### *The 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Dear Friends,

Each year the Archdiocese of Detroit allows a Missionary Institute or Diocese to make a **Mission Appeal** in each of the Parishes of the Archdiocese. Through the efforts of the **Society for the Propagation of the Faith**, one of the four **Pontifical Mission Societies**, seeks to foster an ever-deeper spirit of the universal mission, of informing Catholics of the life and the needs of the Catholic Church in the Missions, and to encourage prayer and financial help for those mission churches.

This year the Archdiocese has appointed the **Salesians of St. John Bosco**, to make their appeal among us, here at Our Lady of Victory. I hope the following information will be helpful to you as you prayerfully reflect on your generosity to them.

The Salesians of St. John Bosco, are comprised of nearly 30,000 Priests, Brothers, Sisters and novices serving in the spirit of their founder, Don Bosco, an Italian Catholic priest who devoted his life to fulfilling the needs of orphans and vulnerable children. Since their beginnings in 1859, the Salesians of Don Bosco have become the second largest order in the Catholic Church.

The Salesians' mission is to try to enable the poor and suffering children in our world, to live better lives and build brighter futures. They operate more than 5,500 schools and youth centers, serving more than 1 million children; more than 80 colleges; more than 90 clinics and hospitals; more than 330 orphanages and shelters; and a wide variety of social and economic development activities. The Institute is regarded as the single largest provider of vocational and technical training in the world. And when disaster strikes, they are among the first on the scene with relief supplies, temporary housing and medical care.

The Salesians have an active presence in more than 130 countries spanning five continents. Their work takes them to some of the most impoverished and dangerous locations on the planet. They serve in big cities with thousands of homeless and runaway children. And they reach out to remote corners of the globe that have been forgotten and neglected by the rest of society. Quite simply, they work where they are needed most.

Next weekend, the weekend of July 14-15, **Father Daniel Libby, SDB** from Sierra Leone will preach at all the weekend Liturgies. Please join with me in welcoming him!

Born and raised in Waterloo, Sierra Leone, Fr. Daniel Libby was fortunate to escape the devastating effects of his country's brutal civil war. Shortly after graduating high school, he and his family fled to safety in Guinea Conakry. Yet, when he ultimately returned to Freetown, and witnessed just how many children's futures had been compromised by violence, poverty and despair—he felt called to help. ***"I met the Salesians in Freetown and that was when I decided to join them,"*** he says.



After completing his philosophy studies in Tanzania, Fr. Daniel completed two years of practical training at Don Bosco Fambul in Freetown, where he served homeless youth in crisis. Following his ordination, on July 20, 2013, he was assigned as a community administrator, chaplain and teacher at Don Bosco Technical High School in Monrovia, Liberia. In 2015, he transferred home, to the Mary, Help of Christians community in Lungi, Sierra Leone. Here, as principal of St. Augustine's Agricultural Junior Secondary School, he helps young men and women realize the opportunities that education can bring.

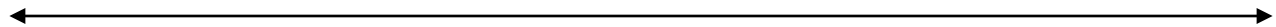
"He was amazed at their lack of faith." MK6:1-6

In today's Gospel, Jesus was amazed to the lack of faith among his own people. Would he feel the same today? It is our faith that transforms us, that heals and renews us. But to have great faith, takes great trust. A trust in believing that God will be walking with you in your joys and in your sorrows. This kind of trust gives way to our own openness and surrender to God's will. Are you willing to surrender, to allow yourself to be vulnerable to receive? Or are you holding on tight to your fears and beliefs that you think are working for you? There is such a freedom and peace in letting go and allowing God to work in your life.

All of us are on our own faith journey, experiencing God in our own special way. As much as it is a personal relationship, it is a communal one, too. We share this each week at Mass, as we come together as individuals and families coming forth as a community of believers. We are all called to bring Christ to each other, through our words, actions, and teachings. For some, it begins at Baptism where we are cleansed of sin and self, becoming a son or daughter of God as part of the body of Christ initiating us into the Church. As parents, they have the first responsibility to educate their children in faith, prayer and virtue. (CCC2252) But they are not called alone, as Church we are called to assist and reinforce those teachings. It is the Church's mission to help the faithful to deepen our relationship with Christ, and enable ongoing conversion to become joyful missionary disciples as Archbishop Vigneron is calling us to be. We are a community invited to respond to God's call to be a visible sign of our deepening faith, sharing and supporting one another on this journey.

I find it intriguing the lack of faith people had in Jesus' time and I suppose hindsight is 20/20. I could only hope that I would have been able to appreciate what was happening before my eyes and realize something special was going on. Which leads me to ask myself, what am I missing now? Is there something I am not seeing? What am I blind to? *Open the eyes of my Heart, Lord*, by Michael W. Smith is one of my favorites. May we all be able to open our eyes to see our Lord.

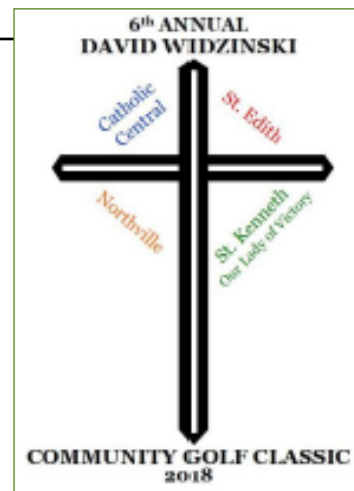

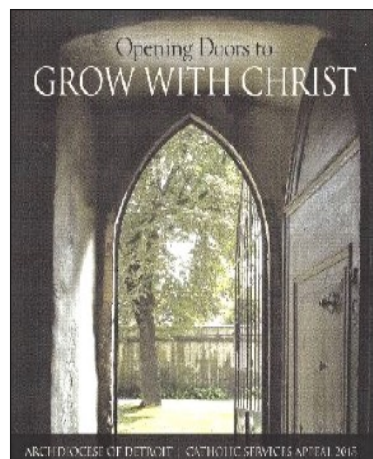
