Bishop Guy Desrochers has sent petition cards for all parishioners to sign to support Bill C-230: The Protection of Freedom of Conscience Act, tabled by Kelly Block on February 4, 2022. It amends the criminal code to make it an offence to intimidate or coerce a medical professional to directly or indirectly, participate in MAID (Medical Assistance in Dying). It also makes it an offence to fire or refuse to hire a medical professional if the sole reason is their refusal to take part in the provision of MAID. Bill C-230 protects medical professionals from being forced to participate in euthanasia. Please put the name of your MP of the front of the card, with your name and address on the top left side of the card. You MUST sign the back of the card. The petition cards are placed on the entrance tables of the parishes.

# Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord Sunday, April 17<sup>th,</sup> 2022

Theme for Sunday, April 17<sup>th,</sup> 2022 – Living a New Life. In his first contact with the Gentile world, Peter presents the Christian kerygma, the "good news" of Jesus. He highlights the resurrection to which he personally attests. The gospel gives us the Johannine account of Peter and the beloved disciple reaching the empty tomb, with the latter being the first to come to faith recognition of what had transpired. In both of the alternative second readings, Paul stresses the moral dimension of resurrection faith. In whatever we do, our attention is riveted on the heavenly values which Easter makes manifest to all humanity.
