Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

This weekend, I would like to share a few thoughts about **Eucharistic Adoration**. For the past five years, our School children, mostly from the Junior High, have been coming over from the school to spend quiet time in the Kateri Tekakwitha Chapel in **Eucharistic Adoration**.



Some of you may truly wonder...What is Eucharistic Adoration?

Eucharistic Adoration is an attitude of love, the placing of oneself in the presence of our Lord Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, whether reposed inside the tabernacle, or exposed inside a special stand called a monstrance. Generally, when a parish or organization holds a specific time of “**Adoration**,” they are referring to a time where the Blessed Sacrament is visible in the monstrance for the people to pray before. Adoration allows for a personal encounter with Jesus, who is truly and physically present in a special way.

People come to Eucharistic Adoration with a variety of motives and methods of prayer. Some people come who are suffering in some way, who are experiencing turmoil in their lives and who seek refuge in the love of Jesus.

Others come to give praise and thanksgiving to God for His grace working in their life. Still others come to simply sit or kneel in His presence, to find a moment of peace with God in the midst of a busy life. Some people bring the Bible or a spiritual book to read, others pray the Rosary or the Divine Mercy chaplet, to help them focus their minds and hearts on the mystery of our salvation by Jesus Christ. In Adoration, you are invited to come as you are, no matter where you are on your spiritual journey—Jesus is there to meet you where you are at, and to show you His love and mercy in a new and special way, a way just for you!

As Jesus was incarnate for us in His humanity, so, too is He present before us still, in all the tabernacles of the world, as He promised - “**I am with you always, until the end of the age.**” The “**Real Presence**” of Jesus remains for us so that we may be able to bring the Eucharist to the sick and homebound, but He also is present for us to visit Him throughout the day with our prayers, petitions, and thanksgiving. In the gift of the Eucharist, Jesus is with us in a very special way, a substantial and physical way. As human beings, composed of both body and soul, we find comfort and strength in not only recognizing God's spiritual presence throughout our world, but also in the small white Host, placed before us for our adoration. Such humility He has, as St. Therese exclaimed, to become a “prisoner of love” for us, with His splendor hidden and veiled from us behind the appearance of mere bread. You can pray anywhere, it is true, but the personal relationship with Jesus that grows with time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament is a unique source of encouragement and peace. It is only by drawing closer to Jesus that we can truly draw closer to each other, in our families and in our world. True social justice emerges from love, and all love emerges from God and our acceptance of God's love. Whatever increases our love of God will increase our love of neighbor, and our love for our neighbor will inspire us to come to the aid of our brothers and sisters. For any relationship to grow in love, there must be time spent in the presence of the one we love. As our Creator and our Sustainer, the time spent before the Blessed Sacrament is time spent before the one we love.

Think about joining us for Adoration on Friday mornings, from 9:30a.m. until 11:30 a.m. I will happily add more hours for adoration, if the number of our worshipers grows. If you are interested in trying to help organize and “grow” the hours of Eucharist Adoration, please call the Parish Office and leave your name and phone number.


Next Sunday is **WORLD MISSION SUNDAY!**

People ask at times, "Where does the money collected on Word Mission Sunday go?" This collection, the responsibility of the local office of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, is taken in every parish throughout the world on this day designated by our Holy Father. Then the results of this collection is sent to the National Office of the Society in each of these countries.

Notices are then sent to the local Bishop in each of the 1,200 missionary dioceses throughout the world with the results of this collection and the amount of grants available to him. Then that bishop requests information from the local parishes in these dioceses to determine what their needs are. While this is being done, 9% of the funds are sent to the Catholic Near East Association to aid schools and clinics that are run by Catholic Sisters in the Middle East where the Christian population is so small.

A determined amount is sent to these 1,200 bishops for the administration of their diocese and for the training of their seminarians and future Sisters. When he receives word on what these parish communities need, such as a new church, school, clinic or orphanage, he then requests funds for these projects to the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples in Rome for approval.

When this is completed, funds are sent directly from our country to these missionary dioceses for distribution to those who made these requests. About \$12 million dollars come from the United States. \$500,000 of these funds come from the people of the Archdiocese of Detroit. We have the most successful collection in our country! Thank you to the mission-mindedness of the people here!




OLV Petition Drive: October 12-13 and 19-20

OLV is participating in the Right to Life/Michigan Catholic Conference petition drive to ban dismemberment abortions in the state of Michigan. This ban allows for the exception to save the life of the pregnant woman whose life is endangered by a physical disorder, illness or injury. Generally performed between the 13th and 24th week of gestation, this procedure dismembers the child, while in the womb, before evacuation. Just under 2,000 such abortions were performed in Michigan in 2018.

This petition drive will initiate legislation that has already passed both the Michigan House and Senate, only to be vetoed by the governor. If enough signatures are collected (about 400,000), the measure will once again go before the House and Senate. With a simple majority vote, the legislation will become law, unable to be vetoed by the governor.

Signatures will be collected after all Masses this weekend and next.



Are you a Good Samaritan?

In an effort to assist those with medical needs during Mass, we are asking for 2 **Good Samaritans** to sign up for each Mass, every weekend.

Those who qualify and are interested in volunteering should sign up on the **Ministry Sign-In Sheet** before Mass. Behind the ambo, you will take a red chair cover. **Good Samaritans** are asked to sit in the "horseshoe" area around the altar at the end of a pew. Please inform at least one usher of where you are sitting and return the red chair cover at the end of Mass.

Good Samaritans are those who are willing and able to attend to the needs of someone who may require medical attention during Mass (e.g. attending to someone who has fainted or having chest pain). The goal is to provide swift attention to someone in need while maintaining his or her dignity.

Good Samaritans may be any licensed medical professional with current BLS training including physical therapists, dietician, nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, doctors or other. Please prayerfully consider helping your fellow parishioners.

Once contacted for assistance, **Good Samaritans** should stay with the person in need. Ushers will be responsible for calling 911, getting the AED and/or First Aid Kit and helping to maintain privacy as appropriate. Both the **Good Samaritan** and the usher **MUST** complete an OLV Incident report which can be found in any of the sacristies, Parish Office or included with the AED. Questions? OLV's Becoming Catholic: RCIA 2019-20

What's great about being Catholic? Well...

- ❖ **Tradition!! And traditions!** Traditions (small "t") change. Like the way we do things from one year to the next; family traditions, or language used in liturgy. They are important, but different from Tradition ("T") which carries a deeper sense that is more pervasive and long lasting.
- ❖ An awareness of the **goodness of the world** and all of God's creation: "God looked at everything he had made, and he found it very good." (Genesis 1:31)
- ❖ Being fundamentally **sacramental**; Jesus is the reality, sign and symbol of God's presence in the world and of God's goodness to us. We, as Church within a unique continuity with the first disciples and Apostles, are a People of God collectively pointing to the reality, sign and symbol of Jesus to all we meet.
- ❖ The **Liturgy**: We come together to worship, proclaim and praise in ways that are verbal, physical and relational. Both the altar and the pulpit have a pivotal role in coming together. "The liturgy, "as expressed in the Vatican II *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, "is the summit toward which the activity of the Church is directed; at the same time it is the fountain from which all her power flows." (article 10) We are being invited and challenged, every time we gather for Mass, to realize that God alone sustains us and nourishes us. This occurs at Mass through each other's presence, the Proclamation of the Gospel and coming together for "the Breaking of the Bread."
- ❖ **Eucharist**: Experiencing Jesus (who *is* always present to us and within our community) in an unbelievable way that can fulfill spiritual hunger like no other! It reminds Catholics that God alone is our source of fulfillment and that in communion exists the ultimate acknowledgement that God is our source and everything we need.
- ❖ **Community**: Rugged individualism is not a tradition of the Church. In contrast, an awareness of salvation in and through the Church is what ties us all together.

If you are in an interfaith marriage, or know of a non-Catholic who has curiosities about the faith, or a Catholic who has not, yet, been confirmed, please consider being part of this year's RCIA. Our journey has just gotten started!
