Third Sunday of Lent



Dear Friends,

Today's Gospel gets our attention immediately. Jesus has just arrived in Jerusalem for the feast of Passover. He immediately goes to the temple. When he arrived at the temple, the situation he found infuriated Him. Yes, there were many people in the temple. However, most of them were not there to pray. There were an astounding number of money changers and also people selling animals for sacrifice!

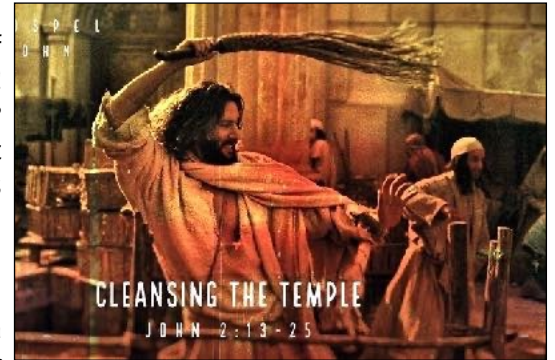
You might say that "Jesus absolutely lost" it! He took a length of cord, made a whip and began driving all these people out of the temple! They were desecrating this beautiful and sacred temple. How dare they? The temple was built and dedicated to be a place for prayer and worship. It was not built to be a market place! Jesus was infuriated! Yet he also was saddened that the people would desecrate such a holy, beautiful and sacred place.

Today may be a day to ask ourselves: what and where are our sacred places? What are the places that are sacred to us? It might be a church, a forest, the mountains, the ocean or simply a swing in our backyard or special chair in our house. We all need sacred places in our lives. These sacred places enable us to experience and open ourselves to God's presence in the beauty, the silence, the peace—be that in nature, the quiet space in your house or a church.

Sacred places and spaces help to ground us in God. And thus, we may experience God's presence in that place more intensely and more tangibly. A sacred place as well as a sacred activity (such as simply sitting quietly in a chair) also may help us open ourselves more deeply to God's presence, word and grace.

Today, I invite you to deliberately sit quietly with God for 5, 10, or 15 minutes. We may receive many gifts and deep peace as we quietly and peacefully simply sit with God! God longs for us and God is waiting for us! Will you dare come and sit with the Lord?

THE OLV PIPE ORGAN

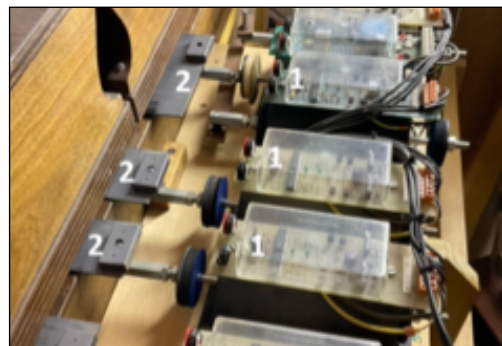
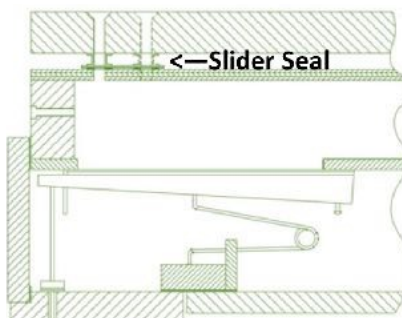
There are seven areas of concern regarding the pipe organ that were discovered upon a detailed inspection of the instrument. This week's topic focuses on the windchests.

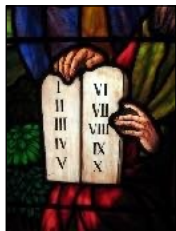
4. Windchests

A windchest is the component of a pipe organ on which the pipes sit. As the organist plays the instrument, the keys, stops, and windchest work together as a mechanism (called an 'action') to direct pressurized air (called 'wind') into the pipes, thus creating sound. The OLV pipe organ contains two main windchests, on which most of the pipes sit. These windchests were built in 1987 by Organ Supply Industries of Erie, Pennsylvania. The first flaw with the windchests were with the **slider seals**. Slider seals allow for the passage of air from the windchest to the pipe. There was a design flaw with the seals, which necessitated the replacement of every seal in 2009 (around 1000 seals and around \$9,000). The slider seal shifts out of place cutting off proper air supply to the actuated pipe. The second flaw has to do with the **sliders**. The **slider** (2) moves when a pipe rank is actuated. Holes on the slider line up with the pipes. Now those pipes can be played. Many of the sliders are warping, causing them to move out of position, causing air to leak and the stop to cease functioning properly. *It is unusual that these types of problems are happening, as slider windchests are known to be very reliable and last for a very long time without the need for major maintenance. Well built organ components should last 50-75 years without the need for a major rebuild.*

Greetings from Middle School Math

To say we are all thrilled that it is March and the sun has been shining is an understatement. Spring is on the horizon and middle school students are excited! Here are some of the things we've been practicing in middle school math:

- **Honors 8th grade and Advanced 7th grade** have been working on important concepts that they will be seeing more of next year in Algebra 1: Solving Systems of Linear Equations and Inequalities. Whether it be using multiple methods to solve traditional problems, or creating equations/inequalities to represent and solve real-world scenarios, they are getting a good start on something that they will be delving deeper into in high school.
- **On-level 8th grade** is in the middle of their Linear Equations unit, which focuses mainly on slope-intercept form and graphing lines.
- **Honors 7th grade** is about to start its unit on an Introduction to Trigonometry-remember SOH CAH TOA? They will be using sine, cosine, and tangent to find unknown sides and angles in right triangles. **Advanced 6th grade** is on track to start this unit by Easter.
- **Honors 6th grade** recently finished their unit on Polygons- finding area and missing angles, and naming lines and figures.

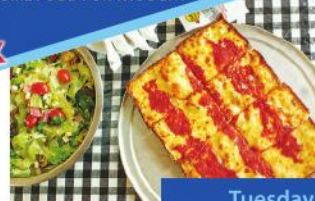
