### Pastor's Corner



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, It is my pleasure to announce the appointment of Mrs. LaCosta Potter as Interim Principal of St. Joseph's School for the 2025-2026 academic year. I am always excited to share a "Holy Spirit" moment. When Laurie Johnson expressed interest in returning to the classroom after four years as our

principal, I could see in her face true joy at the thought of embracing again her call to be a teacher. I contacted the diocese for some counsel and support as we near the beginning of the new school year. After just a few conversations with LaCosta and Bishop Andrew Cozzens, the idea of a shared position between St. Joseph's and the Diocese of Crookston emerged. You may recall that Mr. Andrew Hilliker also had a dual role.

Given the timing of Principal Johnson's decision, appointing an interim principal was determined to be the best path forward to ensure continuity and stability. A full search process for a permanent principal will be conducted during the 2025-2026 academic year. LaCosta will begin her role as Interim Principal on August 1 and Mrs. Johnson will serve as Assistant Principal throughout the school year to aid in the transition.

I am grateful for Laurie's ministry as our principal these past four years and am glad she will remain on the faculty as the Fifth-Grade teacher. Her leadership during recent years has been marked by commitment to the mission of St. Joseph's School and to the best interests of the students, faculty, and families. She previously taught at St. Joseph's and is known for her warmth and impactful classroom presence.

LaCosta brings a steady presence and significant experience as the school moves into preparation for accreditation. Her role as the Director of the Office of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of Crookston and her experience as a classroom teacher make her well-suited to guide St. Joseph's in this interim appointment. The interim appointment has been endorsed by Bishop Cozzens given that LaCosta will continue her part-time work for the Diocese of Crookston.

She shared, "I am honored to be called to serve the St. Joseph's School Community as interim principal for the upcoming school year. It is humbling to follow in the footsteps of so many great leaders who have helped shape this remarkable community of faith and learning.

St. Joseph's has been our family's home parish for the past thirteen years. It has been a gift and a privilege to witness my own children receive the sacraments of Baptism, First Reconciliation, and First Eucharist as part of this parish. All three of my children have been blessed to attend St. Joseph's School, with my youngest now beginning third grade.

For the past four years, I have had the privilege of serving as Director of Catholic Schools for the eight campuses across the Diocese of Crookston. In this role, I have been fortunate to witness—and play a small part in—many beautiful stories of evangelization, academic growth, and community building throughout the diocese. I will continue to serve the Bishop in that capacity while supporting all diocesan schools during this interim year with St. Joseph's School.

I look forward to walking with you in faith and partnership as we continue to nurture the hearts, minds, and souls of our students."

School is right around the corner! Please keep our school community in our prayers during this time of transition and enjoy these precious weeks of summer.
