Dear Parishioners:

I'm approaching my second anniversary as your pastor, and I am filled with gratitude for your faithful and generous support of the financial and social efforts and activities of our parish.

Over the last year, we have had some challenges to our buildings and grounds due to the forces of nature or aged buildings. The excessive amount of rain and poor drainage caused a sinkhole behind the church. The area of the sinkhole was excavated and filled in. We are correcting the problem by adding more drainage basins to the front and back parking lot. The Activity Room (lower church) where our young people gather was in poor condition. We installed all new flooring and furniture to make it safe for our young people and catechists. The air conditioning unit and hot water heater for Father Bennett Hall both needed to be replaced. Moreover, all of us have experienced daily living challenges with products and services rising by more than 20%. The parish experiences them as well.

As a community we have met these challenges through your generosity. Our weekly offertory and fall Annual Collection remain our primary source of income. We were doubly blessed with two large bequests totaling \$363, 672. Approximately fifty percent of that total is restricted for Catholic School Scholarships and the remainder is unrestricted. With the sage advice of our Finance Council, we used some of the unrestricted funds to purchase and install the beautiful Carillion Bells that are enjoyed by our parish and the surrounding area.

I humbly thank God for the gift of St. Ann Parish made possible by the hardworking and generous parishioners. God bless your family and your home with gifts of peace, health and happiness.

Grief support group

starting September 26, 2024

Grieving the loss of a loved one is some of the most difficult work a person can experience. Many find it difficult to come to terms with the staggering loss of a spouse or family member and would welcome some gentle, compassionate accompaniment. St. Ann's is expanding the Bereavement Ministry to provide this companionship for parishioners who wish to accept it. In addition to the customary funeral planning help that has always been offered, you'll find at the heart of the ministry the well-known New Day Seminar.

Seminar sessions are focused on different facets of grief, guided by The New Day Journal. A typical meeting begins with prayer, followed by reflection and voluntary sharing. Participants are encouraged to journal (write down one's thoughts relating to a topic discussed) during the session as well as in preparation for subsequent meetings. Journaling has been found to be an excellent tool to elicit thoughts and feelings which give us insights into ourselves. Through journaling we are better able to see where we have been in our grief journey and where we are now. Many other resources will become available as the ministry flourishes.

The New Day Seminar curriculum was developed by the late Sister Maureen O'Brien, O.P. while working with many different grief support groups. It has brought comfort and hope to many as they try to fill the void in their life that has been created as a result of the loss of their loved ones.

If you have suffered the loss of a loved, we hope that you, and perhaps others you feel may also benefit, will consider joining us for the Fall series of The New Day Seminar, which begins on September 26, 2024.
