#### Staving Relational

You could say that at a very basic level, human life is about staying true to who you are. I have an appreciation for nature. There would be something wrong with me dropping pop cans along a pleasant walk-through Whitewater. I am a proud American. There would be something wrong with me not standing for the national anthem. I am the son of Ray and Marny Fasnacht. I will not buy flowers for



someone else's mom on Mother's Day before I get some for my mom. I will not take advice about horses or civil war trivia from someone else's father before getting it first from my own dad. I am the Catholic pastor of St. Charles Borromeo and Holy Redeemer. You will never see me supporting a rival school at a track meet, or a baseball or softball game (Hoping to break into the local sports scene this season). It wouldn't just be disloyal to my community for me to root for another team, it would be disloyal to myself. It would be disloyal to who I am. There would be some real lack of integrity in me. I wouldn't be living in a way that is true to who I am. You could say, at a basic level, that human life is about staying true to who you are.

Following that same logic, I suppose that the life of the Christian is all about staying true to who we are in Christ.

A man is just a man, but a Christian is well... a Christian! We were made, it seems, to live truly in regard to all those different aspects of us that help to define who we are. All those different parts of us that make up the truth of our identity. Some aspects of our lives that define us are more important than others. As much as I am a son of Ray Fasnacht and wish to live as a "true son of Ray" and uphold my families' honor:), more than this, I am a son of God, my Father, and how I wish to live truly as his son. Here seems to be the real crux of the Christian life, really what all human life is about, or at least is meant to be about, for all men and women were made to be sons and daughters of God. It is what we are destined for in Christ.

God gives us the strength to remain true. The Devil tempted the One Son in the desert, so he also tempts us. All of his temptations were aimed at getting Jesus to act in a way that would be disloyal to his Father. That would be untrue to himself as his Father's son, and yet Christ triumphed over the Devil. All of the Devils temptations that he levels at us are of the same nature, and yet we too are triumphant in Christ. Christ makes it possible for a woman or a man to live truly. Through his grace he keeps us in the truth, and through his mercy he restores us to the truth. You could say that human life is all about staying true to who we really are. Praise be Jesus Christ, in whom we have the victory. ~Fr Jonathan




Tom Heim Memorial Fish Fry


