PARISH PARTICIPATION IN MEMORIAL DAY

PARADE – Weather permitting, our parish will participate in the Memorial Day parade which will take place in the Borough on Monday, May 26th. To celebrate our 150th Parish Anniversary we will enter a float along with a walking contingent of parishioners. Please see the parish website for registration information. Participants will wear a uniform commemorative anniversary tee shirt. Information regarding sizes, etc. may also be found on the parish website. (The parade begins at 11 a.m. on East Main Street and Beach Street. The parade concludes at the Presbyterian Church parking lot across from Saint Cecilia's.) Join us to express our proud parish spirit in the community in which our church is found!

JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE – His Excellency Bishop Sweeney has designated SAINT BERNARD CHURCH (22 St. Bernards Drive in Mount Hope) as a designated pilgrim site for the Diocese of Paterson. Pilgrims are welcome on Monday evenings for Holy Mass at 6:30, followed by Holy Hour and Confessions. A plenary indulgence is granted to pilgrims. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, calls all Christians to become pilgrims of hope. This is a virtue which must be sourced above all in the grace of God and in the fullness of His mercy. A plenary indulgence is given to those who are: truly repentant; free from any affection for sin; moved by a spirit of charity; receive the sacraments of Penance and Eucharist; and pray for the intentions of Pope Francis (1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and 1 Glory be...). A plenary indulgence is the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. This jubilee grace can be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory through pilgrimage, whose works of mercy and penance, and visits to a Jubilee designated shrine or church, such as Saint Bernard's.

<u>MAY DEVOTIONS</u> – The month of May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. At the conclusion of the 8 o'clock morning Mass, Monday through Friday, we will pray the Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of Our Savior.

<u>HEALING MASS</u> – The Christian Care Committee is sponsoring the annual Healing Mass which will take place in our church on Saturday, May 17th at 11 o'clock in the morning. During the liturgy the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be administered. Following Mass a light reception will take place in Hayes Hall.

<u>CONFIRMATION</u> – His Excellency, Bishop Kevin Sweeney will visit our parish to confer the sacrament of confirmation upon a prepared group of our young people. Holy Mass will be celebrated at 7 o'clock in the evening on Friday, May 17th.

My dear parishioners,

Today we gather to celebrate the Eucharist on the Fourth Sunday of Easter which is traditionally known as "Good Shepherd Sunday." This designation is given due to the reading each year of some portion of the Gospel of John, Chapter 10 in which the Lord Jesus refers to Himself as the Good Shepherd who leads His sheep and sacrifices Himself for the sheep. As a result of the Good Shepherd theme this Sunday is also called "World Day of Prayer for Vocations."

The image of Christ the Good Shepherd is not only popular in today's Church but has been since the earliest days of Christianity. Just returning from Rome we had visited on our parish pilgrimage the Catacomb of Dormitilla on the Appian Way. This is just one of several catacombs which are open to visitors and which contain holy images going back to the first centuries. The icon of Christ the Good Shepherd is among them along with Old Testament and Eucharistic images which decorate the walls of some of the subterranean chambers.

The Evangelist John conveys the Lord's message to us that He loves us, guides us, protects us and offered His life for us. We know that the Latin word for shepherd is PASTOR, the one who provides care for others even to the detriment of himself. The good shepherd is a selfless servant who considers not his own needs but rather those for whom he cares.

With these thoughts we can easily see why this Sunday is designated as the "World Day of Prayer for Vocations." We are invited to pray for those involved in pastoral work in the Church, our bishops, priests, deacons, religious sisters, catechists and all those working in some pastoral ministry in the Church. We ask Christ the Good Shepherd to fill their hearts with a shepherd's love and strengthen them in their ministries. We also pray that the Lord will open the hearts of our young people to respond to the call to pastoral service so that the Church will have sufficient laborers in the service of the Gospel. How blessed we are at Saint Cecilia's to have a parish VOCATIONS COMMITTEE which meets regularly and keeps the topic vocations "on our radar." ST. DYMPHNA, Virgin and Martyr Patronese of the Mentally Ill—May 15

St. Dymphna was born in the 7th century. Her father, Damon, a chieftain of great wealth and power, was a pagan. Her mother was a very beautiful and devout Christian.

Dymphna was fourteen when her mother died. Damon is said to have been afflicted with a mental illness, brought on by his grief. He sent messengers throughout his own and other lands to find some woman of noble birth, resembling his wife, who would be willing to marry him. When none could be found, his evil advisers told him to marry his own daughter. Dymphna fled from her castle together with St. Gerebran, her confessor, and two other friends.

Damon found them in Belgium. He gave orders that the priest's head be cut off. Then Damon tried to persuade his daughter to return to Ireland with him. When she refused, he drew his sword and struck off her head. She was then only fifteen years of age.

Dymphna received the crown of martyrdom in defense of her purity about the year 620. She is the patron of those suffering from nervous and mental afflictions. Many miracles have taken place at her shrine, built on the spot where she was buried in Gheel, Belgium.


