CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY

All Catholic Churches in the United States require from Catholics serving as a Godparent for Baptism or a sponsor for Confirmation a certificate of eligibility. This document certifies that the Godparent/sponsor is a registered member of the parish, attends Holy Mass, approaches the sacraments regularly and contributes to the support of the Church via the Sunday offering envelope program or "WeShare". It is the responsibility of the individual to meet these requirements as listed in the Code of Canon Law, #874.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Arrangements are to be made at least ONE YEAR in advance. The date should not be set until the priest has been consulted.

JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE – His Excellency Bishop Sweeney has designated SAINT BERNARD CHURCH (22 St. Bernards Drive in Mount Hope) as a designated pilgrim site for the Diocese of Paterson. Pilgrims are welcome on Monday evenings for Holy Mass at 6:30, followed by Holy Hour and Confessions. A plenary indulgence is granted to pilgrims. Our Holy Father, Pope Leo, calls all Christians to become pilgrims of hope. This is a virtue which must be sourced above all in the grace of God and in the fullness of His mercy. A plenary indulgence is given to those who are: *truly repentant; free from any affection for sin; moved by a spirit of charity; receive the sacraments of Penance and Eucharist; and pray for the intentions of Pope Francis (1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and 1 Glory be...)*. A plenary indulgence is the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. This jubilee grace can be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory through pilgrimage, whose works of mercy and penance, and visits to a Jubilee designated shrine or church, such as Saint Bernard's.

HOLY HOUR CONCLUSION – Monday evening Holy Hour will conclude on June 30th. Holy Hour will be suspended during the summer months of July and August. Monday evening Holy Hour will return on September 8th.

5th SUNDAY ROSARY – The 5th Sunday of the Month Rosary will take place on Sunday, June 29th in Sacred Heart of Jesus Church on East Main Street beginning at 3 o'clock in the afternoon. The Rosary is prayed along with the Divine Mercy Chaplet. This service is sponsored by the Knights of Columbus Council 3359 and is open to all.

Next week we will take up the Peter's Pence Collection to support the Universal Church and the work of the Holy See, including the charitable works of Pope Leo. These works benefit our brothers and sisters on the margins of society, including victims of war, oppression, and disasters. Please be generous. My dear parishioners,

As we gather to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on the Lord's Day we are commemorating the Feast of the Apostles Peter and Paul. This is an annual observance on June 29th and because this day falls on a Sunday this year it has precedence over the 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time which is suppressed. This day is celebrated with great festivity in the city of Rome as the Apostles Peter and Paul are the patrons of this city in which they were both martyred during the reign of the Emperor Nero in about the year 64. Peter served as the Bishop of Rome after leaving Antioch ministering to the Christians of the city before being crucified upside down on Vatican Hill. The Apostle Paul was transported to Rome and was under house arrest for a short time before being tried and executed by beheading. The Apostle Peter is buried under the altar of Saint Peter's Basilica and the Apostle Paul is buried under the altar of the Basilica of Saint Paul Outside the Walls.

Today's Gospel speaks of the Petrine Ministry which is given to Peter and is passed down through the centuries to the Roman Pontiff, the Bishop of Rome. We are still in awe that an American Cardinal was elected to the office of Peter. Our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV is a great blessing to the Universal Church.

Vatican News Service recently announced that the Holy Father will resume the practice of the Pope spending some time in the summer at the Papal Residence at Castle Gondolfo. With the exception of Pope Francis, this traditional respite provided the Pope with some time for rest and reflection. Rest and Reflection is the goal that all of us should pursue during the hot summer months so as to be refreshed for the activities which will resume in the fall. Vatican News Service also stated that the Holy Father's schedule has been reduced for the next two months with the suspension of the Weekly Audiences and other selected public functions.

Here at Saint Cecilia's we too will follow this lead as we have for the past number of years. All of our parish meetings, religious education program, Holy Hour, etc have been suspended for July and August. The weekday and Sunday Masses remain at their regular times for Divine Worship.

REST and REFLECTION should be observed during this time as we recharge ourselves to resume the activities which await us beginning in September.

ST. ELIZABETH OF PORTUGAL
July 4 – Patroness of Third Order of St. Francis

THE father of St. Elizabeth was Peter III, King of Aragon. She came into the world at the royal palace in Saragossa in 1271, and received the name of Elizabeth after her aunt, St. Elizabeth of Hungary, who several years before had been canonized by Pope Gregory IX.

Her grandfather, James I, who then occupied the throne of Aragon, took upon himself the care of her education, but he died before she was six years of age. Her early years were spent in the most extraordinary piety and at the age of twelve she was given in marriage to Dionysius, King of Portugal. However, her husband left her free to practice her devotions, and she lived on the throne with the virtue and regularity of a Religious. Eventually, her patience and gentleness succeeded in converting the King, who had been leading a licentious life. Charity to the poor was one of her characteristic virtues, and her works for the good of her fellowmen knew no bounds.

Her virtue also had to pass through the crucible of suffering. One of the keenest pangs she endured came from the revolt of her son, Alfonso, against his own father, and the unjust treatment of the latter, who suspected her of favoring his son. The King, however, soon acknowledged his error and made amends, and the saintly woman succeeded in effecting a reconciliation between father and son.

After the death of her husband she took the habit of the Third Order of St. Francis and retired to a convent of Poor Clares, near which she dwelt in a house she had erected. Hearing that her son, Alphonsus IV, King of Portugal, had gone to war with her grandson, Alfonso IX, King of Castile, she set out on a journey to reconcile them and succeeded. This was her last act of mercy, for having arrived at Estremoz, on the frontiers of Castile where her son was, she fell ill. After receiving the Last Sacraments, she died on July 4, 1336, and was canonized in 1625 by Pope Urban VIII.

PRAYER God, Author and Lover of charity, You endowed St. Elizabeth with the wondrous grace of bringing dissidents together. Through her intercession enable us to practice works of peace so that we may be called children of God. Amen.
