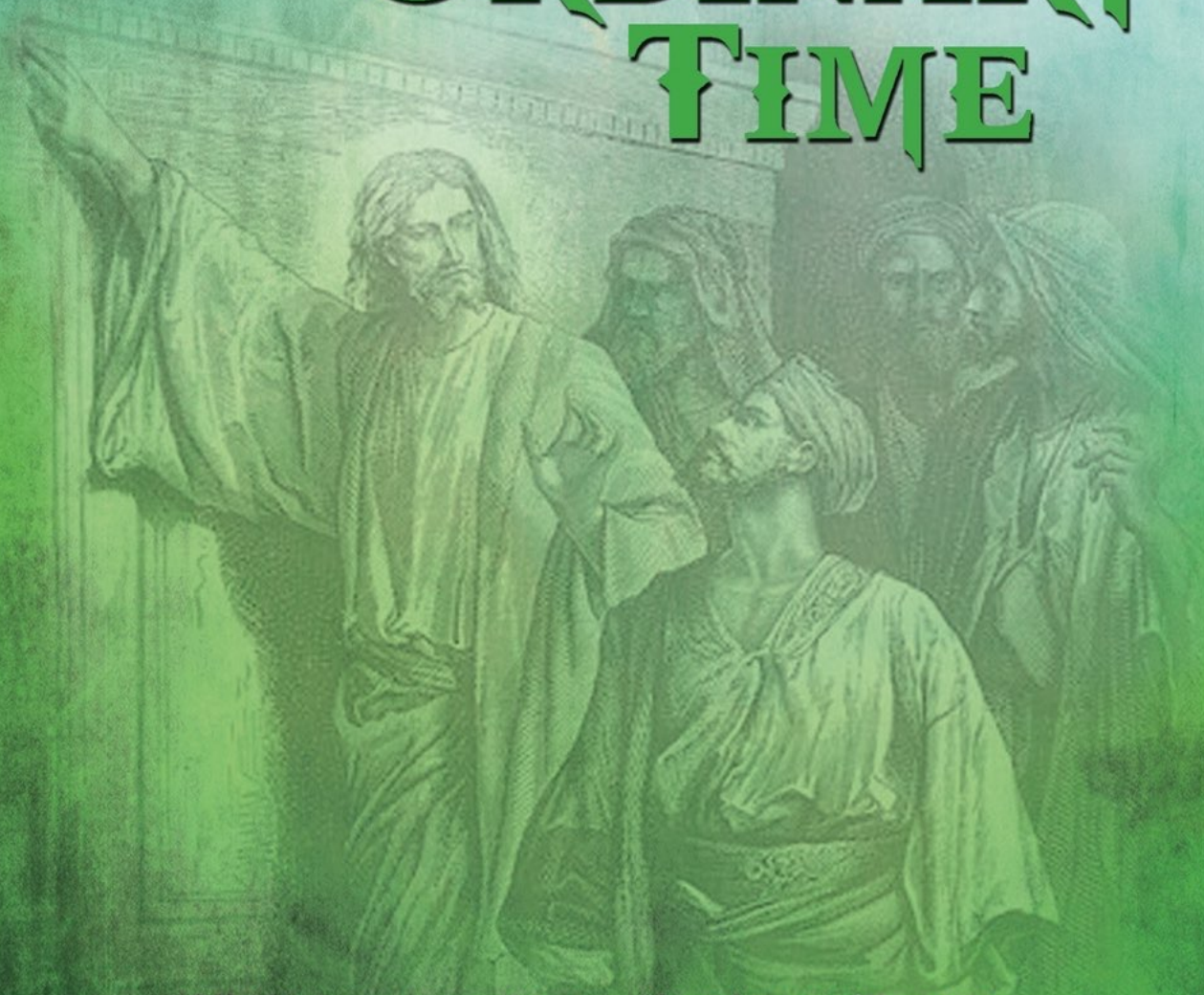

The Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends:

Synod 16 is next weekend! This "Synod" is both an event and a process that sees people, clergy, religious, and laity, gather to discuss important matters of the faith. Synods are transformative events that lead to renewal in the Church's life. After a Synod takes place, the church emerges different, changed.

The focus of this Synod is **evangelization**. The second is, "**DNA**." The Archbishop hopes to transform the very culture of our Archdiocese, how we work, how we pray, how we minister, everything, so that in everything we do, we will be more effective witnesses to our families, our communities and our world!

Truly, what we are attempting is nothing less than a radical overhaul of the Church in Detroit, a complete reversal of our focus from an inward, or maintenance-focused church, to outward, or mission-focused church.

The Archbishop has stated that, "The natural state of the Church is one of growth. We are living in a time of unnatural deterioration of the Church. The decline in sacramental participation and vocations as well as the closing of parishes are unnatural aberrations rooted in an erosion of evangelization. We need to undo some of what we've become as a people of Christ—passive in prioritizing and living our faith, sad about the perceived decline of the importance of Jesus and Church institutions, and accustomed to a malaise rooted in believing there is little that can be done."

Friends, I ask you in joining me and thousands of other members of our Archdiocese to PRAY! Pray for the power of the Holy Spirit to come upon the members of the Synod, our Diocese and our own Parish Community. Please try and pray the following prayer every day this week, and into next weekend:

Synod Prayer

God our Father, you have called us to be witnesses to Jesus and have sent us on a mission to lead all people to encounter him. Send your Holy Spirit to enlighten our minds and enkindle our hearts, so that we may grow daily as your disciples. Empower us to face bravely the challenges of our time. Keep us close to you, together with Jesus your Son, Mary our Mother, and St. Anne our patroness as we engage in Synod 16 to Unleash the Gospel. Transform us into a band of joyful missionary disciples, who will bring the message of Jesus' power and mercy to every person in southeast Michigan. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Over the years, the church's focus on the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick has moved from the understanding of the "last rites" to offering this sacrament to those who are suffering and come asking for God's grace, comfort and strength.

The Sacrament Anointing of the Sick is **not** a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to suffer illness, old age, imminent surgery, the fitting time for them to receive this sacrament has certainly arrived. (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy #73) Remember, this sacrament can be received more than once and it is for anyone who is suffering from a physical, emotional, or psychological illness. The group coming together for the celebration is a sign of the work and care of the community.



Do you know that we as a parish celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick the first Sunday of each month, after the 9:30 a.m. Mass?

Advent Prayer Booklets

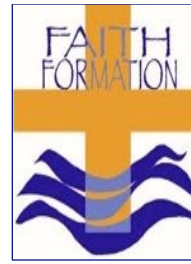

This can mean standing apart from others and for parents reminding their children that they have a different set of values because they follow Jesus. It can become rich ground in which to be bearers of the Good News to others.

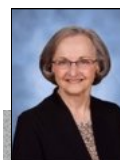
