JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE – His Excellency Bishop Sweeney has designated SAINT BERNARD CHURCH (22 St. Bernards Drive in Mount Hope) as a designated pilgrim site for the Diocese of Paterson. Pilgrims are welcome on Monday evenings for Holy Mass at 6:30, followed by Holy Hour and Confessions. A plenary indulgence is granted to pilgrims. Our Holy Father, Pope Leo, calls all Christians to become pilgrims of hope. This is a virtue which must be sourced above all in the grace of God and in the fullness of His mercy. A plenary indulgence is given to those who are: truly repentant; free from any affection for sin; moved by a spirit of charity; receive the sacraments of Penance and Eucharist; and pray for the intentions of Pope Francis (1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and 1 Glory be...). A plenary indulgence is the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. This jubilee grace can be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory through pilgrimage, whose works of mercy and penance, and visits to a Jubilee designated shrine or church, such as Saint Bernard's.

HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION – The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven will be observed on Friday, August 15th. The Vigil Mass for the feast will take place on Thursday afternoon, August 14th at 4:30. Holy Masses on Friday will be celebrated in the morning at 6:30 and 8 o'clock. The evening Mass will be celebrated at 7 o'clock. This is a Holy Day of Obligation and has the same status as a Sunday.

THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

This week we commemorate a Holy Day of Obligation, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In the Eastern Catholic and Eastern Orthodox Churches this feast is also observed and known as the Dormition (Falling Asleep) of the Most Holy Theotokos and Ever Virgin Mary. The Undivided Church has celebrated this feast on August 15th since the 6th Century. In 1950 Pope Pius XII proclaimed the Dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven. A portion of the Papal document states: *Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and the conqueror of sin and death*

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says: "The Assumption of the Blessed Vigin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians."

The Troparion which is sung in the Byzantine Church for this feast says: IN GIVING BIRTH YOU KEPT YOUR VIRGINITY; IN YOUR DORMITION YOU DID NOT LEAVE THE WORLD, O MOTHER OF GOD, BUT WERE JOINED TO THE SOURCE OF LIFE. YOU CONCEIVED THE LIVING GOD AND, BY YOUR PRAYERS, WILL DELIVER OUR SOULS FROM DEATH.

In some churches there is the tradition to bless flowers on this feast. This comes from a tradition which says that when the Blessed Virgin had died the Apostles had gathered to pray at her tomb and when it was opened, so they could see her for one last time, the tomb did not contain her body but only fresh flowers.

Glorious things are spoken of you, O Mary, who today were exalted above the choirs of angels into eternal triumph with Christ.

My dear parishioners,

Today is the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time as we gather to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass to commemorate the Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The Sacred Scriptures speak of the gift of faith and how one's life is lived because of this relationship with the Lord. The Book of Wisdom conveys the faith of those freed in the Exodus event, the miracle of salvation which is recalled in the celebration of Passover.

A wonderful account of faith is presented in the epistle reading from the Letter to the Hebrews focusing upon Abraham and Sarah. This lengthy reading is at times humorous and awe-inspiring as we are reminded of these senior citizens who possessed a genuine trust in God which allowed them to participate in the unimaginable. Their faith prompted their actions with a determination which reverberates throughout the ages inspiring generations.

Likewise, the Gospel reading for this Sunday is also a lengthy one as we hear the Lord Jesus speak to His disciples about faith and the responsibilities that are associated with it. People of faith should conduct themselves in a manner which is honorable as they wait in anticipation of the coming of the Kingdom of God. The example of faithfulness is an evangelizing tool which promotes the Gospel. The Lord does not hesitate to speak of the severe punishment awaiting those to whom much is expected but had been untrustworthy.

The gift of faith is one which missionaries have brought to peoples around the world since the beginning of the Church. To-day we are most grateful to welcome a priest who comes to us from the other side of the world, Father Michael Tigga who will deliver the homily at all our Masses. Father Michael is from the Diocese of Dinjapur in Bangladesh. Father is here as part of the annual Missionary Cooperative Appeal which is held in all the parishes in the Diocese of Paterson during the month of August. As we listen to Father's message, I pray that our faith will be enlivened so that we might offer our prayers and financial support for this work in promulgating the Gospel.

Like our ancestors in faith, Abraham and Sarah, may our trust be in the Lord who calls us to depart from hopelessness and to journey to "the city with foundations, whose architect and maker is God." (the Heavenly Jerusalem)

May we be found trustworthy and diligent in our stewardship as God's holy people.

St. Clare, Virgin August 11 – Patroness of Television

Assisi, the birthplace of St. Francis, had also the honor of giving birth to St. Clare, his spiritual daughter. She was born in 1193. From her childhood she desired to consecrate herself to Jesus Christ. Having heard of St. Francis and his sanctity, she contrived to be taken to home by a pious matron. The conversation of St. Francis made her resolve to abandon the world. On March 18, 1212, together with another young woman, she went to the Portiuncula, where St. Francis prayed, and received the penitential habit.

At first St. Francis placed her in a Benedictine convent of nuns. She persevered in her resolution in spite of the opposition of her friends and relatives. Later her sister Agnes joined her. St. Francis then placed then in a separate house. Soon after, her mother and several other ladies, some of high nobility, united themselves to her. The foundation of Poor Clares, or the Second Order of St. Francis, was thus laid. Within a few years St. Clare founded a number of other monasteries and her Order spread to Germany and Bohemia.

The austerities these religious women practices had scarcely ever been known among their sex. Together with other mortifications, their fast was perpetual. Such was the spirit of poverty of St. Clare that when, after her profession, she fell heiress to the large fortune of her father, she gave all of it to the poor. She would accept no revenues for her monastery. When the army of Fredrick II was devastating the valley of Spoleto some of the soldiers placed a ladder against the convent wall. St Clare caused herself to be carried to a window, and, holding the monstrance with the Blessed Sacrament in sight of the enemies, she prostrated herself before the Eucharistic God. Her Prayer was heard, and the enemies struck with a sudden panic, fled in terror. St. Clare's life came to and end, on August 11, 1253. She was canonized in 1255 by Pope Alexander IV.

PRAYER God, in Your mercy You led St. Clare to embrace poverty. Through her intercession help us to follow Christ in the spirit of poverty and to contemplate You in the heavenly Kingdom. Amen
