My dear parishioners,

Today is the 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time in our commemoration of the Lord's Day. As we gather to celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass we find the word **FAITH** present in the three Scriptural readings and which is the basis for our reflection today. The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines faith in the following: "Faith is first of all a personal adherence of man to God. At the same time, and inseparably, it is a free ascent to the whole truth that God has revealed." (#150) The truth has been revealed to us through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ who says "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14:6)

With the request of the Apostles to "Increase our faith" the Lord Jesus responds, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you." Sounds like faith is pretty powerful and can accomplish extraordinary things. Of course, the Lord is using hyperbole to make a point so that we would not discount faith but see it for it truly is, potentially life-changing.

In the Old Testament reading the Prophet Habakkuk speaks of the just one, who because of his faith, shall live. The one who is faithless is surrounded by misfortune, destruction and chaos, these threaten and overwhelm him. These evils can bring despondency into human life causing darkness and extinction.

Encouraging words are found in the epistle reading from the Second Letter of the Apostle Paul to Timothy. Paul writes to his young confrere reminding him of the faith Timothy professed on the day of his baptism and ordination. Paul writes, "Guard this rich trust with the help of the Holy Spirit that dwells within us" This gift of faith allows the Holy Spirit to work within giving one the charisms to be faithful to the Gospel regardless of the challenges which are encountered. The Apostles words are words of faith which encourage followers of Christ to be strong, confident of the Lord's presence.

I encourage you to read the Letter to the Hebrews, chapter 11 which provides a wonderful reflection on the gift of faith and how this gift empowered our ancestors of faith to trust in the Lord. Their lives are a testimony of trust in the God who is the revealer of truth!

ST. PELAGIA, Virgin and Martyr October 8

Out of a maze of lengendary tales connected with this name we can ascertain that the historical St. Pelagia was a devout Christian who lived in Antioch at the end of the 3rd century and the beginning of the 4th. About the year 305, when she was fifteen, the local persecutor of the Church learned of her Christian Faith and sent a group of soldiers to bring her to him for examination.

Despite her tender years, St. Pelagia was well aware of the outrages to which Christ's virgins were subjected in such cases. Therefore, when the soldiers reached her home, she declared that she had to put on her bravest apparel and excused herself from the room. Instead, she swiftly made her way to the roof of her house and flung herself headlong to the ground below in order to preserve her richest prize — the virginity she had vowed to Jesus.

The learned and saintly Doctors, St. Ambrose and St. John Chrysostom, both knew of her action and both concurred that it was a noble example of love of chastity. She is thus classified as a Virgin and Martyr by the Church.

PRAYER All-powerful and ever-living God, You choose the weak in this world to confound the powerful. As we celebrate the martyrdom of St. Pelagia, may we like her remain constant in Faith. Amen.
