Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

Today's Gospel from Matthew, acts as a bridge between a series of healing stories that show Jesus in his ministry, and the missioning of the disciples to share his authority.

Jesus moved around the towns and villages. He taught, he proclaimed the Good News, he healed. This was the essence of his ministry.

Matthew then tells us, about the motivating force behind Jesus' ministry. When Jesus looked at people he saw their pain, their sadness and suffering. The image used is very powerful; the people were like sheep, leaderless, wearied from exhaustion, distraught and scattered. The prophets had used these same images to describe the people of God in exile.

The focus of Jesus' ministry, were people who were at the end of their rope; those who had no hope. Jesus believed that his mission was to remind people that God loved them and that God's love was not conditional on their merits. Paul also repeated this message of God's love not being dependent on our worthiness.

The use of the harvest image for ministry has not always been helpful. In our own time and culture, we are inclined to see harvest in terms of profit. What Jesus was stressing was the enormity of the task of bringing help and comfort to so many. The people knew that an abundant harvest required the cooperation of many.

All of this becomes clearer when Jesus asks for help. He had plenty of followers but he needed disciples. He needed people who could see what he saw and were prepared to do what he was doing. God, Lord of the harvest, commissions Jesus to act as agent of God by seeking out workers who will share in the divine mission of hope and healing.



Those who step forward to join in this mission are given a share in the very authority of Jesus and Matthew ties this call to the memory of God's commitment to Israel as their Deliverer. Matthew uses the image of the twelve tribes to name the first workers. In the new covenant, the workers will go out and form new peoples not based on birth but on their commitment to the Gospel.

Matthew is the only evangelist to use the term apostle (one sent) for these workers. The apostles are arranged in six pairs, maybe to remind us of the need for companionship in the task of ministry or to refer to St. Mark's Gospel story of Jesus sending out the disciples two by two.

Unfortunately, I believe that at this time in our history, we have a similar situation. There are plenty of followers but few disciples. Some see their Baptism as nothing more than the entry requirement for a religious group or community. Many are not aware that baptism is a public statement of the willingness to be actively involved in the mission of Jesus.

The list of apostles shows us that willingness is a foremost requirement. If we are willing to join Jesus' call for assistance, Jesus will share his authority with us.

Jesus prepared his disciples through teaching, prayer and practice. The same means are available to us. We can participate according to our gifts. As the Scriptures state, **"The gift you have received, give as gift!"**

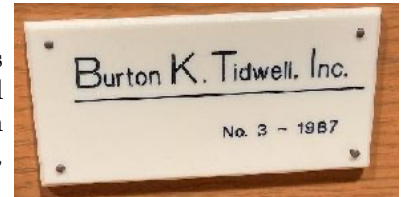
Music at Mass

This weekend we begin singing the "Mass of Christ our Savior", composed by Dan Schutte. The Glory to God and Gospel Acclamation are the only two parts of the Mass that might be unfamiliar to you. The Holy Holy, Memorial Acclamation, Amen, and Lamb of God have been used before at OLV. The OLV Pipe Organ - History

In conjunction with the renovation of Our Lady of Victory Church in the late 1980s, an organ committee was formed for the purpose of studying the feasibility of upgrading the existing organ to meet the needs of the newly enlarged worship space. The original pipe organ was installed in 1970. It was a modest two manual Wicks (Highland, IL) pipe organ of 7 ranks.

Our church's current pipe organ was designed by Burton K. Tidwell and was built, installed, and voiced under his supervision. Major components were constructed by Organ Supply Industries of Erie, Pennsylvania with pipework crafted at Organ Supply by Ferenc Gyuartz, by A.R. Schopps of Alliance, Ohio and by J. Stinkens of Zeist, Netherlands.



After much study, research, and interviewing organ builders, Burton K. Tidwell was chosen to create an instrument for OLV. His task included incorporating as much of the existing organ as possible, providing for the support of congregational singing, enabling the organist to perform a variety of repertoire, and positioning the organ for proper projection into the church.

As a result, an instrument of 24 ranks of pipes with the preparation for additions was created. As of 1987 when the organ was installed, the instrument was mechanically mostly new. A solid-state control system was added to the console and the console was refinished to match new interior church furnishings. Sixty percent of the pipework from the original organ was retained in the new organ and the remaining pipework was designed and built to match. Next week's article will focus on the organ console—the one part of the instrument that you can see!

On December 3, 2012, our son, brother and friend David Widzinski died in his sleep. David appeared to be in perfect health and his passing was a tremendous shock to his family, friends and community. 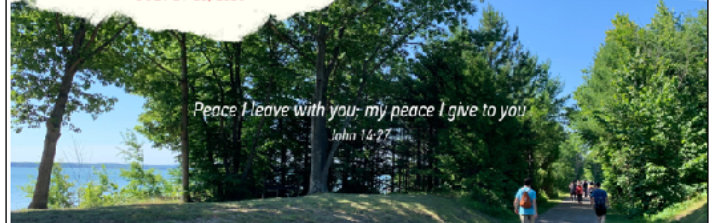
