Fiscal Year 2020-2021

We continue to experience the effects of a pandemic, but St. Joseph's parishioners continue to be generous givers in the midst of this crisis. The parish experienced a net decrease in Sunday offering contributions of \$36,312 over the previous year, and was short of budget by \$31,555. The parish bazaar is our biggest fundraising event for the year with a net budget of \$17,000 to assist in supporting our parish ministries. The bazaar exceeded our net budget by \$6,938. Overall, parish revenue was short of budget by \$47,462. Careful use of resources kept parish expenses below budgeted allocations by \$46,610 which allowed us to end with a deficit of only \$852 for the parish.

Several school fund raising projects met or exceeded our fundraising goals, especially Giving Hearts Day, which exceeded our net budget by \$28,143. The Dinner Dance Auction was a virtual event again this year and came in under net budget by \$25,725. The school applied for and received several grants to benefit the school, preschool, and hot lunch programs for a total of \$70,390. Total school revenues exceeded budget by \$24,823 and school expenses were \$14,167 over budget. The school ended with a \$10,656 increase in net assets. The school was blessed by Dee Korbel's estate with a restricted donation of \$613,595 to further the mission of keeping teacher salaries at a level of at least 80% of public school salaries. Her donation will benefit our teachers for years to come.

The overall bottom line for our entire campus is a net increase in assets of \$9,803, which is great news considering the rollercoaster of events the pandemic has brought.

We were able to secure an SBA Payroll Protection Program Loan through our lender Bell Bank in April 2020. We were eligible to have this PPP loan forgiven in the amount equal to what we spent on payroll and utilities during the 8-week period of receiving the loan. This forgivable loan gave us the financial stability to pay the parish and school staff while our Sunday offerings continued to be short of budget. This loan was forgiven in December 2020 and recognized as revenue in this fiscal year.

Thank you to all the parishioners for your faithful stewardship with your weekly and monthly contributions using envelopes or giving electronically. We continue to have strong participation in households registered and donating using Online Giving and we are so grateful! Your ongoing financial support is vital for St. Joseph's so we can continue to operate and carry out ministries and our mission of bringing Christ to our world.

Endowments

St. Joseph's parish community has an endowment fund through Diocese of Crookston Catholic Community Foundation. Within our endowment there are sixteen separate investment categories that support the named entities. Only the interest earned on these investments is used, which means the funds are never depleted. Instead, they offer perpetual support to our parish and school. Gifts to honor someone special, living or deceased, make a great statement about that person's values while impacting generations to come.

Thank you to the donors who continue to generously support St. Joseph's parish and school endowments. We received a return of \$415,665 for the last fiscal year. Endowments help supply muchneeded operating income, as well as revenue for scholarships and the other special purposes listed on the right.

Building Fund

Our building fund debt at Bell Bank is paid off early and we celebrated by burning the mortgage this summer!

We paid off \$596,096 of debt this past year through the generous donations of our parishioners sparked by a generous couple donating \$100,000 and challenging St. Joseph's parishioners to match these funds to reduce our debt. A total of \$113,863 of matching funds were donated, along with a total of \$147,943 donated through your continued weekly and monthly contributions.

We are also very grateful for three parishioners that were a blessing during their lifetimes at our parish and now in their estate gifts to St. Joseph's Parish this past year. Julia Sullivan's estate donated \$47,853, and the remainder of Msgr. Donald Kreb's estate donated \$2,955 to the building fund. You may recall last year we shared he donated the majority of his estate to our building fund (total of \$192,495) and also to create an endowment fund (total of \$384,980) where the dividends and interest benefit our building fund semiannually. Lastly, Dee Korbel's Estate donated \$613,595 to our building fund and \$613,595 to benefit our school teacher's compensation initiative for many years to come. Please say a prayer for Julia Sullivan, Msgr. Krebs and Dee Korbel in thanksgiving for their examples of stewardship. It's also a reminder to all of us that we can make plans with our own estates in which we can give a portion to the church so that the work of evangelization may continue in our community and bless future generations.

Should I still donate to the building fund since our debt is paid off? Yes! Our beautiful campus is in need of continual repair and upkeep. This past year we replaced the parish office roof; replaced carpet and refinished floors; replaced the furnace in the parish office; and replaced appliances and painted in the women's house (House of Anne; formerly owned by the Schnabels). Campus improvements totaled \$79,160. This current fiscal year July 2021 to June 2022 our Finance Council approved \$130,000 of needed campus improvements, and the list continues to grow. Your contributions to the building fund will help pay for these improvements.
