Rev. Denis B. Theroux, Pastor Fourth Sunday of Advent



Dear Friends,

The Gospel reading for this Fourth Sunday of Advent narrates "how the birth of Jesus came about." As we know, Mary was engaged to Joseph. However, before they lived together, Mary found that she was with child "through the power of the Holy Spirit." (Now, how many people would believe that outlandish tale?) Joseph was a good man; yet these circumstances were far beyond believable. Nothing like this had ever happened before. Thus, Joseph finally decided to quietly divorce Mary. He did not want to shame her in their community.



However, in a dream an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph. The angel said to him: "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife. This child was conceived by the Holy Spirit. She will have a son and you are to name him Jesus; He will save his people from their sins". These words were spoken to fulfill what God had said through the prophet: "The virgin shall be with child and give birth to a son, and they shall call Him Emmanuel, (a name which means "God is with us").

Matthew does not say how Joseph initially responded to the angel's words. However, when Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had directed him and he took Mary into his home. He was a loving husband and father. Joseph truly was a man of God! He trusted God. Let us pray to have the faith and trust in God as Joseph did. What a wonderful example he is for us when life gets

turned upside down. When this happens let us pray to Joseph!

Christmas is next Sunday!!!—Can't believe it.

Before continuing with "Christmas Happiness and Christmas Joy" just remember,

Jesus IS the Reason for the Season.

It's all about Him!

Don't let anyone or any influence take that gift!

Back to Christmas Happiness and Christmas Joy...Both are great, but as Christians it's good to know there is a difference. St. Paul writes in Galatians 5:22-23, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such there is no law." There it is. One clear difference between joy and happiness. Joy is a fruit of the Spirit. Happiness is not. But what does that mean for us?

Happy Truth is, you can make yourself feel happy. In many ways,

happiness depends on you. Taking a nap will make you feel happy for a bit...Finishing a big project usually makes you happy. It'll make you feel happy when your favorite team wins the big game. Getting that certain gift at Christmas will make you happy. You can, in a certain sense, make yourself feel happy.

But **joy**, on the other hand, is entirely different. Joy doesn't come from you. Joy isn't a feeling. It's not a fleeting pleasure or jolt of high emotion the way happiness is. Joy is

a fruit of the Holy Spirit. When the Holy Spirit is active in your life, you feel joy, as well as peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, self-control, and all the other fruits of the Holy Spirit. To experience joy, you need the Holy Spirit. Bring on the Spirit!
