STATIONS OF THE CROSS – The Way of the Cross is prayed every Friday during the season of Lent in our parish. The service follows the 8 o'clock morning Mass and takes place again in the evening at 7 o'clock. Let us join together in prayer as we recall the suffering our Lord endured for our salvation.

<u>LENTEN LUNCHES</u> – The annual Lenten Lunches sponsored by the Rockaway Ecumenical Clergy Association will take place every Friday during Lent beginning on March 7th. The program takes place at the First Presbyterian Church Fellowship Hall beginning with lunch at 12 Noon followed by a presentation given by a different clergy person each week.

SAINT JOSEPH NOVENA – The Solemnity of Saint Joseph is celebrated on Wednesday, March 19th with Holy Mass at 8 o'clock in the morning followed by the Blessing of "Saint Joseph Pastries" and a presentation on the life of Saint Joseph by Dr. Anthony Pane in Hayes Hall. The novena begins on Monday, March 10th and will take place each day at the conclusion of the 8 o'clock morning Mass.

BREAD AND SOUP – Every Thursday evening during Lent the "Bread and Soup" program will take place in Hayes Hall beginning at 6:30 with the serving of a variety of soups (and bread) in the spirit of Lenten fasting. This is followed by the viewing of the series "Oremus" produced by Ascension Press on the topis of prayer, one of the disciplines of Lent. We conclude with a short time of sharing and Evening Prayer by 8 o'clock. Please join us for this adult faith formation opportunity.

Church Regulations Regarding Fast and Abstinence:

Abstinence from meat (beast or fowl) is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen years old and older on Ash Wednesday and on all the Fridays of Lent. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat. Fasting means limiting oneself to one full meal on a given fast day. Catholics who are eighteen years of age but not yet fifty-nine are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On fast days, two additional smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength. However, the two smaller meals together may not equal one full meal. Moreover, eating solid foods between meals on fast days is not permitted.

JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE – His Excellency Bishop Sweeney has designated SAINT BERNARD CHURCH (22 St. Bernards Drive in Mount Hope) as a designated pilgrim site for the Diocese of Paterson. Pilgrims are welcome on Monday evenings for Holy Mass at 6:30, followed by Holy Hour and Confessions. A plenary indulgence is granted to pilgrims. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, calls all Christians to become pilgrims of hope. This is a virtue which must be sourced above all in the grace of God and in the fullness of His mercy. A plenary indulgence is given to those who are: truly repentant; free from any affection for sin; moved by a spirit of charity; receive the sacraments of Penance and Eucharist; and pray for the intentions of Pope Francis (1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and 1 Glory be...). A plenary indulgence is the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. This jubilee grace can be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory through pilgrimage, whose works of mercy and penance, and visits to a Jubilee designated shrine or church, such as Saint Bernard's.

My dear parishioners,

Today we commemorate the Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, which is the final Sunday before the start of Lent which begins on Wednesday. In the Gospel text for this Sunday we hear the Lord Jesus speak about hypocrisy and the need to conduct ourselves in an honorable fashion. This message is a wonderful introduction to the holy season of Lent when we are all invited to examine our lives and to bring about reform where needed. As we engage in this exercise we do so in a spirit of repentance as we recall the suffering and death Our Lord endured for our salvation.

On Wednesday we begin to embrace the rigors of the Lenten season with the incorporation of the three disciplines which characterize this season: PRAYER, FASTING, and ALMSGIVING. Be prepared to fast and abstain on this first day of Lent. Start now to talk about Lent with your family. Make sure your spouse in "on board" with our Lenten life-style. Parents have a special duty to introduce their children to the spirit of the Lenten season and encourage them to perform the disciplines of Lent. Remember that Ash Wednesday is a strict day of fast and abstinence (NO MEAT, 1 regular meal and 2 small meals). EVERY FRIDAY of Lent is a day of fasting and abstinence as we recall that it was on Friday that the Lord Jesus suffered greatly for our sins.

Attendance at Friday Stations of the Cross is a prayerful way to accompany the Lord and ask for His strength during this time of spiritual renewal. Daily Mass is encouraged before going to work or school either at 6:30 or 8 o'clock in the morning. Availing oneself to one of the spiritual programs we have in the parish, such as Bible study, Bread and Soup, Lenten retreat, are great opportunities for spiritual growth.

This is a special year when the Feast of Our Lord's Holy Resurrection, April 20th, will be observed by the entire Church, East and West. While we begin the Holy Season of Lent on Wednesday, members of the Orthodox Churches and Eastern Rite Catholic Churches begin Lent on Monday.

Lastly, I am looking forward to everyone participating in our alms project, OPERATION RICE BOWL. This annual alms project of Catholic Relief Services supports the programs which feed countless numbers of people living in hard pressed areas of our world who do not have enough to eat. Our fasting becomes a blessing for them! Please take a rice bowl and place it on your table at home as a reminder of those who are hungry and in need of our generosity. Place the money you would spend on snacks in the rice bowl and bring it to church on Easter Sunday.

STS. PERPETUA AND FELICITY, Martyrs — March 7

STS. PERPETUA and FELICITY and the friends who died with them at Carthage are in a special class among the primitive martyrs since we possess authentic detailed records which give us a vivid picture of their experiences and personalities. There is a diary of St. Perpetua herself, a page by another martyr, and a concluding account by a first-hand witness who is thought to have been Tertullian.

St. Perpetua was a twenty-two-year-old noble lady of Carthage with a baby son and St. Felicity was a married slave who was pregnant. They were arrested under the anti-Christian edict of 202 along with three fellow Christians, Saturninus, Secundulus, and Revocatus. All had been converted by a layman, Saturus, who joined them voluntarily in the dungeon in which they were imprisoned for refusing to sacrifice to the gods.

St. Perpetua yielded her nursing child to her pagan father but remained firm in her Faith in spite of his pleas. St. Felicity gave birth to a child in prison and also remained steadfast in the Faith when the child was taken from her.

The martyrs were condemned to death and mauled by beasts in the amphitheater before

finally being beheaded in the year 203. So shaken was the executioner by St. Perpetua's commanding aristocratic appearance that she herself had to guide his blade to her neck.

Their martyrdom became known throughout the Church—-St. Augustine preached in their honor at least three times. St. Perpetua is mentioned in the Roman Canon of Eucharistic Prayer 1, but the Felicity mentioned with her is probably the Roman Martyr of 162.

PRAYER God, inspired by Your love, Sts. Perpetua and Felicity were able to disregard persecution and overcome the torment of death. Aided by their prayers, may we make constant progress in our love for You. Amen
