



Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

Dear Friends,

Today, we celebrate "The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe," formerly referred to as "Christ the King." The Solemnity was established by Pope Pius XI, in 1925, as an antidote to secularism, a way of life which leaves God out of human thinking and living and organizes life as if God did not exist. The feast is intended to proclaim in a striking and effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations.

As we celebrate this great Solemnity, I would like to share with you, the words of one of our Parishioners, who truly has allowed the Lord Jesus to be the "King" of her heart! Like many of our parishioners, she too finds it difficult at times to recollect herself and to pray with the many conversations and activity before and after Mass.

Our Lady of Victory Parish is setup for online giving, a web-based electronic contribution service. We provide this service so that you have the option to manage your contributions to the church from the comfort of your home PC or smartphone. At any time you can change your offerings, update your giving options and keep your account information accurate. This service is safe, secure and convenient for you. The vendor that we partnered with to provide

this service is the same as the one that provides us our offertory envelopes, *Our Sunday Visitor* (OSV). The options to donate are the same as an envelope—weekly offertory and special gifts for holy days and charities but also allows one time donations and monthly or quarterly withdrawals, too. Plus you also have the option to use your credit card!

How do I get started?

- From your home PC or Mac: You can access the Our Lady of Victory's online giving page at: https://www.osvonlinegiving.com/4609. This link is also available at www.olvnorthville.org-just look for the Onine Giving icon. Create an account. Log in and choose the option to Give a New Gift.
- From your Apple or Android product: Download the Online Giving App at either the App Store, Google Play Store, or go to <u>OLGapp.com</u>. You will need OLV's unique ID number = 4609.

If you need help setting up your gifts for the church or are an existing user but have a question, please call our **Online Giving Support Team at Our Sunday Visitor at 800-348-2886** or click the **Contact Us** option at the bottom of the www.osvonlnegiving.com website to email them a question or concern.

Using the online service to donate to the church and other charities replaces the mailing of the offertory envelopes to you every two months. This saves Our Lady of Victory money and helps save the earth's resources. Thank you for your support.

The Stitching Busybodies meet the **First and Third Thursdays** of the month from **9:15 a.m.-noon,** in the St. Anne Room (lower level of the church). If you can sew, crochet or knit a rectangle, we have projects that could use your help. Please come and check us out!

- **UPDATE:** We recently provided several items to local fundraising auctions, including baby items, American Girl Doll Clothes, afghans, travel totes, etc. We have also made several busy mats for Alzheimer patients, and holiday placemats for Seniors. Numerous warming wear items and toiletry kits have been created and collected from your fine handiwork and will be sent to those in the foster care system in Detroit.
- New project/kits are available to support the March of Dimes. They are trying to call attention to the high infant mortality rate in the U.S. As part of this project, we would like to contribute 100 pairs of WHITE baby booties. They can be felted, knit, sewn or crocheted. We will need them back by February 28, 2020. There is a bin of white yarn in our pick up/drop off crate. There are some patterns in the bin as well, but you can use any pattern you like. Pure White yarn only please. No variegated, no offwhite, no beige or colored yarn for this project. Our pick up/drop off wooden crate is located near the stairwell to the Fr. Ernie Center in the corner.
- Our Wish List: Extra Wide Bias Tape (any color) Ziploc Quart, 1 or 2 Gallon bags. Thank you for your generosity, we **no longer** need washcloths or toiletry/cosmetic bags or any preemie hats or clothing. Please contact a nearby hospital or agency for their needs or restrictions.

OLV Advent Giving Trees: Up through December 2

Our trees will have tags from different organizations. In addition, there will be envelopes available for monetary donations for three other organizations. Those envelopes will be on a table in the Gathering Space. Please read the tag labels carefully. Most items need to be returned unwrapped. Only those tags for St. Dominic's Outreach Center need to be returned wrapped.

Remember to attach all tags to the donated items. Suggested Gift Card Amounts:

Green Gift Card tags for Covenant house: \$10-15.

Neon Green Gift Card tags: \$25 Yellow Gas Card tags: \$25

Gift cards or Monetary donations can be dropped off in the black box near the Advent display, turned into the offertory baskets or parish office.

- * St. Dominic's Outreach Center: Wrapped toys and queen size blankets for children, sweatshirt/flannel shirts and underwear for adults who need food and clothing assistance in the city of Detroit. Due by December 2.
- * Covenant House: <u>Unwrapped</u> wallets, purses, backpacks, watches, jewelry, mens belts, grooming kits, earbuds, make-up or nail polish sets, robes or \$10-15 gift cards for homeless teenagers residing at Covenant House. **Due by December 2.**
- * First Steps: New and Unwrapped household paper product items, bath towel sets, twin sheet sets, twin blankets, pillows/cases, and full size shampoo/conditioner, deodorant, bar soap, dish or laundry soap to be given to those just leaving an abusive home situation and are living in a transitional apartment. **Due by December 9.**
- * Operation Layette: <u>Unwrapped</u> Newborn sizes pacifiers, bottles, diapers, wipes, receiving blankets, bath towels, sleepers, onesies, socks and crib sheets. All items must be unwrapped and are for newborns, so please read the tags for the exact size. **Due by December 9.**
- * Civic Concern: \$25 Speedway, BP or Mobil gift cards to be given to our local food pantry for distribution for those in need. Take a yellow car tag off the tree and tape it to the gift card. **Due by December 9.**
- * Gift Card Tree: Many organizations do not have storage space to collect items but can always use \$25 gift cards all year long. (Meijer, Kroger, Target or Walmart are most helpful). Take a tag off the tree and attach it to the gift card, or put it in a marked envelope. **Due by December 9.**
- * Deo Gratias Ministries of Detroit: Monetary donations to help them start a cafe and garden. Currently, they have a food pantry. They provide a safe place for disadvantaged people to get support with dignity.
- * OLV Special Needs Ministry: Monetary donations to start up a Special Needs Catechism program and Vacation Bible School. This will enable us to help persons with disabilities get to know, love and serve our Lord.
- * Monastery of the Blessed Sacrament: Monetary donations to assist the nuns who devote their lives to adoration and praise of God, and intercession and supplication for the needs of the whole world.



As we celebrate the great solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, one would expect the gospel reading to expound on the kingship of Jesus in radiant and glorious terms, but it doesn't. Instead we hear about a king who shows the epitome of love and compassion in his greatest moment of kingship, his death on a cross. The song "Now We Remain" that we will sing today, is an early composition of David Haas when he was a relatively new Music Minister. It was inspired by Paul's letter to the Corinthians, "we carry in our body the death of the Lord." These words were the seed for the beginning of the refrain. Haas explains that we, as Christians, carry and share within us the suffering of Jesus and the journey that leads to eternal life.

Whenever I sing this song, I think of the apostles and the early Christians and how they must have felt after Jesus' death: afraid, alone and in despair. But then reflecting on his words and life, strength, through the Holy Spirit, came to lift them to continue his work.


