Around the Table

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Dear Friends,

We all have a certain anxiety about being totally alone. This is most recognizable in a small child. The intense fears of early childhood sometimes seize a child in strange moments; the fear that his or her mother or father will leave them alone, for example. Sometimes this is a fear of dark places. But the dark place is fearful because it also usually symbolizes being left alone. But even in adult life there is a concern about being left, “all alone.” One of the main themes of many popular songs is a concept of togetherness and the opposite, of “being alone.” The assumption in these songs is that if there is just one other person in the universe that cares about me, then I am rescued out of this terrible fear of being alone. We see then that there is something in human nature that resists the notion of aloneness, which seeks and desires the concept of togetherness.

When we transfer this human need and awareness to God, however, we run into what appears to be a kind of contradiction. Logically, we can reason, if we like these kinds of logical reasoning processes, that God has to be one. Somewhat like one might reason in geometry, the logical point is that, if God is in any way two gods, or divided or separated, that the power that divides or separates these two gods, would itself be stronger, more powerful. Otherwise, it could not do this dividing. And so, we would get a god beyond god; a kind of Greek conception, totally one and undivided.

So, that logically, then, one can propose that there could be nothing lacking in God that could produce division. But from a human point of view, this strikes a certain resistance in us, or at least, a certain total lack of shared feeling or comprehension. Because this “aloneness” in God suggests the aloneness we would feel. It is therefore not quite satisfying as an image. We seek and need a concept of togetherness.



The First Reading this weekend from the Book of Proverbs, suggests this idea to togetherness in God. It tells of a person related to God from the very beginning. **“The LORD possessed me, the beginning of his ways, the forerunner of his prodigies of long ago; from of old I was poured forth, at the first, before the earth.”** We do not see a clean delineation of the three persons of the Trinity, as that will come later. In the Gospels, Jesus will reveal his coming as the Son of God to do the will of his Father, and in turn, how he would send us the Paraclete, the Holy Spirit, to guide, direct and inspire us, and so be with the Church. So, we do not have a Trinitarian idea clearly suggested here. But we have something suggested that assuages our human fear and anxiety about loneliness; a sense of togetherness in God. The idea of persons in God begins to emerge here.

It was St. Augustine who compared the persons in the Trinity to our human need of belonging. There is, he reasoned, a need in myself for a person whom I love and who loves me, and then there is the deep relationship this produces. There is here a Trinity; me, the other and the relationship of love. This, St. Augustine proposed, helps us understand God the Father; the Son, who is totally understanding of the Father; and the Holy Spirit, who is perfect love. But their knowing and loving is so complete and intense, it is also perfect unity. We, as humans try to get ever closer to another, ever more together in love and understanding. But we never can reach the perfect “togetherness” of the persons in God.

We realize of course, that none of these explanations resolve the mystery of Godliness. They rather appeal to our human feelings. But this helps us appreciate the Trinity in God in a human way.

So, it is appealing, therefore, that God should have, as the Book of Proverbs in the very human way, suggests, something beyond “isolation” and “loneliness” in our human terms. Obviously, these terms do not in themselves apply to God, but they apply to us as we think of God.

The phrase from the First Reading indicating “companionship” and “togetherness” in God suggests, in human terms, the creative fulfillment of two people together, rich in what they bring one another. One of the deepest and most satisfying human images is that of a rich creative relationship between two people. Obviously, this, and infinitely more, also exists in God. Jesus later explains it much more fully to us.

Born and raised in Detroit by parents that were products of the depression...bargain shopping was the norm. My mother, sister and I would, and still, love to rummage through the sale racks, shelves, and bins to see who can find the best deal. Nine times out of ten it wasn't me.

But when I was searching, the one thing that scared me more than anything when I saw it was the words, "As Is". We all know "As Is" means that there was a flaw, something was wrong with it. It wasn't in perfect condition—material ripped or torn, buttons lost, zippers busted, pieces missing or broken AND it usually is FINAL SALE. For some, it wouldn't frighten them off. They would know exactly what to do to restore it to its original condition. For me, I wouldn't know where to begin or even determine if it would be worth it or not. So the possibility of being out the item and my money is enough to pass it by.

But that isn't how God sees us. He doesn't pass us by. He accepts us "As Is". He knows we are broken, imperfect, lost.....and He still welcomes us. Not only does he welcome us but sends us help. He sends us Jesus. He sends us the Holy Spirit. All He asks is that we come to Him with an open heart. God has already poured His love into our hearts. We have to be open to accept it and feel it. The Holy Spirit provides us with the answers we are longing to hear but we need to be vulnerable enough to allow Him in. We need to come to God in our brokenness, in our vulnerability, with our needs and trust in His compassion and mercy. It is a frightening thought to allow ourselves to be that open. To know that God will meet me where I am, that He has a plan but not to know exactly what He has in-store for me. I say, "Jump in.....jump in and let go!" The plans He has for you is so much more than you can even imagine for yourself. What do you have to lose? Aren't you worth it?

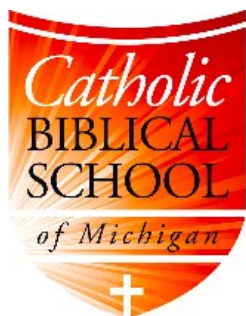

Today, we celebrate **The Most Holy Trinity**. We have been taught that it is a mystery that there are three persons in one God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Yet, we know that they exist, each in their way and yet still as one. We honor each in the hymn “O God Almighty Father” written by American Capuchin monk, Irvin Udulutsch, OFM, Cap. in 1959, which makes it a relatively new hymn text. It was translated from a 15th century German work by Rothensteiner and set to the hymn tune GOTT VATER SEI GEPRIESEN from the Limburg Gesangbuch of 1838. Each verse praises one of the Trinity with their own respective power: God, the Father and Creator, Jesus, the Word of God and Redeemer, and the Holy Spirit who enlightens us with his wisdom.

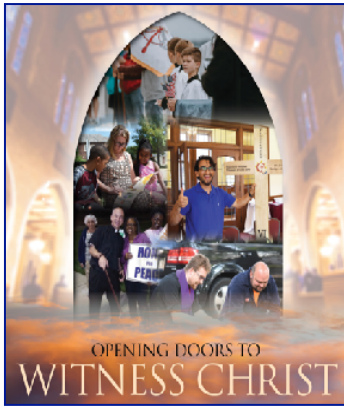
