## The Holy Eucharist DID γου ΚΝΟW?

Today St. Paul urges us to "walk by faith and not by sight." (2 Corinthians 5:7) This challenge is especially important when we read in the latest Pew Poll that 70% of Catholics think that the Eucharist is only bread, a symbol, and that it is not the **Living** Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus.

**Reflection:** Faith is a gift from God. It is also one of the three theological virtues. We exercise this virtue when we trust in God. We trust that the interior hunger, which God has placed within us can not be satisfied by the world's allurements of power, wealth and pleasure. We trust as St. Augustine said that "Our hearts are restless until they rest in YOU." (God). Faith tells us that are made for the transcendent; that God makes us for Himself.

#### MISSION BRIEF: THE LITTLE SISTERS OF MARY IMMACULATE OF GULU (LSMIG)

Who we are: The Little Sisters of Mary Immaculate of Gulu (LSMIG) are an indigenous Congregation of Catholic Sisters founded in 1936 in the Archdiocese of Gulu, in Northern Uganda (East Africa).

Our Charism & Mission: the Charism of LSMIG is to share God's lov and kindness to All. Our mission is to witness to the love of Jesus Christ to the poor and most vulnerable members of the society. We the LSMIG live our mission through: Catholic education, health, pastoral and social services in hard-to-reach areas. Our mission stations are in Uganda, Kenya, Italy, germany and the USA.





Our current Ministry: The LSMIG Sisters are uniquely serving a people of northern Uganda who are emerging from a nearly 30 years of devastating civil war while concurrently dealing with influx of refugees from South Sudan and the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC). According the United Nations High Commission for Refugees Report (UNHCR- September 2023) Uganda is a home to 1.56 million refugees and 57% of these are settled in northern Uganda. Among the refugees are children who arrived in Uganda unaccompanied. The little girls in particular

have suffered sexual violence which left them pregnant and they have become child-mothers at 13-15 year of age. The plight of these girls is most devastating in the post COVID period. The United Nation report of 2023 indicated that teenage pregnancy among refugee girls increased by 33%.

Our sisters are responding courageously with limited resources, to the need of these refugee child-mothers and children in the refugee camps through catholic education and catholic youth outreach programs. We have developed a unique Catholic Elementary Education Center with a blend of Vocational training, Daycare and Kindergarten to support education of the child mothers and their babies on the same campus. Our LSMIG Sisters have made this bold move to break the cycle of teenage pregnancy and child motherhood and to give these girls and their babies a second chance in school through an innovative Catholic Education.
