



Dear Friends,

Our Lady of Victory is preparing to celebrate the **100th anniversary** of our Parish. In preparation for this big milestone, research and planning is beginning and I hope to create a Heritage Room that will be designed to tell the story of OLV, from the early days when just a small group of faithful Catholics began the process of establishing a Catholic Community in Northville.

The first Mass was celebrated on Dunlap Street, on May 25, 1887 as a Mission, of Our Lady of the Snows Parish, in Milford. The Canonical Parish of OLV was created in 2021-2022! We've come a long way and have so much to celebrate.

And so, we are asking for contributions of photos, stories, and mementos. We are especially interested in older photos, dated circa 1920s, but we want to see anything you have that is related to the parish or school or the surrounding properties that you want to share.

Please don't assume we already have something, or that what you have is nothing special. All photos will be scanned and returned if you don't want to donate your originals. If you have a story to share you can either write it out for us and mail or drop it off to the Parish Office, or we can do it interview style.

In a special way, we are looking for:

#### Property Related Pictures; interior and or exterior:

- Locations where Masses were celebrated in the early days...
- Original Rectory house, and subsequent houses used by the Parish

#### **Original Church Related:**

- Old church construction (circa 1921-1922)
- Demolition of the old church and the construction of the new church 1956-1957
- Interior view of the old church building and the loft/organ area
- Any photos of the old church altar over the years
- Demolition of the old church
- Any interior photos of the old church during occasions such as weddings, First Communions, May Crowning, Masses for parish vocations of priesthood or religious life.

#### **School Related:**

- The first four room school being built in 1952-1953
- The addition of two more classrooms in the 1960's and the additions constructed in the 1980's.

We are interested in anything else you may have or know about that we haven't specifically asked for that can be included to help tell the story of Our Lady of Victory Church and School.

#### Gianna House



## OLV Stitching BusyBodies

The Stitching Busybodies meet the **First and Third Thursdays of the month**, from **9:15 a.m.-Noon** in the St.
Anne Room which is in the lower level of the church. **PLEASE NOTE: For the foreseeable future, we will not be meeting at OLV.** 

If you can sew, crochet or knit a rectangle, we have projects that could use your help. Please come and check us out! We are focusing on baby and toddler items right now. Items can be sewn, knit or crocheted. Please no buttons or loose ties on items. Thank you.

**Update on our Baby Bootie Project**: So far the parish stitchers have made 204 pairs, and we have started attaching them to the backing mesh fabric. Our 30" x 30" square will be joined by more than 200 other groups of crafters squares, to create this huge project for the March of Dimes. When completed, there will be about 23,000 pairs of baby booties, representing the 23,000 infants that die in the US every year, the highest infant mortality rate in the developed countries.

Our pick up/drop off wooden crate is located near the stairwell to the Fr. Ernie Center in the corner.



# What to do if you are sick with coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19)

If you are sick with COVID-19 or suspect you are infected with the virus that causes COVID-19, follow the steps below to help prevent the disease from spreading to people in your home and community.

#### Stay home except to get medical care

You should restrict activities outside your home, except for getting medical care. Do not go to work, school, or public areas. Avoid using public transportation, ride-sharing, or taxis.

## Separate yourself from other people and animals in your home

**People:** As much as possible, you should stay in a specific room and away from other people in your home. Also, you should use a separate bathroom, if available.

**Animals:** Do not handle pets or other animals while sick. See COVID-19 and Animals for more information.

#### Call ahead before visiting your doctor

If you have a medical appointment, call the healthcare provider and tell them that you have or may have COVID-19. This will help the healthcare provider's office take steps to keep other people from getting infected or exposed.

#### Wear a facemask

You should wear a facemask when you are around other people (e.g., sharing a room or vehicle) or pets and before you enter a healthcare provider's office. If you are not able to wear a facemask (for example, because it causes trouble breathing), then people who live with you should not stay in the same room with you, or they should wear a facemask if they enter your room.

#### Cover your coughs and sneezes

Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw used tissues in a lined trash can; immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or clean your hands with an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60-95% alcohol covering all surfaces of your hands and rubbing them together until they feel dry. Soap and water should be used preferentially if hands are visibly dirty.

#### Avoid sharing personal household items

You should not share dishes, drinking glasses, cups, eating utensils, towels, or bedding with other people or pets in your home. After using these items, they should be washed thoroughly with soap and water.



#### Clean your hands often

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, clean your hands with an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol, covering all surfaces of your hands and rubbing them together until they feel dry. Soap and water should be used preferentially if hands are visibly dirty. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.

#### Clean all "high-touch" surfaces every day

High touch surfaces include counters, tabletops, doorknobs, bathroom fixtures, toilets, phones, keyboards, tablets, and bedside tables. Also, clean any surfaces that may have blood, stool, or body fluids on them. Use a household cleaning spray or wipe, according to the label instructions. Labels contain instructions for safe and effective use of the cleaning product including precautions you should take when applying the product, such as wearing gloves and making sure you have good ventilation during use of the product.

#### Monitor your symptoms

Seek prompt medical attention if your illness is worsening (e.g., difficulty breathing). **Before** seeking care, call your healthcare provider and tell them that you have, or are being evaluated for, COVID-19. Put on a facemask before you enter the facility. These steps will help the healthcare provider's office to keep other people in the office or waiting room from getting infected or exposed.

Ask your healthcare provider to call the local or state health department. Persons who are placed under active monitoring or facilitated self-monitoring should follow instructions provided by their local health department or occupational health professionals, as appropriate.

If you have a medical emergency and need to call 911, notify the dispatch personnel that you have, or are being evaluated for COVID-19. If possible, put on a facemask before emergency medical services arrive.

#### Discontinuing home isolation

Patients with confirmed COVID-19 should remain under home isolation precautions until the risk of secondary transmission to others is thought to be low. The decision to discontinue home isolation precautions should be made on a case-by-case basis, in consultation with healthcare providers and state and local health departments.


