JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE – His Excellency Bishop Sweeney has designated SAINT BERNARD CHURCH (22 St. Bernards Drive in Mount Hope) as a designated pilgrim site for the Diocese of Paterson. Pilgrims are welcome on Monday evenings for Holy Mass at 6:30, followed by Holy Hour and Confessions. A plenary indulgence is granted to pilgrims. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, calls all Christians to become pilgrims of hope. This is a virtue which must be sourced above all in the grace of God and in the fullness of His mercy. A plenary indulgence is given to those who are: truly repentant; free from any affection for sin; moved by a spirit of charity; receive the sacraments of Penance and Eucharist; and pray for the intentions of Pope Francis (1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and 1 Glory be...). A plenary indulgence is the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. This jubilee grace can be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory through pilgrimage, whose works of mercy and penance, and visits to a Jubilee designated shrine or church, such as Saint Bernard's.

HOLY HOUR CONCLUSION – Monday evening Holy Hour will conclude on June 30th. Holy Hour will be suspended during the summer months of July and August. Monday evening Holy Hour will return on September 8th.

5th SUNDAY ROSARY – The 5th Sunday of the Month Rosary will take place on Sunday, June 29th in Sacred Heart of Jesus Church on East Main Street beginning at 3 o'clock in the afternoon. My dear parishioners,

This Sunday as we gather to celebrate the Lord's Day we commemorate the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ which is also known by its traditional title of CORPUS CHRISTI. Prior to the liturgical reforms after the Second Vatican Council this feast was celebrated on the first Thursday after "Pentecost Week". Thursday is the day on which our Lord Jesus celebrated the Last Supper which is the reason why Thursday was chosen as the day for this commemoration.

Today we rejoice in the gift of the Holy Eucharist, the Blessed Sacrament, Holy Communion and there are other names for the Holy Gifts of Bread and Wine which become the Body and Blood of Christ at the Holy Mass. The Eucharist is confected during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass by the priest or bishop, who in Apostolic Succession, in "persona Christi" brings about the change in the bread and wine offered by calling down the Holy Spirit along with saying the doing what the Lord Jesus did at the Last Supper.

The office of the priest is presented in today's first reading from the Book of Genesis where we are introduced to the mysterious king and priest, Melchizedek who offers bread and wine before "Abraham, our father in faith." Melchizedek is a type of Christ, the High Priest of the New Covenant who offers Himself in the gifts of bread and wine.

In the epistle reading we find the very first description of the Mass. Paul's account of the Last Supper predates the Gospel telling of this event by about 20-25 years (45 A.D.). Illusions of the Holy Mass are found in the Gospel story of the feeding of 5,000 by the Evangelist Luke. The miraculous multiplication of bread and the feeding of all, with leftovers besides, is eucharistic.

How wonderful an experience we participated in this past week with the first time, in recent memory, of 40 HOUR DEVO-TIONS in our parish. The faith within our parish is an inspiration to me and I pray that the Eucharistic Lord Jesus will bless our parish community as we continue in our 150th anniversary observances.



St. Irenaeus, Bishop and Martyr June 28

We know very little about the life of St. Irenaeus, who is one of the most important theologians of the 2nd century. He was born about 130 in Asia Minor and placed in the care of St. Polycarp, the disciple of St. John the Apostle, and Bishop of Smyrna. He studied in Rome and later became a priest of Lyons in Gaul. In 178, he succeeded St. Pothinus as Bishop of Lyons.

Through his preaching he converted many to the Faith and his writings did much to combat the heresies that were rampant, especially those of the Gnostics and Valentinians. His principal works are: *Against Heresies* and *The Proof of the Apostolic Preaching*. Accordingly, he is regarded as a link between the East and West. He died a martyr in 202 during the persecution of Septimus Severus.



Prayer God, You enable St. Irenaeus, Your Bishop, to strengthen the truth of Faith and the peace of the Church. Through his intercession my we be renewed in Faith and love and always strive to foster unity and concord. Amen.
