CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY

All Catholic Churches in the United States require from Catholics serving as a Godparent for Baptism or a sponsor for Confirmation a certificate of eligibility. This document certifies that the Godparent/sponsor is a registered member of the parish, attends Holy Mass, approaches the sacraments regularly and contributes to the support of the Church via the Sunday offering envelope program or "WeShare". It is the responsibility of the individual to meet these requirements as listed in the Code of Canon Law, #874.

JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE – His Excellency Bishop Sweeney has designated SAINT BERNARD CHURCH (22 St. Bernards Drive in Mount Hope) as a designated pilgrim site for the Diocese of Paterson. Pilgrims are welcome on Monday evenings for Holy Mass at 6:30, followed by Holy Hour and Confessions. A plenary indulgence is granted to pilgrims. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, calls all Christians to become pilgrims of hope. This is a virtue which must be sourced above all in the grace of God and in the fullness of His mercy. A plenary indulgence is given to those who are: *truly repentant; free from any affection for sin; moved by a spirit of charity; receive the sacraments of Penance and Eucharist; and pray for the intentions of Pope Francis (1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and 1 Glory be...)*. A plenary indulgence is the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. This jubilee grace can be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory through pilgrimage, whose works of mercy and penance, and visits to a Jubilee designated shrine or church, such as Saint Bernard's.

My dear parishioners,

Today is the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the Gospel for this Sunday we hear the story of the “Sermon on the Plain” in which the BEATITUDES are spoken by the Lord. In the Gospel of Matthew we hear of the same account with a bit of a different twist, the “Sermon on the Mount.” In both Gospels the Lord speaks of a code of conduct which is exemplary and to which His disciples are called to emulate. The Lord makes the contrast with the “woes” which are indications of life being lived in a manner not conducive to being His disciple.

A similar theme is found in the Old Testament reading from the Book of the Prophet Jeremiah. The Lord blesses those who hope and trust in Him, for they flourish and grow. Likewise those who turn from the Lord are cursed to wither and die. Yes, the blessed are those who hope in the Lord and trust in His promise. The Apostle Paul reminds us of this in today’s epistle reading from his first Letter to the Corinthians regarding the Resurrection. Christ is raised from the dead and for all who place their faith and hope in Him that they too will experience this same glory. To believe this is to be counted among the blessed, the Saints, who throughout the ages looked to the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus as their strength for living. This motivation inspired them to conduct themselves in a manner which is counter-cultural and by doing so demonstrated to others the ways which are pleasing to God.

Sharing in the victory of Christ’s Holy Resurrection is the joyful hope which unites the Church. Knowing that we will one day enjoy the eternal life the Lord has prepared for all those who love Him is the faith we hold. Let us strive to be counted among the “Blessed” so that the world may see and believe!

The holy season of Lent is quickly approaching and what a wonderful time this will be for our spiritual renewal. Lent challenges us and refreshes us in our spiritual life so that when we approach the holy mountain of Easter to celebrate our Lord’s Holy Resurrection we will be among the BLESSED. Standing in this assembly we will praise the Lord rejoicing that our reward will be great in heaven.

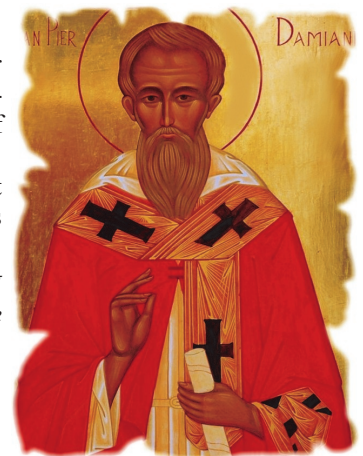

ST. PETER DAMIAN, Bishop and Doctor of the Church
February 21 – Patron of Headache Sufferers

A DEVOTED collaborator of Pope St. Gregory VII and, like him, a Benedictine, St. Peter Damian was one of the most glorious lights of the Church in the 11th century. Born in Ravenna in 1007, he became a Camaldolese monk at the monastery of Fonte Avellana, of which he became Abbot. He later became Cardinal and Bishop of Ostia and Velletri. St. Peter Damian worked zealously for the internal reform of the Church by fighting against such abuses as simony and incontinence. He wrote many works on ascetical theology. He is numbered as one of the Doctors of the Church and died at Faenza in 1072.
