



Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

If you read Matthew's account leading up to our text for this weekend, you can understand why, Jesus, after all, had spent a very long day curing the sick; they had all been involved in feeding a multitude of people with nothing more than loaves and fishes; and even now, there was the matter of getting this crowd over 5,000-plus to disperse. Additionally, Jesus had been looking for a way to withdraw, so that he could be alone to pray; so it just sort of *followed* that he would send his disciples on ahead to cross the Sea of Galilee.

For the disciples, however, it was a strange and uncertain experience! They had not really spent all that much time apart from Jesus since they had begun to follow him, and they were unsure as to exactly where they were supposed to go, or what they were to do when they got there; and, by the way, what if Jesus didn't catch up with them; what if he "missed the boat," so to speak... what then? If that weren't enough, now it is well into the night, the wind's picking up and "the boat, battered by the waves, was far from land, for the wind was against them." So now here we have all these disciples crowded together in a flimsy little boat; trembling and fearful for their lives and no doubt crying out, "OK, Jesus... you sent us out here... what do we do now?"

Can you imagine the scene? It is the early hours of the morning, still very dark, and the wind is whistling; the rain is coming down in sheets, and water is swelling up the side of the boat and washing inside. Even though most of them are fishermen (maybe *because* most of them are fishermen and know what kind of mortal danger the sea brings forth), they are... terrified, and moreover, wondering why Jesus would ever send them on a night like this!

But that is when it happens: something unexpected; something miraculous. The disciples look out beyond their boat into the raging storm and they see him! They see Jesus—walking toward them on the sea; walking on water! Of course, their first response is to cry out in fear, if what they are seeing is a ghost. But no... it is Jesus, who immediately speaks to them, saying "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid."

It is unexpected because by now the disciples are sure their lives are done; and it is a miracle because everyone knows you can not walk on water! But here is Jesus, doing just that; walking on water beyond all human ability and overcoming the utter chaos of deep, turbulent waters, all to let these fearful and panic-stricken followers of his know that "it is well," and that the seas, while stormy now, would soon be calm for the journey ahead. That, in and of itself is a powerful word; and it is no wonder that at the end of all the disciples, "exhausted by the storm and overwhelmed by what they have witnessed... make the first profession of faith in Matthew's gospel: 'You are the Son of God.'"



This is a story that serves to remind us that in all of life's chaos and confusion, we can take heart because we are never alone; but in the presence of one who can and *does* calm our fears and promises. As the song goes, we will be "safe and secure from all alarms." And that is important to know, because life is *filled* with storms; the kind of chaos that threatens to undo us: disasters, natural and otherwise, descend; jobs disappear; relationships disintegrate; we lose touch with people, values and practices; death rips us apart. It is times like these when you and I need to know that we have the Lord at our side to help us weather the storm.

That is what happens here in the gospel... but that is not the end of the story. What also happens is that Peterbold, impetuous, Peter—sees Jesus walking on the water and calls out, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." What does Jesus do? He calls back to Peter, perhaps with a bit of a smile on his face, "Come!" And Peter – God bless him, with the storm still raging all around them, gets out of the boat! He doesn't get very far, mind you, before fear takes over and he loses heart, sinking like a stone, that is, until Jesus reaches out and grabs Peter by the tunic and brings him to safety.

You see, the journey may not always be easy, but once yo have moved forward and the way ahead is clear; once you have caught sight of your destination and know the reason that you were so bold, won't you be glad that you decided not to stay in the boat?

"Come." That is how Jesus is calling you and me; that is how Jesus calls us all. So how will you respond? I hope that we will all give that some thought and prayer in the days to come...

CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING: "THE DIGNITY OF WORK & THE RIGHTS OF WORKERS"

Catholic Social Teaching points out the economy must serve people, not the other way around and that work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continuing participation in God's creation. It doesn't matter where one may fall on the scale of a given field, job, or career, or what one may do within the scope of the area in which they work. All of our jobs are valuable pieces of a puzzle that in the end, should help the human family to flourish. And we need to realize that the fruits of our labor, whatever it may be, should be directed toward the common good. It's like a successful sports team, when every team member does their job the best they can and with the team's success as their goal—the team will do well.

Respecting and protecting the dignity of work helps us to get to that goal. Our faith tradition teaches us that in addition to respecting basic rights for workers there is the right to productive work, to decent and fair wages, to the organization and joining of unions, to private property, and to economic initiative. In the above quote Jesus asks us "just who was neighbor?" Are we up to answering the question?

It would be wonderful if greed, egos, thirst for power and control didn't exist.

But they do and have since, well, since the beginning.

Our challenge as Catholics is to always keep Jesus as our guide and our heart. Jesus never fails us.

Please read all guidelines (found online) prior to attending Mass for the first time. Below is a highlight of the changes that you will experience during Mass:

- Limited seating. A reservation link for weekend Masses will go live before each Monday morning. Please visit www.olvnorthville.org to reserve your seat(s) for Mass. The Reservation Link closes at 4 p.m. each Friday. If you do not have access to a computer/smart phone, please call the Parish Office and leave a message that includes: the names of those who you will attend Mass with you, your name and your phone number.
- Church doors will open 20 minutes prior to Mass for staff to check you in and guide you to your seats.
- Social Distance: Households may sit together but will be distanced (by 6 feet) to surrounding parishioners.
- Masks: All Parishioners must wear a mask. Your mask may be moved to consume communion.
- If you have an Offering, it can be deposited in a bin found in the Gathering Space entrance.

We understand that everyone is anxious to get back to normal and public Mass is one of those events that is "normal" to us! However, if you are **sick**, **have a fever or cough**, **have underlying health conditions**, or if you have been exposed to someone who is sick (anyone in an "at-risk" category, or uncomfortable in a group setting), please **remain home** and continue to enjoy our live stream offerings.

Archbishop Vigneron has granted **dispensation** from the Sunday obligation to celebrate Mass to all the faithful of the Archdiocese through **Sunday, September 6, 2020**. The **Saturday, 5:00 p.m. Mass will continue to be live streamed** and recorded to both our website and Facebook page for an indefinite period of time.


