First Sunday of Lent



Dear friends,

As we enter this Lenten Season, some of you might be asking the same question that I have been asking myself of late, “**What will make Lent different for me this year?**” And so, in my preparation to enter the season, I searched online for some suggestions. I was amazed to discover all of the websites offering suggestions! Some of the thoughts and suggestions are certainly familiar but a few offered a new perspective on somethings I tried in the past. I’m offering 15 of my favorite findings to you here today. Together let’s enter into the Season with **HOPE in our HEARTS!**

1. Make a commitment to read the **Sunday Scriptures before you go to Mass**. In the same way that reading up on football players, opposing teams, and coaching strategies will help you experience a game more fully, familiarizing yourself with the readings ahead of time will help you experience them in a deeper way on Sunday.
2. Try a new spiritual practice. **Spend an hour in Eucharistic Adoration**. **Attend daily Mass**, or at least a few days a week. Spend a **half hour in silent meditation prayer** at home or here at church once or twice a week.
3. Think about how you usually spend your money. Do you buy too many clothes? Spend too much on dinner out? **Pick one type of expenditure that you’ll “fast” from during Lent, and then give the money you would usually spend to a local charity.**
4. Take something on—**40 days of letter writing, 40 acts of kindness, 40 phone calls to the important people in your life.**
5. When you first sit down in front of your computer at work, or at the very end of your work day, try a **10-minute guided prayer from Sacred Space** based on the spiritual exercises of St. Ignatius.
6. If you don’t have a **cross in your apartment or house**, buy a simple one and put it in your bedroom.
7. Read the entire **Gospel of St. Matthew** in one sitting. As the shortest Gospel, it is the most concise story of Jesus’ life, and the cross, a central Lenten symbol, plays an even more prominent role than in the other Gospels.
8. Attend the **Stations of the Cross**, on Friday evenings at 6:30 p.m. Or check out **Busted Halo’s Virtual Stations of the Cross**.
9. **Unplug from your iPhone or turn off your car radio** on your commute. The silence may be jarring at first, but you may find that you are able to concentrate better and will be more observant of your surroundings.
10. Think about a habit that has kept you from being whom God is calling you to be. **Consciously give up that habit for Lent this year.**
11. Spend at least one **weekend or evening volunteering** during Lent. Serve a meal at a local soup kitchen. Visit the elderly. Stock shelves at a food pantry.
12. Make a commitment to **fast from insensitive, cruel comments about others**. So, no gossiping or posting unnecessary comments on social media.
13. **Pray for somebody**. As you’re walking the streets, driving the highways, or sitting in your cubicle at work, pick out a person who appears to be in need and pray for that person. Be mindful of the words of philosopher Philo of Alexandria, who said, “**Be kind, for everyone you meet is fighting a great battle.**”
14. Read the **Works of Mercy** as Jesus describes them in Matthew 25:31-46. Then put this teaching into practice and choose an act of service you can perform throughout Lent.
15. Celebrate the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**. Can’t remember how? Tell the priest it’s been a while, and ask him to guide you through it.

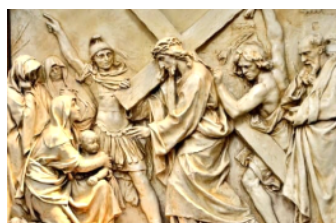
