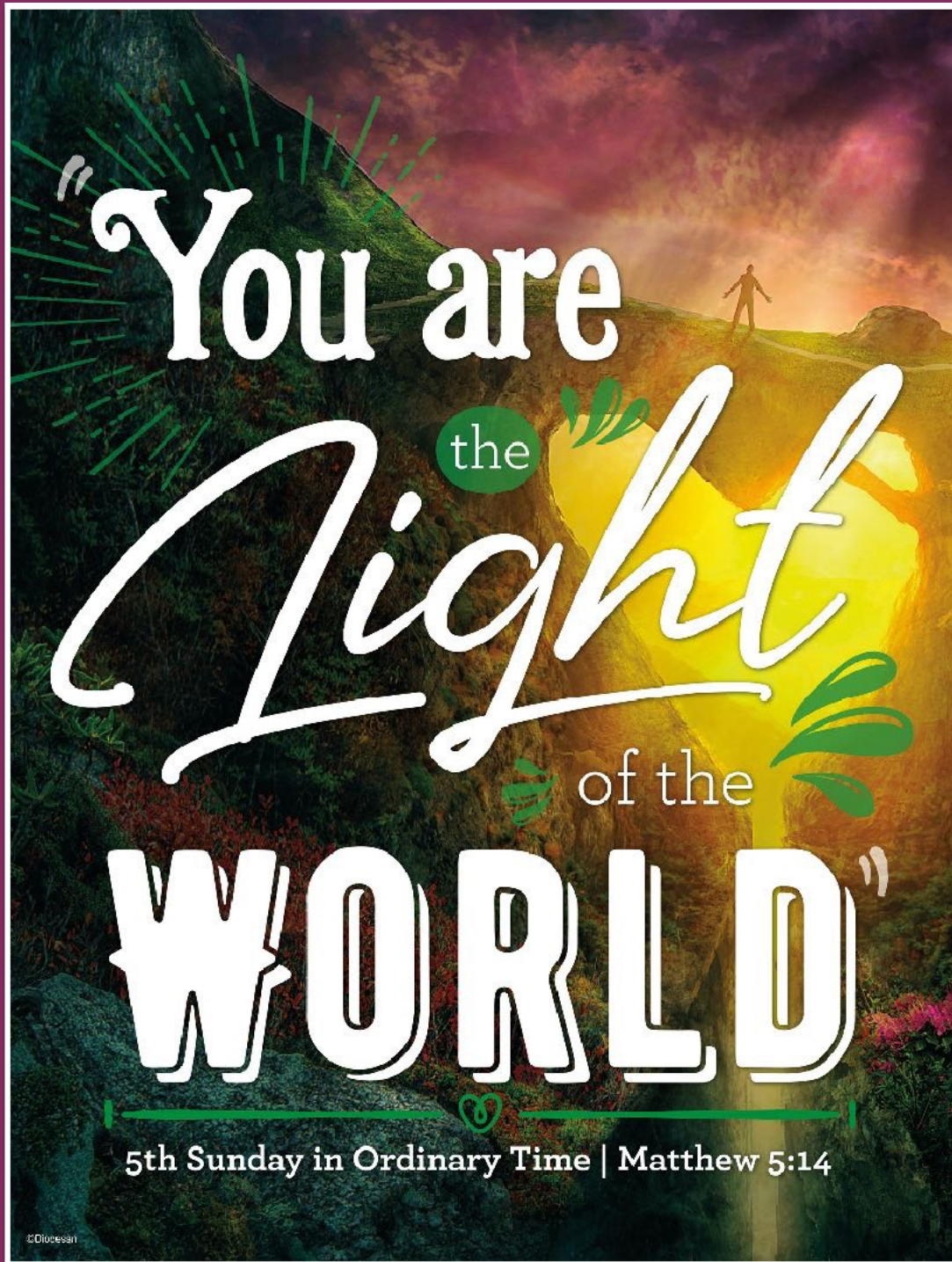

The Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear friends,

Today Jesus coins a phrase that we continue to use today. He tells his disciples: **"You are the salt of the earth."** What does that phrase mean to you? What characteristics would you use to describe a person that you consider to be **"the salt of the earth?"** Down to earth? Practical? Sensible? Caring? Most likely all of us are "salt of the earth" in a variety of ways. However, Jesus also says that if we lose our "saltiness," we also lose our tastiness and then we are not good for anything! Is that what we desire?

Jesus also tells his disciples (and us): **"You are the light of the world."** This is a powerful and yet, perhaps an intimidating statement. Light is essential in many ways. Plants cannot grow without light. Light enables us to see more clearly. If we do not have light, we stumble and struggle through life. And if we take Jesus' words seriously, we need to share our light with everyone we encounter.



I have to ask myself, and I challenge you to ask yourself: "Do I truly consider myself the "light of the world?" If we answer yes, how do we share your light? What acts do we do that bring light to other people? What are the gifts of light that we share with others: a smile, a kind act, noticing someone who needs some help or encouragement, reaching out to someone who is lonely, sitting with a friend who is ill or simply sharing a flower or fresh tomato from your garden? These are small acts but they are filled with light.

Now, let's shift the focus. What are the areas of our life where our light may be dim or perhaps, even extinguished? What is the cause of the loss of light? Do you sense any glimmer of light beginning to shine in this area of your life? How do you experience God in this situation?

Our **light** is not our creation. God chose to make us creatures of "light." Our light is not ours; it is a share of God's light. Nor is our light to be hoarded. Our light has been given to us to share with our family, friends, the strangers we meet, and our world. Today may each of us consciously and generously let our light shine. After all, our light comes from God, thus it truly is God's light that is shining through us.

Our world is in desperate need of light. There is a tremendous amount of darkness, pain, tragedy, loneliness and sadness in our world. Today and every day, the world needs your light and my light! Together we can light up the world with God's light and love.

2023 Concert Series

Our Concert Series continues on **Sunday, February 26, at 7 p.m.** with a very special and rare performance! Join us for an evening of harpsichord music by Bach, Boismortier, Carter, and Couperin.

Dr. William Jean Randall will be playing a 2018 Franco Flemish Double (two keyboards) Harpsichord built by Knight Vernon, renowned harpsichord maker of North Branch, Michigan. Following the concert, you will have an opportunity to see the instrument up close.

Dr. Randall began his career as a church musician at the age of 14, playing the organ as a substitute at various churches on the east-side of Detroit. After earning a bachelor's degree in Vocal Music Education and Organ Performance at Wayne State University, he began a 14-year ministry at First United Methodist Church in St. Clair Shores. In 1995, he entered the graduate program in Sacred Music at the University of Michigan and, at the same time, became the Associate Minister of Music at First Presbyterian Church in Royal Oak. In 1997, he moved to Utica United Methodist Church as Director of Music and Worship Arts. He earned his Doctorate in Sacred Music in the spring of 2000

This means that participant registration forms & deposits need to be turned in enough time ahead of that date here at OLV so we can send it all to the AOD. The Parish Registration Deadline Date is May 1, 2023. Balance due would be needed by June 5, 2023. A minimum number of Parish participants need to sign up for OLV to attend. Chaperones may be needed based upon the number of participants that register.
