

Dear Friends,

On September 2, at our first School Mass this year, I had the shock of my life when our school Principal, Mrs. Kate Szuba came to the Ambo with our Associate Principal, Mrs. Emily Wesley to announce that a decision had been made last winter to name our new "Media Center" after me!

I was truly, made speechless and to those of you who know me well... know well that doesn't just happen! I asked Mrs. Szuba if she would put down on paper how all of this transpired. The following is what Mrs. Szuba has shared:

"We want to take a quick trip back in time, a pre-COVID time...

We knew at the beginning of last year that we wanted to add a bigger preschool, grow the program, and help to bring in more families. The decision to move the library to the lower level of the school, in the meeting room called "Victory Hall" had taken shape.

As we progressed through the beginning of 2020, we had the new preschool pretty well settled and we had the new media center ideas ready to go. With the support of the PTO to fund the new Media Center we knew we could make this happen.

We had hope of a great auction, a time of fun and fellowship, and an opportunity to come together to raise some money and see our dream fulfilled of a new Media Center, a place for all of the students of OLV to be able to experience learning and exploring in a new way in a new, great room.

Well Covid happened, no auction. Never in our wildest dreams did we think the PTO would be able to continue to see our dream to fruition. They were all in, fully committed! A wall was put in, furniture purchased, bookshelves refitted, walls painted, decorations put up, technology purchased. Everything we were hoping for, the PTO was still able to give us!



We had a surprise planned the night of the auction. We were struck with an idea, what do we call this new room? It can't be called the old Victory Hall and the preschool can't be called the old library. We needed to give it a proper new name, one that would fit the space and honor someone who helped us see this from start to finish.

We decided to name the room the Theroux Media Center! Because without the support of Fr. Denis this never would have happened. We are honored to name this room after our beloved Pastor.

While we didn't get to have the big reveal at the auction, we were still able to surprise Fr. Denis with his new sign!"

I am and will be forever grateful for all of the kindness and care our School family has bestowed upon me over the years.



Just as in Jesus' time, today there are different spheres of rule and our loyalties are not either/or ... Christian living is being comfortable in all spheres, all having their just due, without compromising God's sovereignty. When God is truly the center of our lives there is no problem giving others their due. Conversely, giving others their due doesn't necessarily compromise God as the center of our lives. Jesus shows that single-mindedness about God is even better expressed when we clearly know God's place and everyone else's place. (Living Liturgy, p.256)

Please read all guidelines (found online) prior to attending Mass for the first time. Below is a highlight of the changes that you will experience during Mass:

- Limited seating. Based on the layout of the church, our seating capacity is around 120 per Mass.
- Church doors will open 20 minutes prior to Mass.
- Social Distance: Households may sit together but will be distanced (by 6 feet) to surrounding parishioners.
- Masks: All Parishioners must wear a mask. Your mask may be moved to consume communion.
- If you have an Offering, it can be deposited in a bin found in the Gathering Space entrance.

We understand that everyone is anxious to get back to normal and public Mass is one of those events that is "normal" to us! However, if you are sick, have a fever or cough, have underlying health conditions, or if you have been exposed to someone who is sick (anyone in an "at-risk" category, or uncomfortable in a group setting), please remain home and continue to enjoy our live stream offerings.

Archbishop Vigneron has granted dispensation from the Sunday obligation to celebrate Mass to all the faithful of the Archdiocese through Monday, November 23, 2020. The Saturday, 5:00 p.m. Mass will continue to be live streamed and recorded to both our website and Facebook page for an indefinite period of time.


