Patron of Aviators

ST. JOSEPH was born at Cupertino, in the diocese of Nardo in the Kingdom of Naples, in 1603. After spending his childhood and adolescence in simplicity and innocence, he finally joined the Franciscan Friars Minor Conventual. After his ordination to the holy priesthood he gave himself up entirely to a life of humiliation, mortification, and obedience. He was most devoted to the Blessed Virgin Mary and promoted devotion to her among all classes of people.

It is said that the life of this Saint was marked by ecstasies and levitations. The mere mention of God or a spiritual matter was enough to take him out of his senses; at Mass he frequently floated in the air in rapture. Once as Christmas carols were being sung he soared to the high altar and knelt in the air, rapt in prayer.

The people flocked to him in droves seeking help and advice in the confessional, and he converted many to a truly Christian life. However, this humble man had to endure many severe trials and terrible temptations throughout his life. He died on September 18, 1663, and was canonized in 1767 by Pope Clement XII.

PRAYER God, You willed that Your only-begotten Son should draw all things to Himself when He was lifted up above the earth. May the merits and example of St. Joseph, Your Priest, help us to rise above all earthly desires so that we may come to Jesus. Amen.
