Contemporary Music Ministry

Do you enjoy singing along with the music at 9:30AM Mass? If you answered, "Yes" then maybe you might think about joining the Contemporary Music Group. We are looking for more singers and instrumentalist to enhance our sound. You may or not be aware that we have two Rosary groups in St. Ann's. There is a Monday to Friday group that meets at 8:25 A.M. and a Monday evening group that meets at 7:15 P.M.

The Monday to Friday Rosary begins with recitation of the Divine Chaplet, followed by the recitation of the Rosary. Christ told Saint Faustina that whoever recites the Chaplet will receive great mercy at the time of death. In the 1930's a Polish nun known as St. Faustina Kowalska recorded the chaplet of Divine Mercy after receiving visions from Jesus Christ.

Jesus taught that praying with others is especially powerful as He is there within our midst during these times. This especially is true for the Rosary. Pope Pious the IX said "Give me one million families praying the Rosary and the world is saved." Pope Pious the X said "Give me an army saying the Rosary and I will conquer the world." St. Louis De Montfort said "One who says the Rosary alone gains the merit of that one Rosary but if he says it together with others, he gains the merit of each Rosary".

"When you say your Rosary, the Angels rejoice, the Blessed Trinity delights in it, My Son finds joy in it too, and I myself am happier than you can possibly guess, after the Sacrifice of the Mass there is nothing in the Church that I love as much as the Rosary" Our Lady to Blessed Alan de la Roche.

On June 13, 1917 Our Lady of Fatima said "I want you to pray the Rosary every day."

The morning Rosary is in serious need of new members due to illness, relocation and need to care for family members, etc. The morning group is down to 5 regular members but three of them will probably be gone by the fall.

Please help us to continue this devotion and gain in the benefits of group prayer. It would be sad if it would come to an end after many years in St Ann's parish.

For those of you who are not familiar with the Chaplet or do not have a Rosary we will have extras to provide you with.

Question of the Week...

When does being Jesus' disciple require courage?

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

When you have an opportunity to take a once in a lifetime chance, do you take it? Granted, there is no strict definition for such an instance, but in the strictest sense of the term, do you take chances or do you play it safe? One could argue that our lives are a series of

opportunities, and some of the choices we make are the only chances we'll ever have. We may decide to go to work rather than college, and years later we're unable to find the time or the will to go back and get that degree. Or, sometimes a once in a lifetime chance is as simple as asking for something.

Bartimaeus figured that he had nothing to lose; blind since birth, he had heard that Jesus was preaching to a crowd nearby. Knowing in his heart that Jesus was truly the Son of God, Bartimaeus went to Jesus, and interrupting his sermon asked Jesus to cure his blindness. Jesus' compassion for a man who had such faith without seeing led him to grant his wish. If we can have faith in Jesus without ever having seen or heard him, will we realize a "once in a lifetime chance"?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, teaching on faith, states: "[A] disciple of Christ must not only keep the faith and live on it, but also profess it, confidently bear witness to it, and spread it" (CCC 1816). Bartimaeus not only possessed great faith in Jesus, he was unashamed and unafraid to call out to his Savior in front of the many people around him. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus said, "Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father." Today, if you meet someone who needs the loving arms of Jesus Christ, take that chance to share his promise of everlasting life.
