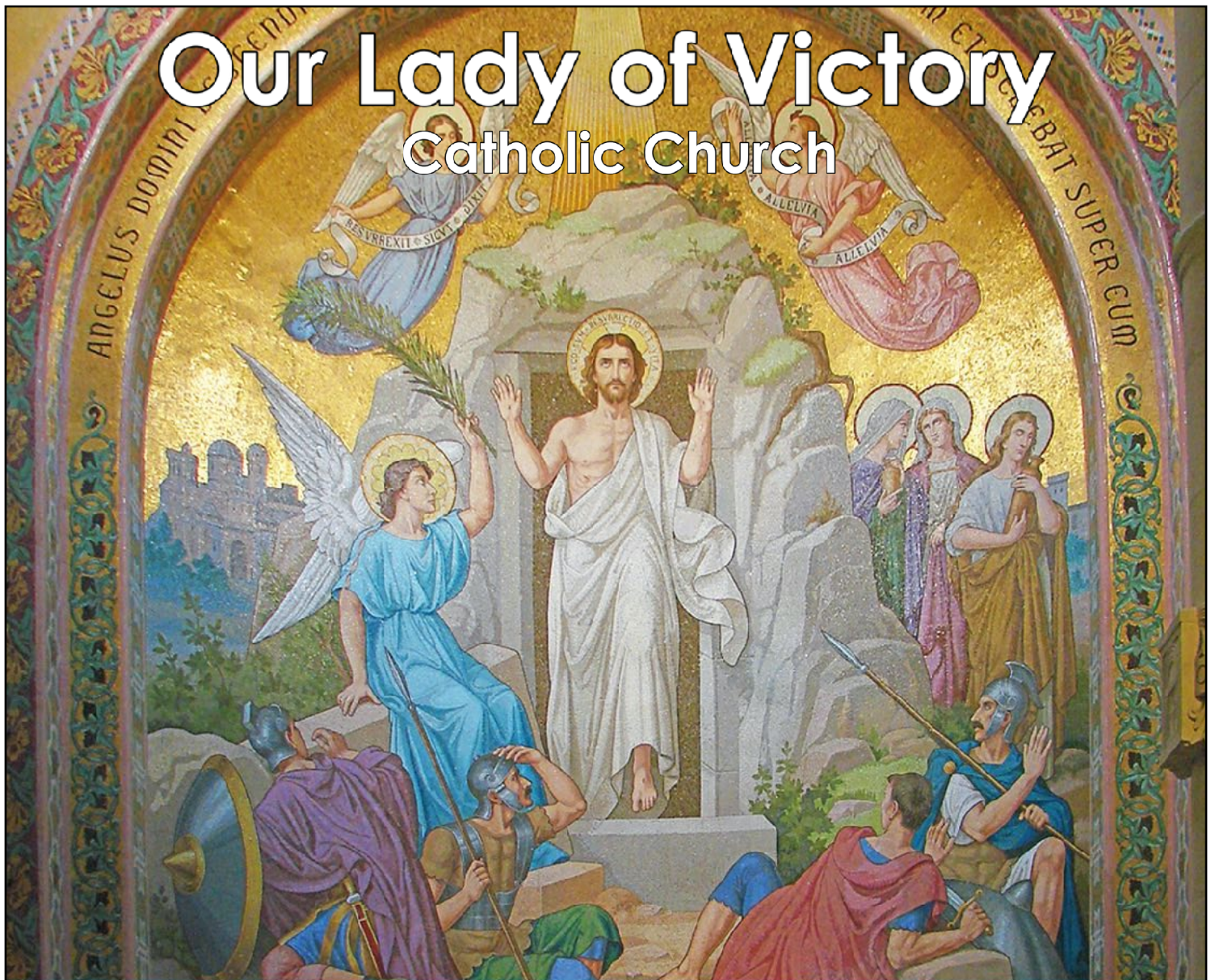

My Dear Friends,

Everyone knows that challenge and hardship can bring out the best in people. With schools closed across the country, many students are responding in innovative ways to show empathy and compassion for others. Our own **OLV Robotics** has been helping the Community with their knowledge and love of Technology!

Recently, the OLV Robotics Team received a donation of a new 3D Printer, compliments of the **Stratasys Company**.

With coordination done by the McLoughlin family, this printer is already in use to help medical staff through the creation of face shield frames when none were available to purchase otherwise.

3D Printing uses rolls of plastic that are then melted and deposited into the shape requested. While the machine was originally intended to create pieces for robot builds, it has been temporarily repurposed to generate frames that hold clear plastic sheets that can be worn as a face shield. The McLoughlin family coordinated the original donation through Stratasys, and is now in small quantity production of the shields which are being distributed to medical personnel. The first batch is in use at a lab outside Ann Arbor that works on Cancer screening. **The OLV Robotics team is proud to share their technology skills with those that need it!**



Recently, while reading an article in Psychology Today, "**Youth Respond with Kindness During the Pandemic**," author, Marilyn Price-Mitchell Ph.D., writes extensively about youth and the impact of challenge and crisis. A line in her article struck me as being so true, that "*When parents and educators understand how empathy is psychologically channeled into compassionate action, children benefit.*"

A wonderful nonprofit designed specifically to empower children, Design for Change USA helps children learn empathy in ways their brains are designed to learn, through relational experiences.

Simply put, relational experiences involve deep emotional connections and involve multiple ways of interacting. Often, relational experiences are life-changing—touching children in ways they remember for many years to come.

Conversely, transactional experiences achieve short-term results and require little emotion. While both types of experiences are part of teaching and learning, empathy can only be taught through the practice and power of relational experiences.

The Design for Change framework was first developed and launched in India by award-winning educator Kiran Bir Sethi. Partnering with experts from the Stanford Design School and IDEO, she launched a movement that helps children experience empathy in new ways. Using the FIDS framework (feel, imagine, do, share), more than 2 million young people in 65 countries are not only practicing empathy, but turning empathy into action.

In response to the COVID-19 crisis, Design for Change USA, recently launched another wonderful resource **#DoGoodFromHome** Challenge. It is a model for how kids can experience a simplified version of FIDS right from home. Whether responding to COVID-19 or to other needs in a child's family or community, kids can not only make a difference, but they can internalize and learn from their acts of kindness.

OLV Public Masses to begin May 29

This week, Archbishop Allen Vigneron gave permission for a gradual reopening of our churches for the celebration of Mass.

Our Lady of Victory has made the decision to open our doors to the public in compliance with Governor Whitmer's safe shelter order expiring on May 28. For the safety and health of our parishioners, we will resume the celebration of **weekend Masses on May 30-31. The weekend Mass schedule will remain the same: Saturday at 5:00 p.m., Sunday at 7:30, 9:30, and 11:30 a.m.** Weekday Masses will now be on **Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at 8:30 a.m. starting on May 29. The Monday, 7:00 p.m. Mass will resume at a later date.**

Although this is exciting news, the process to once again celebrate Mass with a public gathering is more complicated given the new restrictions surrounding COVID-19. The pandemic is not over and safety precautions must be followed in order to promote the continued health and safety of everyone in our community. Please note some of the changes that you will experience during Mass:

- **Limited seating.** There will be a sign up link for each Mass for you to reserve your seat.
- **Social Distance:** Households may sit together but will be distanced (by 6 feet) to surrounding parishioners.
- **Masks:** All Parishioners must wear masks during the entire Mass. It may be moved to consume communion.
- No Holy Water
- No Sign of Peace
- No Precious Blood
- Offertory will be collected in a basket found in the Gathering Space entrance.
- No Hymnals.
- Cry room will be closed. Main bathrooms will be available.
- At this time, the Parish Office will remain closed and Parish Activities will remain canceled.

In the Archbishop's mandate, he announced that the **dispensation** from the Sunday obligation to celebrate Mass is granted to all the faithful of the Archdiocese through **Sunday, September 6, 2020**. Also, those older than 65 years old, with a compromised health condition or caring for the sick in any way, should be encouraged to stay home. Anyone who is ill, has a temperature, cough, etc. should definitely stay home as an act of justice to the whole community.

PLYMOUTH SALVATION ARMY

At this time, the annual Post Office Food Drive, has been postponed, and no new date has been scheduled. For the past 10 plus years, we have relied on this food donation to sustain our food pantry through September and early fall. Without a new date in place, we are actively looking at how to replace this food. Last year's food drive from the Canton and Plymouth Post Offices was over 39,000 pounds of food!

Our community has been very generous with dropping off food and monetary donations through this pandemic. These donations are what is keeping our food pantry stocked and allowing us to provide food for our neighbors.

Wish List: jelly, peanut butter, oatmeal, cereal (small boxes), pancake mix and syrup, canned tuna/chicken, instant potatoes, stuffing, pasta side dishes, rice, Hamburger Helper, soup, mac & cheese, Manwich sauce, canned spaghetti/ravioli, spaghetti sauce, canned vegetables/fruit, apple sauce, crackers, jello/pudding, juice, hamburger, lunch meat, hotdogs/buns, eggs, milk and cheese.

Donations can be brought around to the back pantry door, which is under the overhang in the corner near the windows (just look for the garage door and then immediately left). There is a doorbell that you can ring to let our social service staff know that you have a donation to drop off. Our building is open Monday-Friday from 8:30 a.m.-12 noon and 1-4:30 p.m. to accept your donation. Thank you!

CATHOLICS LOVE THEIR SACRAMENTS!

As Catholics, we call ourselves a “sacramental people.” We are “hooked” on sacraments; expressions of life and faith, sacred realities, that establish something deeper and more meaningful in our lives. Indeed, our religious experience is sacramental. We talk about sacraments as being signs and symbols. Signs and symbols that point to something that is a reality beyond themselves and within this reality things come to be. They are, as theologian Joseph Martos says, “Doors to the Sacred.”

Our sacraments are “Doors to the Sacred” that we celebrate with distinct rituals each expressing a profound moment of God’s Grace in our lives. Each is a significant moment in our lives when we are in touch with the sacred realities that lie at the heart of faith and that move us to what lies beyond.

In our Roman Catholic tradition, we celebrate 7 Sacraments or ritual actions in which we believe that grace, each in its way, is experienced:

- Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation
- Sacraments of Healing: Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick
- Sacraments of Service: Matrimony, Holy Orders

How Does OLV Celebrate the Sacraments?

Each week, we will highlight a Sacrament that we celebrate here at Our Lady of Victory. Of course it all starts with **BAPTISM**. Here at OLV, we typically celebrate baptisms on the 3rd & 4th Sundays of the month, following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Fr. Denis, Deacon Fred and Deacon Ric take turns in the schedule. We ask families to attend a baptism prep session prior to the baptism and these are facilitated by either Deacon Fred or Deacon Ric. “Belonging” is a gift that comes with baptism and we talk a lot about belonging. Most importantly, we talk about belonging in the relationships of our families and especially our faith family.

We also talk about expectations. Not only a parent’s expectation of their child but their expectations of the faith community. What is it that you expect from the OLV faith community? What brought you to our family and how can we each serve, nourish and lead each other into a deeper and more personal relationship with Jesus and the Church?

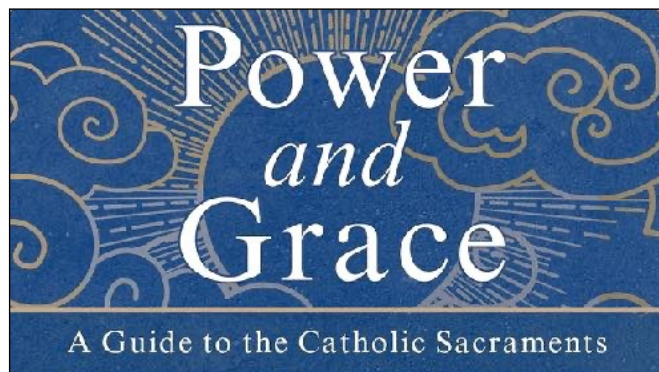
We encourage families to introduce themselves to each other and share a bit about their family. We encourage parents to make new friends through this experience. Chances are they will be meeting up again for years as their children grow up here. In this way, when we come together around the font on the day of baptism we are not strangers but truly a faith family coming together.

In the gospel today, Jesus tells the disciples how much he loves them and his love is alive in them. They must continue to show that love by following his commandments. The disciples actually saw and heard the voice of Jesus. We hear him in our hearts and in the little voice that pops into our heads when we need him. David Haas wrote "We Have Been Told" in 1981 and it was his first composition that was published as a choir piece. He had just left the seminary and took his first position as a Director of Music and as a Youth Minister of a parish in Iowa. It was at this parish that he met Sr. Rita Connell, SM who inspired the writing of this song from their many discussions about theology and spirituality. Sr. Rita was preparing to celebrate her 5th anniversary of taking her vows and David wanted to do something special for her. It was created in 15 minutes and Sr. Rita loved it, of course, and told David that the scripture passage he based the text on was the same gospel that was read at the ceremony of her first vows. For them it was a "God Moment." David's song reminds us that God loves us, it is alive in us and we are his love to the world.

The outbreak of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) may be stressful for people. Fear and anxiety about a disease can be overwhelming and cause strong emotions in adults and children. **Coping with stress will make you, the people you care about, and your community stronger.**

Stress during an infectious disease outbreak can include:

- Fear and worry about your own health and the health of your loved ones
- Changes in sleep or eating patterns
- Difficulty sleeping or concentrating
- Worsening of chronic health problems
- Worsening of mental health conditions
- Increased use of alcohol, tobacco, or other drugs

Everyone reacts differently to stressful situations

How you respond to the outbreak can depend on your background, the things that make you different from other people, and the community you live in.

People who may respond more strongly to the stress of a crisis include:

- Older people and people with chronic diseases who are at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19
- Children and teens
- People who are helping with the response to COVID-19, like doctors, other health care providers, and first responders
- People who have mental health conditions including problems with substance use

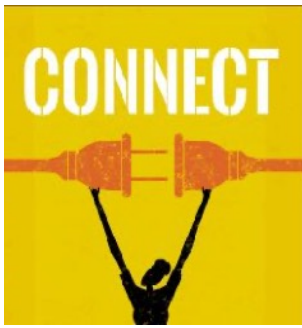

“Christ is Alive! He Has Risen!!!”

Pope Francis’ Letter to Young People, “Christ is Alive!” “Christus Vivat”

Getting Closer in the series! This is point 6 of 9 titled **“Young People With Roots”**



Chapter six actually serves as a warning... it directly asks young people to be wary of the “false cult of youth”; a generation of young people without roots that ground them and are easily manipulated. Pope Francis talks about the importance of both family and the elderly. How their wisdom and influence is key to developing those roots. He acknowledges that young people will not always agree with older generations but that there is great treasure in a common sharing of wisdom. “If we journey together, young and old, we can be firmly rooted in the present, and from here, revisit the past and look to the future.” (CV 199). The brief chapter finishes up by highlighting that together we can renew each other. “Roots are not anchors chaining us to past times and preventing us from facing the present and creating something new. Instead they are a fixing point from which we can grow and meet new challenges.” (CV 200).

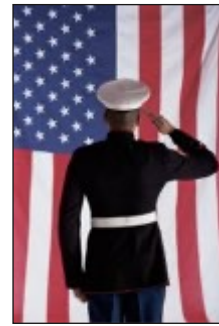

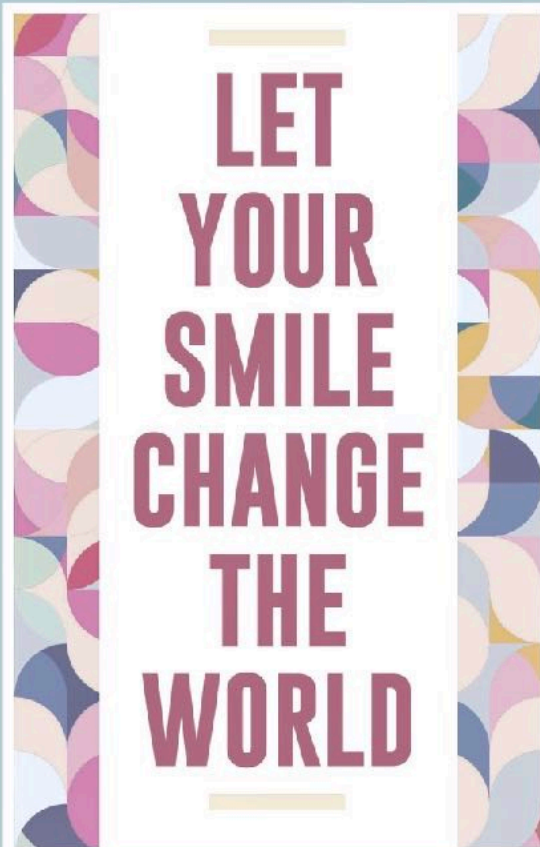
