

AROUND THE TABLE

First Sunday of Lent



Today's Gospel is only a few lines long. It is only 4 verses from the 1st Chapter of Mark's Gospel. The Gospel has a stark beginning. Mark writes that Jesus was driven into the desert by the Spirit. As we know, Jesus stayed in the desert for 40 days. What was that time like for Jesus? Was it a spiritually dry time? Or was there a clear sense of God's presence to Jesus? The experience had to have been ascetically extreme. Jesus was there alone with wild animals! His only consolation was being ministered to by angels!

Were these days also comforting for Jesus? Did he have a clear sense of God's presence with him? Or was this time in this arid wasteland a spiritually dry or disturbing time? Mark tells us that there were wild beasts in this territory. Was Jesus concerned for his safety?

Jesus remained in the desert alone for 40 days. Can you imagine being alone in the desert for 40 days? The heat, the dryness, the sun beating down on you, having no one to talk to or simply be present to you. Most of us will never spend an extended period by ourselves in the desert. That is a very special call!

However, I would guess that at some point in our lives, each of us have had an experience of the "desert." It might have followed a significant loss or a serious illness. It may have been the loss of a loved one, our job, our hearing, eyesight, loss of income or of our ability to work.

Take a moment today and reflect on that time. What was your reaction to your loss? Anger, depression, isolating, numbing, running? How did you experience God during that time? Was God close to you or did God feel far, far away?

Jesus understands our "deserts-moments." Jesus spent time in his own personal desert for 40 days. These days were not easy for him. Jesus was tempted by Satan. He was surrounded at times by wild beasts. His consolation was the angels coming and ministering to him!

After this experience, Jesus went to Galilee. As he traveled through Galilee, He proclaimed the Gospel. His main theme was repentance. Daily he told people that the "kingdom was at hand."

Jesus is telling us this same message today! Do you believe that the "kingdom is at hand?" We have heard this prophecy for years and yet the kingdom has not come. Yet one day, it will come. We do not know the day nor the hour. Will we be ready? Will we look forward to seeing God face to face? Today may be the day! Be alert! Stay awake! Be prepared! Our God is coming to us!

THE OLV PIPE ORGAN

As mentioned last week, there are seven areas of concern regarding the pipe organ that were discovered upon a detailed inspection of the instrument. This week's topic is about the organ's WIND.

The wind that sounds the organ's pipes is produced by an organ blower and channeled throughout the organ via wind lines. Blowers range in size depending on the wind capacity and wind pressures required; their electric motors can be rated from less than 1 horsepower to over 10 horsepower. The rating of the electric motor on the OLV organ is only 3/4 horsepower!

Wind reservoirs serve to stabilize the wind flow from the blower and are located at strategic locations within the wind system; they resemble rectangular boxes with floating tops held in place via tension with springs. Wind lines get the wind from the blower to the wind reservoirs to the chests. Wind lines should be of rigid material, for the most part, being made of wood or metal.

2. Winding issue: The organ was winded adequately

when it was designed and built in 1987. accommodate the changes made to the organ in 2014 the winding of the organ was greatly altered. The majority of the original winding system was changed and several feet of flexible wind lines were added (flexible wind lines for very short distances are okay and not ideal for longer distances). creates problems with wind pressure and stability, causing the pressure to be turbulent, or shake, which in turn affects the sound. This begins to happen more as more ranks of pipes are





played and more wind is required. The ³/₄ HP blower is no longer powerful enough for the reconfigured instrument. Photo #1 shows the winding in 1987. Photo #2 shows the winding in 2014. The story continues next week!


CARES OF FARMINGTON HILLS


