THE ST. JOSEPH MEDAL OF APPRECIATION 2024




It's That Time of Year Again...

We hear in today's Gospel reading (John 3:14-21) the very famous scriptural quote, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." This is a teaching on the Incarnation. Bishop Barron commented on the Incarnation of Jesus taking on our human flesh, while still retaining his Godhead. (i.e. the mystery of the Hypostatic Union: Jesus is BOTH God and man.} He quotes from St. Thomas Aquinas that "The Incarnation is the purest indication of God's goodness. God moves towards us and He becomes the other with love."

Reflection: The Holy Eucharist is only possible because of the Incarnation. The consecrated Host is the continuation of the Incarnation among us. By giving us His living Prescence in Holy Communion, God moves intimately towards us with profound love. And because it is the nature of love to seek union, Jesus becomes one with us in love in the Holy Eucharist.
