Immacares (Immaculate Conception Shelter)

Immacare homeless shelter will house only 75 guests this year, even during the winter months . The shelter will be having much needed renovation work done because the church is in poor condition and safety and building costs (heat literally going out the windows) are major considerations. Despite knowing this makes the planning easier, we are saddened wondering where the additional men will go, but have been assured that the City is looking into alternative sites for a "No Freeze"emergency shelter.

Because of the loss of a \$28,000 state grant, lunches and breakfast cannot be supplied by Immacare this year. Food simply cannot fit in the budget. We would like to bring breakfast breads and 80 "brown bag lunches" whenever we go with dinner. We have already contacted many of those wonderful people who shop, cook, and bake year after year. As always, they have been so kind and supportive. Some school groups and families have offered to make sandwiches some dates! Please let us know if you would be willing to donate breakfast breads (ie banana bread, muffins, your favorites...). We will also appreciate any juice boxes and desserts. If you are in a group that would like to get together and make sandwiches, as long as they can be frozen, we'd love to take them because many days there will not be any food offered until dinner. Of course, we will still be responsible for dinner on the evenings that we visit . Thanks so much for any help. St. Ann's has a wonderful reputation at the shelter as the group that meets any challenge- and more importantlyhas the best cooks! We are so blessed.

Archdiocese of Hartford Progress Report

By late September, the first round of pastoral planning meetings will have resulted in restructuring

recommendations from over 200 priests and at least 900 parishioners representing 17 deaneries and 212 parishes of the Archdiocese. An additional round of meetings with priests and parishioners will begin sometime in November. These meetings will entail reviews and feedback on the first round of deanery planning. The feedback we gather will be used to advance our thinking on how best to restructure our deaneries. Additionally, and as a response to people's request for more frequent and up-to-date communication, the Office of Pastoral Planning has launched its new Pastoral Planning website: www.stewardsfortomorrow.org. Here you will find information about Pastoral Planning, including a glossary of key terms; people invested in guiding the process; data and statistics that will help inform decisions; news and testimonies from those involved in the pastoral planning process, and much more. Finally, in the last quarter of 2016, we will publish a special edition magazine dedicated to providing even more information about pastoral planning, including stories and testimonies from people whose parishes and/or schools have already merged or are in the process of restructuring. The magazine will be mailed to every registered household of the Archdiocese.

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Proverbs have a way of succinctly stating a concept that can become a kind of mantra for explaining the way things are. Sayings like, "Mighty oaks from little acorns grow," or "The apple doesn't fall far from the tree," or "It's the squeaky wheel that gets the grease," are all meant to encapsulate a larger concept in a brief sentence. For the most part, the person hearing the phrase immediately understands to what the speaker is referring. And so the saying, "He can't see the forest for the trees," is often understood as describing someone who cannot comprehend the larger implications of things because all he can see is the minute details on which he is focused.

In the Gospel this weekend Jesus tells a parable about a rich man who was seemingly oblivious to both the forest and the trees. In the story the rich man seems unconcerned with anything but his own pleasure. He dresses in fine linen. He eats great meals. It seems like he has it all. The "forest" of communal interaction seems beyond his imagination. At the same time, from what we are told, the rich man also seems not to have taken any notice of the beggar at his door. He was not even aware of the "trees" of someone right at his gate.

In our lives as Christians, both the forest and the trees are important. We can't lose sight of either of them. As people in the world we must continue to be involved in working for a more just society through our advocacy and political activity. We have to promote the causes of life, human dignity, peace, and the common good. That's the big picture, the forest, that we see. At the same time through our works of charity and simple outreach we touch the lives the poor, the sick, the lonely, and the dying in our very midst. They are the trees right in front of us, and we cannot miss them either.
