PRO-LIFE MINISTRY

DID YOU KINOW

All smuggling of children and a significant proportion of sex trafficking, occurs in the context of child migration. Between 80 and 95% of migrants apprehended on the United States - Mexican border

are smuggled. UNODC notes that there are increasing numbers of unaccompanied and separated children among smuggled migrants on some routes, an observation made by International Organization for Migration. Anecdotally, reports of children on smuggling vessels, interacting with smugglers, and suffering death and abuse during smuggling journeys has grown exponentially in recent years.

The United Nations Special Rapporteur on the Human Rights of Migrants (2009 para 23) has stressed that children who are unaccompanied or separated from their parents are particularly vulnerable to to human rights violations and abuses at all stages of migration. Instances and exploitation of children are well documented by Human Rights Watch, UNICEF, and Reach among others." - cited from United Nations Office of Drugs and Crime
