My wife and I recently got back from a pilgrimage in Assisi and Rome. Three days we spent in Assisi and five days in Rome.

The first day we arrived in Assisi, white smoke happened to rise out of the chimney of the Sistine Chapel at St Peter's Basilica in Rome. The excitement and grace of the moment was overwhelming. The church bells in Assisi, throughout all of Italy and the entire world, rang. We watched the livestream with the entire world leaning into the St Peter's Basilica to find out just which man would be chosen to be our Holy Father. Unpredicted by anyone, the conclave chose a man from Chicago.

Three days later, I saw him with wife on a sidewalk as he was being driven in a small black car to St Peter's Basilica. He rolled down the window, waved and blessed the group of people on the streets. My heart fluttered with joy, and a thought came to mind: "This is Peter".

Encroaching of every Pope's pontificate, especially in this technologically obsessed age, are poisonous vipers that endlessly seek to defame the Church and lead souls away from the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church. And these vipers are not persons (although may speak through them) but are principalities and powers that seek to promote division and disorder.

We see online commentaries of all sorts from the political right and left. Each camp tries to tote around the Pope as if he were a mascot to parade around trying to justify whichever political agenda they subscribe to.

Our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, is not a rag doll intended to be fought over in a political tug of war of petty agendas. Rather, he is the bishop of Rome, the one who sits in the Chair of Peter, holding the keys of the Church, and is now our spiritual father.

News outlets may think that the 'world' can change the Church, but rather it's the other way around: the Church is the herald of the One who sanctifies the world.

Instead of consuming ourselves in political propaganda, let's immerse ourselves in praying for our Pope daily and learn from him, submitting ourselves to the authority of the unbreaking apostolic mission of the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church.

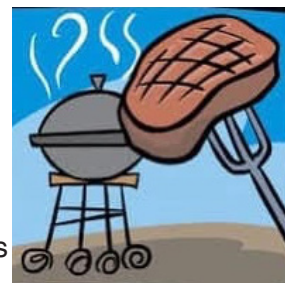
