Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

In today's gospel reading, Jesus presents the chief priests and elders with the parable of the man who had two sons. The father owned vineyards. He asked the oldest son to go and work in the vineyards. This son absolutely refused to do so. However, later on in the day, he decided that he would go and work as his father had requested.

Later the father also ordered his second son to go and work in the vineyards. This son agreed to do as his father asked. However, after he left his father, he decided he would not go to the vineyard. He did not tell his father that he had changed his mind.

Jesus told this parable because he knew that his listeners were trying to trap him. He bluntly told the elders that tax collectors and prostitutes would get into heaven before they would. Can you imagine their reaction? How dare Jesus say that to them! These were men who were faithful to the temple and to the Jewish customs and regulations!



As I write this, I'm sitting at my desk and looking out the window and every now and again, I pause and watch the children in the school yard playing. Sitting here, I find myself laughing, because just as the children play games with their friends, so, too do we play games. But I dare say that the games we play as adults frequently are games we play with God. Have you ever recognized yourself as "playing a game" with God? Don't we sometimes ask God a question but tell God the answer we want? When we ask Jesus a question, is it a trick question? Or when we ask, do we wait expectantly and listen for God's response? It's always our choice! How God must laugh at our little games! Just as I sit here and laugh listening to the children play, so, too must God be laughing probably at one of us today. "If you let me win the lottery today...I promise God, I'll give half of my earnings to the church....Well at least a quarter of my earnings... well, I promise, I will make a donation!!"

What will we do today? Let's pray for open and listening hearts, trusting that God will answer! And you know, I BELIEVE God will answer!

Greetings from the Science Lab

Mrs. Jesse Marcou, Middle School Science Teacher

We have been working on establishing our routines and procedures to set us up for a great year. I am making an attempt to really work on student lab group collaboration which is a piece of the curriculum that has been challenging to get back into since going through the covid pandemic.

- 8th graders have been working on physical and chemical changes and understanding the periodic table. I am constantly reminding them how to read the table and NOT to memorize it!
- 7th graders are now able to use the microscopes and find microbes. It was very exciting seeing the tiny paramecium and amoebas moving through our eye pieces just a week ago.
- 6th graders have been working on moon observations and have just started studying the tilt of the earth and seasonal change.

Our biggest and most exciting news is working in our new house program and welcoming in members teaching them our gestures (which has been fun watching students in the hall), as well as our chants. 


