My dear parishioners,

We gather to participate in the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on this 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Old Testament reading and the Gospel for today speak of the Law, the Commandments. The Law, the Commandments, is sacred in Judaism for they serve as a "constitution" for Israel. It was in the Exodus experience prior to their entrance into the Promised Land that the Lord had given the Law to Moses who defined the covenant relationship between God and His people. The Law not only addressed responsibilities toward God but also between people. The Law distinguished Israel as a holy nation unlike all others. Obeying the Law and loving its precepts is a mark of holiness which is demonstrated in one's everyday life. In the Gospel passage the Lord Jesus acknowledges the faith of one of the Scribes who approaches Him seeking concurrence as he testifies to a life of obedience to the Commandments. The Lord approves of his life and assures him of his proximity to the Kingdom of God. Living under the Law places oneself as a servant of God who freely chooses to love the Lord. Obeying the Law is a freeing experience in which we know what is expected of us so that we might not wander into darkness. Disregarding the Commandments brings us at odds with our Creator and collaborators with the Devil who seeks to bring chaos not only into our life but also into our world.

Tuesday is a very important day for us as Americans as we cast our vote for those running for political office. This year's Presidential election will be significant as we note the political divide in our nation causing many to be stressful. We pray that the Lord God will bless with wisdom whoever is elected to office so that the good of our citizens will triumph and that the global community will also benefit. We also pray that the laws which will be enacted be consistent with Law of God, the Commandments. Salvation history bears witness to the nation which cherishes God's Law, prospers in holiness. May the United States of America be a nation in which our fellow citizens stand united in respecting one another and help one another in working toward the common good.

ST. CHARLES BORROMEO, Bishop November 9th – *Patron of Seminarians*

St. Charles, of the noble family of Borromeo, was born in 1538 on the banks of Lake Maggiore, Italy. He studied at Milan and afterward at the University of Pavia, where he received his doctorate in civil and canon law in 1559. His uncle the Cardinal de Medici, having in the same year been elected Pope under the title of Pius IV, sent for him and created him Cardinal, and a short time afterward nominated him Archbishop of Milan, though he was only twenty-two years of age.

At the same time he was detained at Rome by the POP and he began to labor diligently in the interest of the Church. There he founded the Vatican Academy for literary work. As papal Secretary of State he was instrumental in reassembling the Council of Trent in 1562. He was active in enforcing is reforms and in composing the Roman Catechism, containing the teachings of the Council.

After receiving priestly ordination, he also accepted the office of grand penitentiary. For merely honorary or lucrative positions he had no ambition. He assisted at the deathbed of Pope in 1564, and on the election of Pius V he went to reside at Milan. In 1572, he concurred in the election of Gregory XIII. In the great plague at Milan, in 1575, he showed himself the true shepherd by his self-sacrificing charity and heroism. This great light in the firmament of the Church was extinguished in 1584. He was canonized in 1610 by Pope Paul V.

Prayer God, maintain in Your people that spirit with which You inspired Your Bishop, St. Charles, so that Your church may be constantly renewed, conforming itself to Christ and Manifesting Christ to the world. Amen.
