

Immacares (Immaculate Conception Shelter)

Immacare homeless shelter will house only 75 guests this year, even during the winter months. The shelter will be having much needed renovation work done because the church is in poor condition and safety and building costs (heat literally going out the windows) are major considerations. Despite knowing this makes the planning easier, we are saddened wondering where the additional men will go, but have been assured that the City is looking into alternative sites for a "No Freeze" emergency shelter.

Because of the loss of a \$28,000 state grant, lunches and breakfast cannot be supplied by Immacare this year. Food simply cannot fit in the budget. We would like to bring breakfast breads and 80 "brown bag lunches" whenever we go with dinner. We have already contacted many of those wonderful people who shop, cook, and bake year after year. As always, they have been so kind and supportive. Some school groups and families have offered to make sandwiches some dates! Please let us know if you would be willing to donate breakfast breads (ie banana bread, muffins, your favorites...). We will also appreciate any juice boxes and desserts. If you are in a group that would like to get together and make sandwiches, as long as they can be frozen, we'd love to take them because many days there will not be any food offered until dinner. Of course, we will still be responsible for dinner on the evenings that we visit. Thanks so much for any help. St. Ann's has a wonderful reputation at the shelter as the group that meets any challenge- and more importantly-has the best cooks! We are so blessed.



Defending Our Religious Liberty

According to Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore, chairman of the USCCB's Ad Hoc Committee for Religious Liberty, comments made by Martin Castro, chairman of the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights, saying that religious liberty is reduced to "nothing except hypocrisy," and religion is being used as a "weapon... by those seeking to deny others equality" are shocking. It suggests that Catholic, evangelical, orthodox Jewish, Mormon, and Muslim communities are comparable to fringe segregationists from the civil rights era. These statements, said Lori, painting those who support religious freedom with the broad brush of bigotry are reckless and reveal a profound disregard for the religious foundations of his own work.

If you haven't done so already, please voice your opposition to the federal health care mandate by calling U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services Sylvia Mathews Burwell at 202-205-5445, and your elected state representatives. Let them know that the mandate is in violation of our First Amendment right to religious freedom.

Quarterly earnings reports for many publicly traded companies have either just been released or will be in the next week or so. Since every company reports them on its own schedule after the end of the quarter, it is a rolling release that investors will examine in the days to come. How well a company does will affect its share price on the stock exchange, and the compensation that is eventually determined by the board of directors for a company's leaders. Company policies or union contracts often determine how the rest of the workforce down the line get to share in any benefits of a positive earnings report.

The words of Jesus in the Gospel may seem a bit harsh this week. He tells his apostles that they could describe themselves as unprofitable servants who have only done what they were obliged to do. It does not seem to be a very flattering picture of what it means to be a Christian. In Jesus' day a servant performed such menial tasks that it is hard for us to even imagine them today. We hear Jesus describing the master as telling the servant to prepare something for him to eat. Such actions required much more than popping something in a microwave. Meal preparation involved hard work like grinding grain, catching fish, plucking chickens, or gathering produce. It even meant hauling jars of water from the communal well. And the next day it was the same all over again. We are fortunate to live in the era that we do. While our daily work may not always seem as exciting as it could be, we are spared much of the drudgery of the past. For us, being a servant is an entirely different dimension. We don't go down to the lake or river in hopes of catching some food for the master. Instead, our servitude is that of being attentive to our neighbor. Our earnings report will shine if we do that!
