JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE – His Excellency Bishop Sweeney has designated SAINT BERNARD CHURCH (22 St. Bernards Drive in Mount Hope) as a designated pilgrim site for the Diocese of Paterson. Pilgrims are welcome on Monday evenings for Holy Mass at 6:30, followed by Holy Hour and Confessions. A plenary indulgence is granted to pilgrims. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, calls all Christians to become pilgrims of hope. This is a virtue which must be sourced above all in the grace of God and in the fullness of His mercy. A plenary indulgence is given to those who are: truly repentant: free from any affection for sin; moved by a spirit of charity; receive the sacraments of Penance and Eucharist; and pray for the intentions of Pope Francis (1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and 1 Glory be...). A plenary indulgence is the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. This jubilee grace can be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory through pilgrimage, whose works of mercy and penance, and visits to a Jubilee designated shrine or church, such as Saint Bernard's.



My dear parishioners,

Assembling together for the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass we leave Ordinary Time on this Sunday to observe the Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord in the Temple. This feast is always observed on February 2<sup>nd</sup> which marks the 40<sup>th</sup> and final day of the Christmas season. The Gospel of Saint Luke is proclaimed today which speaks of this event regarding the ritual which Joseph and the Virgin Mary fulfilled in observance of religious law. The scene is theologically wonderful as we find the Only Begotten Son of God entering into the Temple, the House of God. God is greeted by two senior citizens who are awaiting His entrance into the holy place, Simeon and Anna. The old man Simeon takes the Child Jesus from the arms of the Mother of God and praises the Lord for the gift of years and that now he may go in peace because his eyes have seen the Holy One, the "Light of revelation to the Gentiles." Observing all that is happening the Prophetess Anna speaks about the Child Jesus to all whom she encounters.

Today's liturgy begins with the blessing of candles and a procession recalling the words of Simeon that the Child is the "Light of revelation to the Gentiles." For as long as supply lasts a blessed candle will be given to each family for devotional use at home at today's Mass. The blessed candle can be lighted for prayer during a difficult time or as the family gathers to pray the Rosary. We always are reminded of the words of our Savior who said, "I am the light of the world; he who follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (John 8:12)

Another name for today's feast is CANDLEMAS DAY because of the blessing of candles. We are fortunate this year because February 2<sup>nd</sup> falls on a Sunday and so we can celebrate this feast which for most years falls on a weekday, thus being unnoticed by most parishioners.

Since the pontificate of Pope Saint John Paul II the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord has also been the WORLD DAY OF CONSECRATED LIFE. The Universal Church acknowledges the gift that those in consecrated life are to the Church by living the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. # ST. ANSGAR, BISHOP The Same Day, February 3 – Patron of Scandinavia

Known as the "Apostle of the North" and specifically of Denmark and Sweden, St. Ansgar was born (801) near Amiens of a noble family. He was educated from childhood at the Benedictine monastery of Old Corbie in Picardy and later became a monk there and abbot of New Corbie in Westphalia.

On fire with love for God and eager to spread the Faith, he went to Denmark whose king had been newly converted. After establishing a school at Schleswig, he was expelled by the local pagans. Journeying to Sweden, the holy man of God built the first Christian Church there. In 835 he was made Bishop of Hamburg and in 848 Archbishop of Bremen. In 854 he was entrusted with the organization of the hierarchy in the Nordic countries Erik, King of Jutland, and helped mitigate the horrors of the slave trade. He died in 865.

PRAYER God, You willed to send St. Ansgar to enlighten many peoples. Through his intercession, grant that we may walk in the light of Your truth. Amen
