Many thanks to those of you who made sandwiches throughout the summer and delivered them to the shelter. We heard about times that they seemed to arrive just when the cupboards were getting pretty bare. Thanks to Valerie St. Jean and her friends that got together every Thursday and made loads of sandwiches. And, the Prayer Shawl Ministry that made many "brown-bag" lunches and reported they had lots of laughs while making them.

Honestly we don't know what to expect this year. We have committed to lots of dates and know that we will be serving at least 80 guests a night at ImmaCare. At this point there is no confirmation about whether and where an emergency No-freeze shelter will open. It seems apparent that Hartford cannot look away from the huge number of homeless who come to the city and live on it's streets. We are also concerned, as we know many of you are, about the homeless women that were recently written about in the Courant. It's a smaller population but one that has very few places to go for shelter and safety particularly during the really cold nights. We are so blessed with many wonderful cooks, bakers, and people who are always willing to give, that we think if a resource is found, we would want to provide food for them also.

In the meantime, here are the dates and we are just hoping that we will hear from many of you; those who have been so kind in the past & those who are new and want to get involved. St. Ann's really does enjoy an outstanding reputation for always bringing food that is not only healthy, but also delicious, and we often take special requests! Also- any breakfast supplies are always appreciated. We always got compliments on those muffins and squares that some of you bake, and cereal boxes are great to take down. As always, toiletries, linens, towels, soap, etc are always needed so just drop off anytime in church kitchen, clearly marked for "ImmaCare".

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments

Life was not always easy with my father when I was growing up. Let's just say he made many decisions along the way that led to fear, anger, and sadness for my family and me. Unfortunately, I was the only one in the family that would years later truly forgive him for his actions. My mother and sister held onto the resentment and anger they felt all their lives. For my father and me, reconciliation led to several years of a deepening relationship before his passing in 2011.

Forgiveness is not easy and I do not consider myself better or stronger because I was able to forgive and my family members could not. However, I can say that the blessings I received due to forgiveness and a renewed relationship with my father were far better than the animosity experienced by others. I also learned that forgiveness benefited me far more than my father.

We can be wise and use it to build bridges, heal wounds, and cultivate love where there is hate. We can also choose to waste time in fear, resentment, and anger. I thank God often for the gift of my dad. However, I thank God more for the gift of time spent with him and the ability to see him not with my human eyes, but with the eyes of Jesus. GOSPEL MEDITATION

"I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to. Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?" The parable Jesus tells today is the story of a king, but in truth it is about Jesus himself. He is the "king" who has forgiven our debts. We are the "servants" whose sins have earned us chastisement. But when we repent and ask for Christ's mercy, he grants it to us without hesitation.

The point of the parable, then, is that we too should extend this mercy to others. We should not be like that "wicked servant" who begged for mercy but would not show it to others. Elsewhere, Jesus teaches us to pray, "Forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors" (Mt. 6:12). We use different words, but a similar meaning when we pray the Our Father asking God to "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." But are we sure that we mean what we say?

It's important to pause and evaluate how we are doing in this regard. Are we harboring any grudges? Are there people we refuse to forgive? Is there a situation where we are seeking revenge instead of extending mercy? Jesus asks us to do otherwise. He reminds us that we have already been forgiven. We are right now enjoying the benefits of his forgiveness. So we are called to bear in mind our own sins, failings, weaknesses, and "debts" when we deal with others instead of thinking that we are perfectly innocent and acting as if we've never been the beneficiary of mercy. So let us do our best to forgive as we have been forgiven. This doesn't mean approving of wrong behavior; God doesn't ask us to do that. But he does ask us to let go of bitterness and foster mercy instead.

INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK Live the Liturgy

Relationships are the focus of our reflection again this week, calling us to practice forgiveness unconditionally. This is a difficult thing for us to do. Forgiving someone does not mean that we necessarily tolerate or condone their behavior. Rather, it has to do with letting go of the anger and the hurt that really is more self-destructive than productive. We are called to recognize the brokenness and sinfulness of each other. We may, at times, have to walk away from an abusive or destructive relationship. However, keeping in mind the lessons it taught, we can free ourselves from its hurtful grasp by learning how to forgive as God for-gives. It's a tall order.
