JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE – His Excellency Bishop Sweeney has designated SAINT BERNARD CHURCH (22) St. Bernards Drive in Mount Hope) as a designated pilgrim site for the Diocese of Paterson. Pilgrims are welcome on Monday evenings for Holy Mass at 6:30, followed by Holy Hour and Confessions. A plenary indulgence is granted to pilgrims. Our Holy Father, Pope Leo, calls all Christians to become pilgrims of hope. This is a virtue which must be sourced above all in the grace of God and in the fullness of His mercy. A plenary indulgence is given to those who are: truly repentant; free from any affection for sin; moved by a spirit of charity; receive the sacraments of Penance and Eucharist; and pray for the intentions of Pope Francis (1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary and 1 Glory be...). A plenary indulgence is the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. This jubilee grace can be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory through pilgrimage, whose works of mercy and penance, and visits to a Jubilee designated shrine or church, such as Saint Bernard's.

<u>DIOCESAN EVENT</u> – Bishop Sweeney is inviting you to join with him on Sunday, December 28<sup>th</sup> for the diocesan closure of the Jubilee Year of Hope. Holy Mass will begin at 3 o'clock in the afternoon in the Cathedral of Saint John the Baptist in Paterson. All parishes are asked to be represented at this celebration. (The official closure of the Jubilee Year of Hope will take place at the Vatican on the Feast of the Epiphany, January 6, 2026). For your GPS: the cathedral is located at 381 Grand Street in Paterson. Free indoor parking is available at the county parking garage adjacent to the cathedral.

<u>OPLATEK</u> – Oplatek, Christmas wafers used at the vigil supper on Christmas Eve, are available at the altar of Saint Joseph and in the parish office. This tradition is one held by those from Eastern European countries.

BAMBINELLI SUNDAY – The Roman tradition of blessing the image of the Baby Jesus for the home Nativity scene will take place at all the Masses on December 13-14, Gaudete Sunday. Bring your statue of Baby Jesus for a blessing by placing it on the table in the church sanctuary prior to Mass. This sacramental is a wonderful presence in the home for Christmas.

My dear parishioners,

In our Eucharistic liturgy to celebrate the Lord's Day the Gospel reading introduces us to the great prophet, forerunner and baptist, John. The Evangelist Matthew describes John's appearance and the ministry, which is uniquely his, as he confronts the members of the religious establishment who appear at the Jordan River where he is baptizing. The Pharisees and the Sadducees have come to investigate John so that they may continue in their malicious attacks against him. The baptist's fiery attack is an indication of the contention which is sparked by Jerusalem's religious establishment in discrediting John and his call to repentance and vigilance for the Lord's coming. John calls them to "produce good fruits" as a sign of their genuine adhering to his message of repentance and vigilance.

On this Second Sunday of Advent, we are reminded in the epistle reading of the encouragement and welcome we should extend to one another as members of the household of faith. I believe this is demonstrated by the generosity we show to one another and especially to those in need. This season is one which especially encourages us to be charitable as we are asked to give a friendly welcome to those who are experiencing difficulties in their lives to which we might be able to offer some consolation. This welcome is manifested in our kindness and generosity. Our yearly ADVENT TREE PROJECT and BABY BASSINETTE PROJECT are those means by which we can show our love for Christ and our brothers and sisters through our good works. I would like to thank you, in advance, for the gifts which will be brought to the church next Sunday. I am always overwhelmed by your generosity – it's a sign of your faith in Christ Jesus.

The Old Testament reading from the Prophet Isaiah speaks of a time when wonderful things will occur, things which one could never image to happen. Miraculous events take place due to the inauguration of the Kingdom of God. The coming of Christ the Savior initiated these wonders, and they are taking place today through the good works, motivated by faith, performed by those who are the followers of the Savior. You are witness to this!

#### Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary December 8-Patroness of the United States

Mary the Mother of God is venerated on December 8 as the Immaculate Conception. This feast commemorates the preservation of the Blessed Virgin from the stain of original sin from first moment of her conception. It originated in the Eastern Church about the 8<sup>th</sup> century.

The doctrine of the Immaculate Conception was defined by Pope Pius IX on December 8, 1854. This dogma, in accord with the texts of Scripture-"I will put enmity between you and the woman, between your seed and her seed" (Gn 3:15); "Hail, full of grace" (Luke 1:28)—was clearly understood and accepted by tradition, by the writings of the Fathers and by feasts observed according to the general belief of the faithful long before it was officially defined by Pope Pius IX.



PRAYER God, through the Immaculate Conception of the Virgin, You prepared a worthy place for Your Son. In view of the foreseen Death of Your Son, You preserved her from all sin. Through her intercession grant that we may also reach You with clean hearts. Amen.
