

The Nativity display will be held in the Father Ernie Center on Saturday, December 7, from 3:00-7:00 p.m. and Sunday, December 8, from 8:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m.




Last year a number of people were curious about the history and the "story" of No Room at the Inn, so today I share the "story" with you.

"The idea for No Room at the Inn began about 30 years ago at a Christmas party. Judy Crenshaw and Huw Howells, both avid collectors of Nativity sets, were lamenting that so few people could enjoy the variety and beauty of the depiction of that first Christmas. As they talked, they realized that their collections could be used to benefit those less fortunate, and what more appropriate group than the homeless? Thus, the dreams began, to have a display of Nativity sets, invite the public, and have the proceeds go to the

homeless. Because Jesus himself was homeless that first

Christmas, Huw thought the name "No Room at the Inn" would be appropriate. The dream remained just that- a dream. Each Christmas, Judy, Huw, and Huw's wife, Nora, would invite friends to their homes to enjoy the Nativities, and again remember the dream. As they put their collections away for yet another year, they resolved that "next year" they would make the dream a reality.

Nora talked to Judy, who was still enthusiastic about the project. As Nora and Judy talked to friends, there was great interest, and on August 8, 1993, eight excited





The variety of Nativities extended from very simple, inexpensive ones to those more elaborate and expensive. Some are tiny, others with figures two feet or more tall. They are made out of porcelain, clay, wood, metal, crystal, cloth, even seed pods. They come from a variety of places, such as Mexico, Alaska, Germany, Spain, Italy, and South America. In the 24 years since the first No Room at the Inn display, we have given over

\$435,000 to programs for the homeless in Ventura County. The display continues to inspire and delight those who view it. The Mission Statement of our group defines what we want to achieve: The purpose of No Room at the Inn is to celebrate the true meaning of Christmas by: 1. Focusing on the humble birth of the blessed Baby, Jesus, two thousand years ago. 2. Helping those for whom there is also "No Room at the Inn," the homeless."

Once again, this year, I will share five or six of my favorite Nativities and hope that MANY of you will do the same! Let's celebrate the true meaning of Christmas together and help the poor who come to our door through the St. Vincent de Paul Society Conference here at OLV.


OLV Stitching BusyBodies

- * St. Dominic's Outreach Center: Wrapped toys and queen size blankets for children, sweatshirt/flannel shirts and underwear for adults who need food and clothing assistance in the city of Detroit. Due by December 2.
- * Covenant House: <u>Unwrapped</u> wallets, purses, backpacks, watches, jewelry, mens belts, grooming kits, earbuds, make-up or nail polish sets, robes or gift cards for homeless teenagers residing at Covenant House. **Due by December 2.**
- * First Steps: <u>Unwrapped</u> household paper product items, bath towel sets, twin sheet sets, twin blankets, pillows/ cases, and full size shampoo/conditioner, unscented lotion, shaving cream/razors, deodorant, bar soap, dish or laundry soap to be given to those just leaving an abusive home situation and are living in a transitional apartment. **Due by December 9.**
- * Operation Layette: <u>Unwrapped</u> pacifiers, bottles, diapers, wipes, receiving blankets, bath towels, sleepers, onesies, socks and crib sheets for newborn babies. All items must be unwrapped and are for newborns, so please read the tags for exact size. **Due by December 9.**
- * Civic Concern: \$25 Speedway, BP or Mobil gift cards to be given to our local food pantry for distribution for those in need. Take a yellow car tag off the tree and tape it to the gift card and drop in the church offertory baskets or in the Parish Office. Due by December 9.
- * Gift Card Tree: Many organizations do not have storage space to collect items but can always use gift cards all year long. (Meijer, Kroger, Target or Walmart are most helpful). Take a tag off the tree and attach it to the gift card, or put it in a marked envelope. **Due by December 9.**
- * Deo Gratias Ministries of Detroit: Monetary donations to help them start a cafe and garden. Currently, they have a food pantry. They provide a safe place for disadvantaged people to get support with dignity.
- * OLV Special Needs Ministry: Monetary donations to start up a Special Needs Catechism program and Vacation Bible School. This will enable us to help persons with disabilities get to know, love and serve our Lord.
- * Monastery of the Blessed Sacrament: Monetary donations to assist the nuns who devote their lives to adoration and praise of God, and intercession and supplication for the needs of the whole world.

Is your Child Away at College?





We believe there is life after death, a life different from what we are living now. We also believe we will be raised from the dead to be with God in our human form at the end of the world because Jesus said it and he proved it on Easter morning. God has promised this to us, that we will be resurrected. We speak this belief when we pray the Creed. "Sing With All the Saints in Glory" is a resurrection song not just for Easter when we celebrate the risen Christ, but for us when we finally reach heaven as saints. The text was written by Dr. William Josiah Irons in 1873. Dr. Irons studied at Queens College, Oxford, took Holy Orders and was vicar for a series of several parishes. He wrote about the problems within the church at the time and published them in pamphlets. He also took an interest in hymn writing and has 26 hymns in his authorship that were published in various collections and hymnals. The hymn tune is HYMN OF JOY taken from the 9th Symphony composed by Beethoven in 1824.




Campus Ministry


Doors open at Noon, Bingo begins at 1:00 p.m.


