Fourth Sunday of Lent



Dear Friends,

Apparently, even randomly, while Jesus is going out of the Temple, he sees a beggar, a man blind from birth; and the disciples, seemingly without compassion ask, “**Rabbi, who sinned?**”

The Jewish people, like many people, connected suffering, sickness and misfortune with sin. Moreover, the First Testament taught that the penalty and the consequences of the sins of parents could be even transmitted to their children.

Under the New Covenant, Jesus’s covenant of love, while God no longer punishes us for our parents’ mistakes, all of us lives in a way that we may still bear the consequences for their sinful, unwise or faulty habits and behaviors. The Holy Spirit, however, is available and willing to make us whole and free us from unhealthy patterns of thinking, feeling, relating and living.

Where a child has lived in a particularly dysfunctional or unhappy home, this process of healing may take longer than desired. However, if we seek God’s healing, and respond and cooperate with the work and power of the Holy Spirit, healing happens. And the work of God may be displayed through that person.

This healing power is available to us through Jesus, our Savior, whom we celebrated at His birth just a few months ago! The word “Savior” has a broader meaning than just someone who rescues us from sin; it also means **HEALER**. Jesus wants us to be made whole physically, emotionally and spiritually, to experience his gift of “shalom,” or peace!



And as the disciples suggest... “How can a baby be born blind because of his own sin?” In Jesus’ day, some Jews had borrowed the idea of a pre-existence of souls from Greek philosophy, especially from Plato. They believed that all souls existed before the creation of the world and were waiting for bodies to become available to inhabit. Some of these Jews believed that the soul could be good or bad. Others believed that if the pregnant mother sinned, the unborn child was an accomplice.

Even though the disciples ask Jesus, “**who sinned?**”, Jesus instead remarks that it was not because of this man’s sins nor his parents that this man was born blind, but so that “the work of God might be displayed in him.” This beggar would have suffered much because of his blindness, but what an honor to be chosen to display the works of God.

Have you considered that perhaps God is displaying his work through you? That God is indeed at work in you. Because of Jesus, God’s transforming power is at work in every believer through the Holy Spirit. If we willingly cooperate with Jesus, the process towards wholeness and discipleship will be accelerated, and God’s glory will be displayed in you and in me!






OLV SCHOOL NEWS

Just this month we played basketball to work on the letter 'b' in kindergarten, made compound word sandwiches in first grade and had a wacky word spelling contest to practice our blends in second grade. It's truly remarkable to witness how determined and hard working all of the students who come to TLC are and it's incredibly rewarding to see their growth. By the end of second grade we are able to send our students on to their "new wing" having learned to read and therefore ready to read to learn! I feel deeply blessed to be a part of this community that invests so thoroughly in not only the minds of their students but also in their hearts through their love of Jesus and all our Catholic values.


