I³th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Dear Friends,

It is a common experience that at any graduate school there are some professors who students do not approach for thesis direction. The complaint is that they are too demanding. On the other hand some wise students, often, too few in numbers, seek out these professors because they know that with them they will produce a great work.

In the Gospel passage today, we find Jesus being extremely demanding with his disciples: **“Anyone who prefers father or mother to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who prefers son or daughter to me is not worthy of me.”**

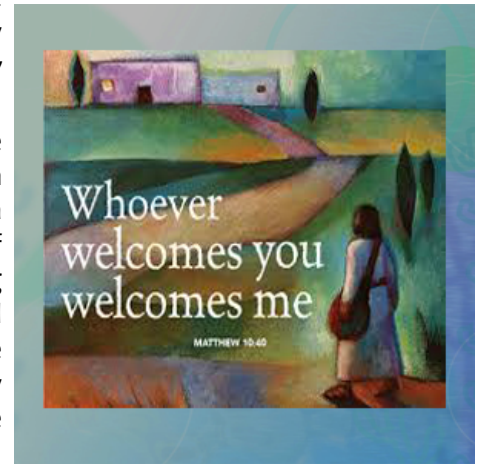
I believe that now, as then, one of the great temptations of the age is the temptation to mediocrity. At times, we are all inclined to do what is necessary to get by. What the human experience teaches us though, is that those who only do the sufficient to get by, end up on the wrong end of the scale. Those who gain the prize are those who aim at excellence. I think that many of us fall to that temptation in our Christian lives. A great spiritual writer once remarked that many Christians have trained the Gospel. We have taken the sting out of it and we have watered down its demands. We preach a Gospel of mediocrity. So often I’ve heard people say, **“God does not want us to go to extremes.”**

Jesus however, went to the extremes of love for us. An extreme of love for the Father and for us that landed him on the cross and he asks us to follow him; **“Anyone who does not take his cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me.”**

Throughout the ages however, there have been people, from very simple people to kings and queens, who have followed Jesus in aiming at excellence in Christian living. I can easily think of Damian of Molokai. He spent his life as a missionary among the lepers of Molokai, finally dying like one of them. Or of Teresa of the child Jesus, who never left her convent but spent her short life doing her simple household duties like sweeping and ironing, but doing them very well out of love for her community. And of course, St Theresa of Calcutta, loving the broken image of Christ in those dying on the streets of Calcutta. All of these show us that it is possible to live Christian life aiming at excellence. I thank God for these witnesses and I try to remember to celebrate them in my own life.

The Gospel also calls us however, to evaluate our lives in the light of this teaching. Have we accepted a domesticated Gospel which does not challenge us to excellence? I do believe that the response to this question has implications not only for us but indeed for the entire church.

I invite you to pray with me for our Church and for all Church leaders who challenge us to excellence not simply by words but by the example of their lives. Let us teach those in our care that it is not saying, “Lord, Lord” which will get us into heaven but a life lived striving for excellence in love.

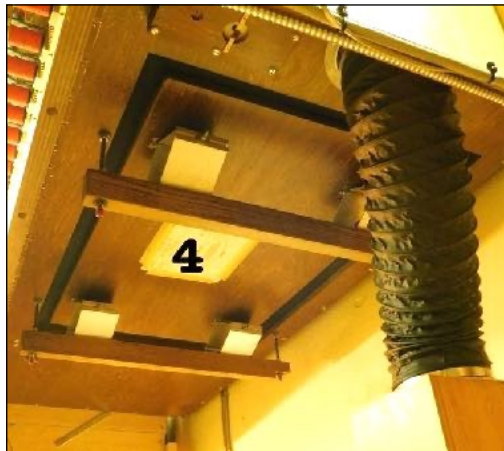
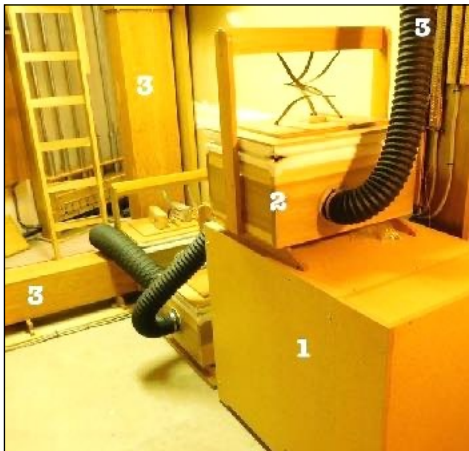
Contemporary Music Group

A Pipe Organ: Wind Supply

We now turn our attention to the parts of the pipe organ that are out of sight. In our church these components are located directly behind the Altar. We call it the “organ room”. It is always locked, however, if you would like a tour, please speak with me after any Mass. I would be delighted to show you around!

The pipe organ consists of several major components. The **WIND SUPPLY** includes the blower, wind lines, and reservoirs that make a steady supply of pressurized air available for any pipe at any time. Simply put, the pipe organ is a big box of whistles! A lot of wind is needed to make the whistles (pipes) speak. Each pipe sits on top of a hollow wind chest that is filled with compressed air provided by a blower. The blower (1) pushes air into a reservoir (2). From there the air travels through the wind lines (3) and into an airtight box, called the wind-chest (4).



The OLV pipe organ consists of one small blower ($\frac{3}{4}$ horsepower) inside of a box (1). The box is designed to muffle the sound of the blower in operation. There are three small reservoirs (2) and several wind lines constructed of wood (3) and plastic flexible tubing (3).

In today's Gospel (**Matthew 10:37-42**), we hear Jesus tell us: "Whoever gives only a cup of cold water to one of these little ones to drink because the little one is a disciple—Amen, I say to you, he will surely not lose his reward."

The heart of the paschal mystery is dying and rising. Our daily living often seems to have more dying than rising. Simple demands pull it out of us: feeding the infant in the middle of the night; ferrying the kids to soccer; helping with homework when we are dog tired; cleaning the house & preparing meals; taking time to share a good thing with our spouse; calling and visiting an aging parent; helping the suffering and the poor. One of the great encouragements of today's gospel is that all this behavior—like giving "a cup of cold water"—may seem small to us, but to God they are actions that parallel those of Christ. Today's Gospel message...our generosity is far surpassed by God's generosity. (Living Liturgy, p.188)

On December 3, 2012, our son, brother and friend David Widzinski died in his sleep. David appeared to be in perfect health and his passing was a tremendous shock to his family, friends and community. After David's passing, we decided to take action to remember David and the tremendous impact he had on many people.



Who was David?

- He was a fun loving, kind-hearted and compassionate 16-year-old Northville resident; a good student and athlete.
- He was friends with many OLV students and young people.
- Most importantly, he was a faithful, practicing Catholic young man who

deeply loved and cared about people, and not just his friends or family, but everyone, from the homeless, to the quiet or lonely, and to those who needed a friend. On the last day of his life (a Sunday), he texted a group of friends asking who wanted to go to Mass with him. Since losing David, we hold a charity golf outing and dinner on the Sunday of Labor Day weekend. We call it the **David Widzinski Community Golf Classic** because it is a community event where we love, laugh, remember David, and help others.

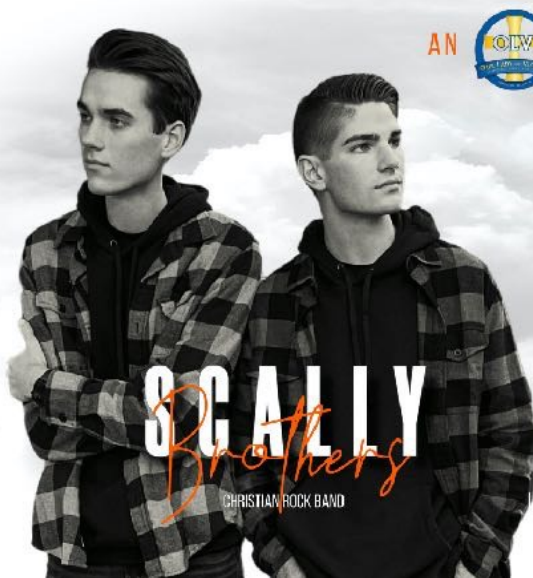
