Please note that the hospital does not call the parish office to notify the priest if a parishioner is admitted. This becomes the families responsibility.

JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE – His Excellency Bishop Sweeney has designated SAINT BERNARD CHURCH (22 St. Bernards Drive in Mount Hope) as a designated pilgrim site for the Diocese of Paterson. Pilgrims are welcome on Monday evenings for Holy Mass at 6:30, followed by Holy Hour and Confessions. A plenary indulgence is granted to pilgrims. Our Holy Father, Pope Leo, calls all Christians to become pilgrims of hope. This is a virtue which must be sourced above all in the grace of God and in the fullness of His mercy. A plenary indulgence is given to those who are: truly repentant; free from any affection for sin; moved by a spirit of charity; receive the sacraments of Penance and Eucharist; and pray for the intentions of Pope Francis (1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and 1 Glory be...). A plenary indulgence is the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. This jubilee grace can be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory through pilgrimage, whose works of mercy and penance, and visits to a Jubilee designated shrine or church, such as Saint Bernard's.

My dear parishioners,

We gather today to celebrate the Eucharist on the Lord's Day which is the 16<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time. I think the word HOSPITALITY jumps out from the Scripture texts which are given for our reflection, especially in the Old Testament and Gospel readings. We know that the serving involved with showing hospitality requires the giving of oneself in service to others. This message is present in today's epistle reading as the Apostle Paul considers the affliction he experiences as a result of the service he is rendering to the Church. Yes, there is suffering, the putting out of oneself which is required when tending to the needs of others. But hospitality is something we all joyfully give when we are receiving guests whom we know and love. Hospitality is that which we are all called to provide even to those who are strangers as we recall in last Sunday's Gospel about the Good Samaritan.

WELCOME is a kind gesture to render and a wonderful one to receive. In many cultures to receive a guest and to offer hospitality is regarded as sacred. As an example, in my own Polish culture there is a saying: "gosc dom, Bog dom." The translation is: "a guest in the home is God in the home." This sentiment has Scriptural roots as we see in today's reading from the Book of Genesis with the story which is called, "the Hospitality of Abraham and Sarah" in which they welcome God (represented in the three angels). God is welcomed in the home of Mary, Martha and Lazarus when Jesus comes to visit.

The visit of the Lord Jesus is the opportunity in which emphasis is placed upon the guest. Mary is so happy that Jesus is in her company that everything else becomes secondary. Good Martha is so busy about the prep work that the Lord becomes secondary. God is in their home which should surpass all other concerns. The Holy One is amongst them to nourish them and provide them with blessings beyond imagination.

Sometimes we forget about the people who come to us seeking welcome. We look upon the needy with contempt and when shamed, grudgingly offer assistance to them. The stranger and refugee are vilified so many times in our current culture. The Church reminds the faithful of the welcome we are called upon to offer in the name of Jesus. We recall the words of the Lord Jesus: "...I was a stranger and you welcomed Me..." (Matthew 25:35)

When we welcome others, one day we will be welcomed into eternity by our Savior!

#### ST. MARY MAGDALENE July 22

ST. MARY, whom Jesus converted, and who witnessed His last moments with Mary, His Mother, and St. John, was called Magdalene from the town of Magdala in Galilee. Clement of Alexandria and others identify her with the woman who washed Jesus' feet with her tears. Others regard her as Mary, the Sister of Martha and Lazarus. She followed Jesus with other devout women during His Public Life. After His Resurrection, Jesus appeared first to Mary Magdalene and then to His Apostles.

It is an ancient tradition in Provence, France, that St. Mary Magdalene or Mary the sister of Lazarus, together with Lazarus, Martha, and some other disciples of our Lord, being expelled by the Jews, put to sea and landed at Marseilles; and that St. Lazarus became the first Bishop of that See.

The feast of St. Mary Magdalene is celebrated by the Greeks as well as the Latins on this date. However, in the instructions given with the latest edition of the Roman Calendar, the Latin Church has stipulated that the feast is solely that of the woman to whom Christ appeared and not that of the sister of Lazarus or the penitent woman.



PRAYER God, it was to St. Mary Magdalene before all others that Your Son committed the message of Easter joy. Through her intercession may we one day contemplate Him reigning in glory. Amen
