Around the Table

The 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

There is an old proverb which states, “If you wish to know what a man is, place him in authority.” This proverb, of course, implies that when a person is in a position of authority and responsibility he is also in a position to do either good or harm to others. We all know people, whether in politics, business or in other walks of life, perhaps in some instances people that are very close to us, who were suddenly put into a position of responsibility and the position brought out the best in them. They responded in a manner which contributed greatly, to their own honor and to the good of those who were under them. But, of course, we also know the opposite of this. We all know people who have been in positions of authority where they tragically abused it. They forgot the purpose for which they were put in that position in the first place and they became high-handed and devious, autocratic toward others under them. Fortunately for everyone concerned, they were finally removed from their position or forced to resign, sometimes in terrible disgrace and embarrassment to themselves and to others who were close to them.

In today’s First Reading from the Prophet Isaiah, we have just this example of the abuse of power. The steward of the household whose name was Shebna, apparently exceeded his authority by urging King Hezekiah to revolt against Assyria and call Egypt to his aid. Isaiah was really opposed to this idea because it implied the Israelites’ failure to trust in their own God by calling in pagan help from the outside. So, through the prophet Isaiah God says, **“I will thrust you from your office and pull you down from your station. I will place the key of the House of David on Eliakim’s shoulder; when he opens, no one shall shut when he shuts, no one shall open.”**

In the exercise of his authority, the steward was thwarting the plan of God by calling in outside help in the Israelites’ revolt against Assyria. Anyone who would be disloyal to God’s plan would, of course, need to be deposed, and this is what happened to the steward in today’s Reading. He became so filled with worldly ambition that he failed to see the ultimate end of God’s plan.

Like the steward, we sometimes forget our own eternal interest through our single-minded pursuit of the goods of this world. Often, when we are in a position of authority or responsibility to others, we can seek our security in worldly comforts, goods, goals and aims. In doing this, we fail to realize that there is an ultimate purpose, a purpose to God’s plan, and unless we exercise our position of authority in a responsible way, we too, instead of being an instrument for the furtherance of God’s plan, are an instrument in blocking it. So, like the steward, we would need to be removed.

Whether we are in a position of authority as Christians or not, we have an obligation to others; especially we have the obligation to them of being a good example. By being overzealous for “worldly” things, although not wrong in themselves, we are in danger of misleading others and causing them to place their ultimate faith in these temporary things. In this sense, each of us is subject to abusing authority which we all possess as Disciples of Jesus.

You need to sign-in by writing your name at the podium in the Gathering Space at least 10 minutes before the start of Mass. From there, please enter the sacristy to dress into the alb.

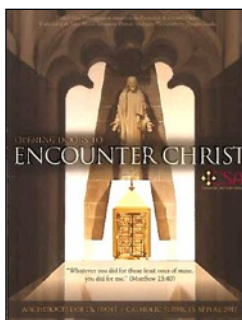

Building the Domestic Church
