



Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

On Pentecost Sunday, the majority of you should have received either an email or a text from the Archbishop announcing the newest re-structuring of the Archdiocese called **Families of Parishes.**

As I am sure many of you found this surprising, let me tell you, the majority of the priests of the Archdiocese were VERY SHOCKED and surprised, too! We heard about it on a videoconference with the Archbishop about one week earlier! So, as people have emailed me and asked me questions about all of this... truly, I have no other information than you. At the end of the month, on Tuesday, June 30, another videoconference is planned for all of the priests with the Archbishop. So, if you haven't heard, or didn't read the email that was sent out, this is what I know about Families of Parishes, and I share with you the Archbishop's words:

"Synod 16 called for a complete renewal of structures of our parishes to make them radically mission oriented. Our goal is to make our parishes places where individuals and families can encounter Jesus anew, grow as disciples, and be equipped to be witnesses to the Risen Christ. The current health and economic crises have accelerated the process of renewing the way our parishes are organized and structured. It is clear we need a new model for continuing on mission.

Over the next two years, all parishes of the Archdiocese of Detroit will join other parishes in new groupings called "Families of Parishes." **Families of Parishes are groups of parishes, generally three to six, sharing resources to advance the mission**. This new model will allow the priests, deacons, and lay staff associated with each parish to better share their gifts and talents with the whole Family of Parishes.

While the move to Families of Parishes has been deemed necessary and appropriate by Archbishop Vigneron, the specifics about how best to achieve this directive have not been decided. A proposal has been drafted based on an initial assessment of our own circumstances, combined with what has been learned from other dioceses who have made similar structural changes. A phase of discernment and planning will take place from Pentecost through Advent of 2020, involving members of the presbyterate and laity committed to developing structures that serve our needs and advance our mission.

This is a significant change of the way our parishes are currently structured, but a necessary step in our missionary transformation. Just like the early Church and the missionary activity of the early apostles, the transition to this new structure will require docility to the Holy Spirit, a spirit of collaboration and innovation, and confidence in God who continues to lead us in our mission to unleash the Gospel in southeast Michigan.

Before the pandemic, the local and universal Church were already facing significant challenges, including the shortage of priests to care for parish communities. The coronavirus pandemic and its associated health and economic crises accelerated these problems.

We now have fewer resources to keep our mission active. Archbishop Vigneron, in consultation with clergy and lay advisors, has determined that now is the time to act.

Our mission to unleash the Gospel hasn't changed, but how we approach that mission must shift in response to our circumstances.

We must move forward with greater collaboration and better stewardship of our resources. With this shift, we take inspiration from the early Church. From the beginning, Christ knew the mission he gave his disciples would be difficult and that they would face many challenges, so he sent them to preach the Gospel two-by-two (Mk 6:6-7 and Luke 10:1). Like us, the early disciples knew what was asked of them but not necessarily how to accomplish it or what the end result would be. St. Paul himself was shipwrecked three times (2 Cor 11:25) but wherever he ended, he remained committed to the same mission with which we are entrusted today. Because of St. Paul's commitment and the commitment of the early apostles, the Gospel was heard across the world.

Our Plan to Reopen the Parish Office

MESSAGE FROM FR. DENIS AND JULIE LUPO

Our whole world has changed. It is difficult to recollect everything we have been through these past three months. We hope that the live-streaming of Masses and daily reflections have helped you feel connected to your parish community. We will continue to livestream both the Masses and Reflections for the foreseeable future.

We are very grateful that we have been able to welcome you back to public Masses and happy to see everyone that has been here these past weeks. We look forward to seeing more of you as time goes on.

With the church open for Masses, the next step is to prepare to reopen the Parish Office. We want you to feel comfortable when you visit. We have been working on a plan that follows CDC recommended guidelines that allows us to create an environment that is safe for both you and our staff. Our planned date to reopen is **Tuesday, July 7**. You will notice various changes in the way the office looks, as well as a few new practices. Here are the things that have been put into place starting July 7:

Parish Office:

- Office hours have been changed for the time being. The <u>new hours are 8:30 a.m.-2 p.m., Monday through Thursday</u>. The office will remain closed on Fridays.
- Please allow us to continue to help you over the phone and through email as much as possible.
- If you would like to come in, please call (248) 349-2621 prior to your arrival to ensure that someone is available to assist you. This will also allow us to be prepared to take care of you when you arrive.
- Entry to the office will be through the Parish Office main doors only. The church doors will remain locked during the day. If you come for Mass first, please exit the Gathering Space and go outside and around to the office doors to enter.
- Chairs have been added to the main hall for you to sit when needed.
- Please wear a mask when coming to the office. Staff will also wear masks.
- The front office has a new half door—rather than have you enter the office, please allow Janet or Kim to assist you at the door. A bell has been installed should they have stepped away momentarily.
- We prefer that <u>no one enter the interior offices</u> at this time. We will be happy to help you retrieve mail or make copies while you wait in the main hall.
- Please deliver any food, clothing, baby items, etc., that you would like to donate <u>directly to the organizations</u>. We are not able to accept these types of donations at the office at this time.

Church/Gathering Space:

• Although the Parish Office will reopen, the church will remain closed throughout the day. The Kateri Chapel will continue to be open 24 hours/day, seven days/week for private prayer.

Meeting Rooms:

• Until we can offer meeting space safely to groups, our meeting rooms will remain closed. Watch our website or wait for Ellen O'Neil to contact you for the time when you can schedule a room again.

Evangelization Library:

• The library will remain closed. We plan to reopen some time this fall.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we navigate down this ever-changing road. We will be sure to communicate any necessary adjustments as the reopening date gets closer. We look forward to welcoming you back to the office soon!

At this time, the annual Post Office Food Drive, has been postponed, and no new date has been scheduled. For the past 10 plus years, we have relied on this food donation to sustain our food pantry through September and early fall. Without a new date in place, we are actively looking at how to replace this food. Last year's food drive from the Canton and Plymouth Post Offices was over 39,000 pounds of food!

Our community has been very generous with dropping off food and monetary donations through this pandemic. These donations are what is keeping our food pantry stocked and allowing us to provide food for our neighbors.

Wish List: jelly, peanut butter, oatmeal, cereal (small boxes), pancake mix and syrup, canned tuna/chicken, instant potatoes, stuffing, pasta side dishes, rice, Hamburger Helper, soup, mac & cheese, Manwich sauce, canned spaghetti/ravioli, spaghetti sauce, canned vegetables/fruit, apple sauce, crackers, jello/pudding, juice, hamburger, lunch meat, hotdogs/buns, eggs, milk and cheese.

Donations can be brought around to the back pantry door, which is under the overhang in the corner near the windows (just look for the garage door and then immediately left). There is a doorbell that you can ring to let our social service staff know that you have a donation to drop off. Our building is open Monday-Friday from 8:30 a.m.-12 noon and 1-4:30 p.m. to accept your donation. Thank you!

While the church is closed, we are unable to accept donations at this time.

In today's Gospel (Matthew 10:37-42), you will hear Jesus tell us: "Whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple—Amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward."

The heart of the paschal mystery is dying and rising. Our daily living can sometimes seem to have more dying than rising. The simple demands of our lives pull it out of us: feeding the infant in the middle of the night, ferrying the kids to soccer, helping with homework when we are dog tired, cleaning the house & preparing meals, taking time to share a good thing with a spouse, calling & visiting an aging parent, helping the suffering and the poor. One of the great encouragements of today's gospel is that all this behavior—like giving "a cup of cold water"—may seem small to us, but to God they are actions that correspond to those of Christ. The message is that our generosity is far surpassed by God's generosity. (Living Liturgy, p.188)

My early memories of my faith journey take me back to St. Robert Bellarmine in Redford Township. My family moved there when I was starting grade school, so my brother, sister and I grew up attending Catholic school. Please <u>read all guidelines (found online)</u> prior to attending Mass for the first time. Below is a highlight of the changes that you will experience during Mass:

- Limited seating. A reservation link for weekend Masses will go live before each Monday morning. Please visit www.olvnorthville.org to reserve your seat(s) for Mass. If you do not have access to a computer/smart phone, please call the Parish Office and leave a message that includes: the names of those who you will attend Mass with you, your name and your phone number. Starting July 1, you will no longer need to reserve your seat(s) for any daily Mass.
- Church doors will open 20 minutes prior to Mass for staff to check you in and guide you to your seats.
- Social Distance: Households may sit together but will be distanced (by 6 feet) to surrounding parishioners.
- Masks: All Parishioners must wear a mask. Your mask may be moved to consume communion.
- If you have an Offering, it can be deposited in a bin found in the Gathering Space entrance.
- The Cry rooms and Meeting rooms will be closed. The Main bathroom is available—please only 1 person at a time.

We understand that everyone is anxious to get back to normal and public Mass is one of those events that is "normal" to us! However, if you are **sick**, **have a fever or cough**, **have underlying health conditions**, or if you have been exposed to someone who is sick (anyone in an "at-risk" category, or uncomfortable in a group setting), please **remain home** and continue to enjoy our live stream offerings.

Archbishop Vigneron has granted **dispensation** from the Sunday obligation to celebrate Mass to all the faithful of the Archdiocese through **Sunday, September 6, 2020**. The **Saturday, 5:00 p.m. Mass will continue to be live streamed** and recorded to both our website and Facebook page for an indefinite period of time.


