Terminologies: The Diocesan Action Circle committee would like to familiarize everyone with certain terminologies: **Inuit:** Indigenous people in northern Canada, living mainly in Nunavut, Northwest Territories, northern Quebec, and Labrador. Ontario has a very small Inuit population. Inuit are not covered by the *Indian Act*. The federal government has entered into several major land claim settlements with Inuit. Usage: The word "Inuit" means "the people" in the Inuit language and is used when Inuit are referring to themselves as a culture. "Inuit" is also the plural form of "Inuk." Avoid using the term "Inuit people" or "the Inuit people" as that is redundant; "Inuit" is the preferred form.
