

AROUND THE TABLE

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

It is often said that Jesus' "Good News" turned the world upside down. Conceivably most remarkable and shocking was when he presented his disciples with a child to learn from and imitate as a model. In the ancient world, a child had low status within the family and community. Exactly how this gesture and the words of Jesus challenged accepted values is not easy to express. For someone outside the family to "welcome" a child was to set aside their own self-importance and adult status. Although children were loved, they were regarded as nobodies without rights.

In today's Gospel, the disciples were arguing over who among them was the greatest. Jesus responded: "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all." For him the most insignificant are the greatest. He puts his arm around a little child, and identifies to those who have gathered around him that the child is a model of "foundational" humility. He must have loved children, indignantly rebuking the disciples who wanted to send them away because the grown-ups were busy with serious, important concerns: "Let the children come to me; do not hinder them."

What did Jesus see in these children? He saw what his reign-of-God-family was all about: "For it is too such as these that the Kingdom of God belongs." Jesus loved children because they were vulnerable, nobodies or overlooked and they were open and sincere, not hypocritical. They were trusting in an amazingly spontaneous way. Jesus drew his strength and confidence from his childlike trust in God. I believe this to be the core of his own spirituality.

Dominican Father, Albert Nolan in *Jesus Today: A Spirituality of Radical Freedom*, writes: "Those who treat Jesus as central to their spirituality tend to make him the object of their spirituality rather than a person who had a spirituality of his own from which we might be able to learn something." Jesus's spirituality was "behind what he said and did, what fired and inspired him".

I think that Jesus recognized in children the total, unquestioning trust he had in God. In this sense he was exceptionally childlike—which may not be our usual image of him. We tend to give Jesus exalted titles and refer to him in prayers, images, hymns as an all-powerful king of kings and a mighty Savior. But seeing the "child" in Jesus is neither demeaning nor suggesting he was weak, naïve or immature.

Remember that there is a great difference between being childlike and being childish. The qualities of "childlikeness" are deeply human and of permanent value, such as humility, sincerity, trust, freedom from care, a sense of joy, wonder and playfulness. In contrast, childishness is to hold on to those temporary qualities of childhood which are immature or stem from inexperience or ignorance.

We can hold onto an immature image of God and childish trust believing that God is like Santa Claus who will manipulate the world if we "ask him nicely". This is not the childlike trust that Jesus had in God. Jesus's trust enabled him to work fearlessly in unity with "the least of the least".

So, this week, allow yourselves to once again live with a childlike trust in God and discover the power of Jesus living in you.

MERCY IN ACTION DAY


Day of Service Saturday, October 16

Catechetical Sunday is September 19

Catechetical Sunday is observed in the Church on the third Sunday in September and is a celebration of catechists and all teachers of the Catholic faith. Each year it has a theme. The theme for the Archdiocese of Detroit this year is "*Disciples of Jesus: Witnesses to the Gospel*." The rite of blessing of catechists used on Catechetical Sunday includes a blessing of parents and guardians.

Parents, especially during this period we are in, are truly the primary catechists of their children! On Catechetical Sunday, we highlight the work of catechists in parishes and schools, and all of the community with encouragement and a reminder of this awesome invitation from our Lord to share the message of the Gospel into generations to come. This year, in a special way, we highlight parents along with the men and woman who have always been willing to come forward and share their faith.



The Church term, "Domestic Church" refers to our homes and is where the faith is lived, understood and embraced the most. It is in the home where the seeds of faith are best sown and nurtured. That is why parents are referred to as the "Primary Catechist" for their children. Catechetical Sunday is a day to bring focus on the role each person and family has, by virtue of Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. But it is also a day that we set aside to thank all of our Catechists for coming forward.

Since 1833, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul has been servicing those in need.

In today's Gospel (Mark 9:30-37) Jesus called the Twelve, and said to them, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." Taking a child, he placed it in their midst, and putting his arms around it, he said to them, "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."

Jesus uses the model of a little child to illustrate his point. Children are innocent and without pretensions, they embody what "least of all" means. This also illustrates the extent the disciple is to become the "servant of all" by receiving even the "least of all." The total self-emptying that enables one to receive the "least of all" describes the disciple. This is how we receive Jesus—by receiving the least. (Living Liturgy, p.212)
