Fifth Sunday of Lent

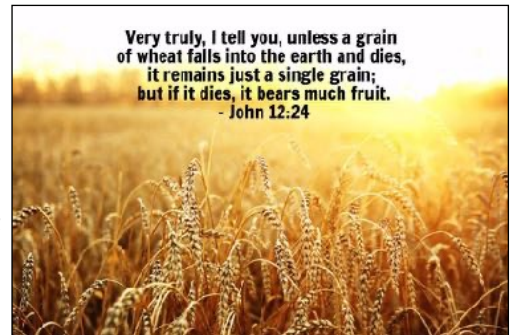


Dear Friends,

As Holy Week begins to draw near, the Gospels begin to prepare us for the unfolding drama of Holy Week. In each Gospel this week, there are hints of the drama that will unfold in the days ahead.

Today's Gospel begins as some of the Greeks who were in Jerusalem for Passover went to Philip and told him that they would like to see Jesus. The Greeks had recently arrived. How had they heard about Jesus? Had word of Jesus and his teaching and miracles spread to Greece? Or had these Greeks simply heard stories about Jesus since they arrived in Jerusalem?

Philip and Andrew told Jesus that these Greeks wished to see him and also hear him speak. However, Jesus did not focus on the Greeks' desire to meet him. He doesn't respond to what Philip and Andrew just told him. Rather, Jesus began to prepare his disciples for the events that would unfold in the next few days. Jesus tells them that the hour has come. He also tells them that he would be glorified. Jesus then uses the image of a **"grain of wheat that has to fall into the ground and ultimately die."** Only after dying, would the wheat be able to produce fruit! Did his disciples understand what Jesus was saying? Or was he just confusing them?



Jesus then tells his disciples that he is deeply troubled. Jesus realized that pain, sorrow and death were in his future. Can you imagine the emotion, pain and fear that Jesus must have been experiencing? True, Jesus was God. However, he also was fully human. Yes, he was committed to this path. Did he also experience fear, sorrow and loss? And how would Mary, his mother, deal with his impending death? He was all she had.

Jesus had committed himself to this journey and to his people. Jesus is choosing to do this to glorify God's name. Then Jesus hears a voice speaking to him from heaven, affirming him in his decision to glorify God's name. What a comfort it must have been when Jesus heard God's voice from heaven reassuring him. What a wonderful gift to receive. This experience must have strengthened Jesus for the path that he would walk!

In our lives, we also have moments like Jesus, when we know we need to take a path that will be difficult and painful. Are we willing to surrender ourselves into God's hands? Do we trust God to be with us, to grace? Do we believe that God also will strengthen and console us? Do we trust that we will not be alone on this journey?

Jesus was human! He experienced many of the unpleasant realities of life that we all have to deal with. Yet, he completely trusted his Father, his God, to support and help him on every step of his journey. Today may we ask Jesus to give us a share of Jesus' trust and faith in God! And may we say yes to what life is asking of us at this time in our lives.

8TH GRADE CHARITY ESSAY CONTEST WINNERS!

Our annual Knights of Columbus 8th Grade Charity Essay Contest concluded at our annual Awards Night and Membership Dinner, with the announcement of our three winners and their selected charities.

Congratulations to our winners and all students who participated in this year's Charity Essay Contest!

- **1st Place: Sarah Leiger.** Sarah has been awarded \$500 total. \$250 directly to her for being the top winner, along with the Knights donating \$250 in Sarah's name to her selected charity, **"Forgotten Harvest"**. Most all of us are very familiar with Forgotten Harvest, fighting hunger and food insecurity in the Detroit area, delivering 144,000 pounds of surplus food per day, providing families in need with fresh, nutritious food, free of charge. Just \$10 dollars provides \$70 worth of groceries to those in need, so calculating out equals \$1750 for your \$250 donation! Congratulations on your winning essay and selection of this fine charity.

THE OLV PIPE ORGAN

There are seven areas of concern regarding the pipe organ that were discovered upon a detailed inspection of the instrument. This week's topic focuses on the console.

5. **The Console** is the control center of the organ. The organist plays the keyboards and pedalboard, controls which stops are being played by either depressing the rocker tabs (above the keyboards) or by using the combination action (the buttons below the keyboards and above the pedalboard), and manipulates the volume of the instrument by manipulating the swell and crescendo pedals. Our console dates back to the original organ installed in 1970. Quite simply, this console is worn out: the keyboards are worn out, the pedalboard is worn out, pistons are routinely breaking, and the key and swell shoe contacts are worn out. Also, as mentioned before, the organ's combination action (memory levels) is no longer reliable. While the console plays and seemingly works, all of the mentioned problems makes the instrument quite a bit more of a challenge to play. Next week's article will be the final in this series of "areas of concern".

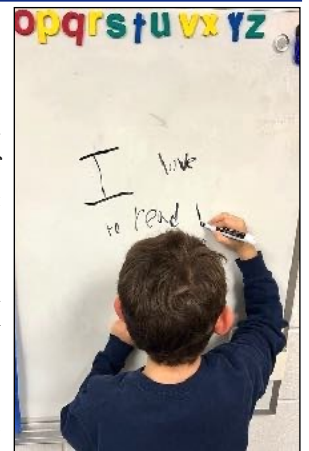


OLV SCHOOL NEWS

Greetings from the K-2 Learning Center

We've had so many adventures this year in the K-2 Learning Center! I have the privilege of working with select students in kindergarten, first, or second grade on their reading and writing skills. Two and half days a week I work with small groups to reintroduce or reinforce some of the foundational reading skills that are being taught in our wing. Every time I meet with students we find fun ways to practice our phonics skills. Just this month we've had races to write our blends, used mini umbrellas to identify words with the vowel u, and played card games to identify our Bossy R. In our room we talk a lot about why a letter or letters make a sound and we cover the rules to our language. The goal is to give our readers the confidence to sound out any new word they have in front of them! After they have the foundational skills of understanding why and how, we can practice reading the words automatically and fluidly as well as with an understanding of what the words/sentences mean. All of this adds up to strong, confident, and capable readers who are ready to take on anything. As the sign says in our room...today a reader, tomorrow a leader!

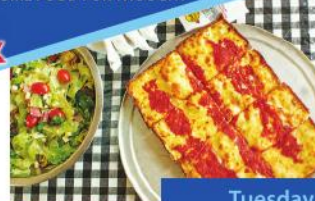
